SVCC BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

At Monday night's Board meeting, the SVCC Board of Trustees, Dr. Mihel reported that:

- Spring enrollment is up 2.4 percent in headcount and 11.5 percent in credit hours;
- The State of Illinois sent half of Sauk's apportionment payment. Sauk will continue to cut costs internally.
- Trustees Lisa Wiersema and Scott Stoller will attend the ACCT Legislative Summit in Washington, D.C., February 7-10.
- Rep. Bill Foster will visit Sauk Saturday, January 30, for a follow-up visit to see new equipment;
- Architect Interviews will begin January 29;
- Sauk will host the Ronald Reagan 99th Birthday Luncheon on Saturday, Feb. 6; and
- Plans are in the works for the College's 45th Anniversary Celebration to be held in June.

CAMPUS SAFETY AND SECURITY

Are you Concerned About Someone on Campus?

People engage in all kinds of behavior that raise concern about their well being. These include:

- A striking change in personality and personal habits.
- Infrequent class attendance with little or no work completed.
- Listlessness, lack of energy, or frequently falling asleep in class.
- Marked change in personal hygiene.
- Impaired speech and disjointed thoughts.
- Expressing threats to harm others or commit suicide.
- Excessive weight loss or gain.
- Frequent or high levels of irritable, unruly, abrasive, or aggressive behavior.
- Bizarre behavior that is obviously inappropriate for the situation.
- Appearing to be overly nervous, tense, or tearful.
- Having a history of violence.
- Access to or possession of guns, knives, or other weapons.

If you are concerned that an employee or student may pose a risk to him/herself or others,

- Encourage him or her to speak with a SVCC counselor immediately,
- Accompany him or her to the counseling office,
- Call the counseling office at ext. 208 and tell them you need to speak to a counselor about an emergency.

What If My Concerns Turn Out to be Unfounded?

The potential for damage is much greater from doing nothing than by reporting your concerns. Please err on the side of caution.

Can Concerns be Expressed Anonymously?

Yes. You can simply telephone the counseling office and not identify yourself.

Is This a Violation of FERPA?

No, this is not a violation of FERPA as FERPA protects the privacy of educational records from unauthorized disclosure. The Sauk Valley Crisis Assistance Team is comprised of professionals trained to respond to personal issues, and will operate within FERPA and other applicable confidentiality rules.

What Happens After Informing a Counselor of a Concern?

The most important thing to know is that the individual will receive appropriate assistance. The only goal is to help the individual. Counselors and/or the Crisis Assistance Team will provide the broadest scope of assistance possible. As always, what you can do to help yourself (and others) now is to stay healthy - get plenty of exercise and rest, eat a healthy, balanced diet, and learn healthy ways to manage stress.
