

MINUTES OF ADJOURNED MEETING

SAUK VALLEY COLLEGE BOARD

January 31, 1966

President Tabor called an adjourned meeting of the Sauk Valley College Board to order in the Dixon High School, Dixon, Illinois, January 31, 1966, 7:30 P.M.

The secretary called the roll and the following members were present: Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff, Warren E. Walder and Forrest L. Tabor. None were absent.

Also present were Sauk Valley College president, Edward J. Sabol, Board Attorney, Robert W. Castendyck and Public Relations Director, Gus Hinueber.

President Tabor reported that Black Hawk Community College, Triton and Sauk Valley College have filed applications for federal funds for building programs.

Mr. Walder moved the adoption of the resolution as read and attached, calling for a special referendum to authorize the Board to issue bonds, voting to be in the fourteen precincts as described therein, on Saturday February 26, 1966. Mr. Schuneman seconded the motion. The roll was called and the following members voted "Aye": Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff, Warren E. Walder and Forrest L. Tabor. None voted "Nay". The motion carried unanimously and the resolution was adopted.

Mr. Stuff moved the adoption of a resolution as read and attached calling for an election for members of the Board on Saturday, April 9, 1966. Mr. Dillon seconded the motion. The secretary called the roll and the following members voted "Aye": Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff, Warren E. Walder and Forrest L. Tabor. None voted "Nay". The motion carried and the resolution was adopted.

President Sabol reported that he is inspecting possible temporary office space in the First National Bank Building in Sterling and in the Commonwealth Edison Building in Dixon. The Board concurred with his philosophy in acquiring the best possible individuals for staff positions while looking forward to the need for desirable increases in remuneration in the future. He reported that desirable candidates seem to be available.

Mr. Hinueber reported the following materials available for promoting the bond referendum: slides of architectural developments, display boards for banks, large display boards for area high schools, school parents contact cards and printed booklets.

The Board discussed and decided to pro rate the printing costs to the responsibility of each area school inasmuch as tax funds may not be used to promote a bond referendum.

Mr. Walder moved the adoption of a resolution expressing the sincere appreciation and gratitude of the Board to Mr. Hinueber for the many hours he has given in promoting the welfare of the College and its public relations and especially for his inspiration and tireless efforts in spearheading the publicity for the Board's referenda. Mr. Stuff seconded the motion and it was unanimously adopted.

Mr. Walder moved to adjourn to February 21, 1966, 7:30 P.M. in President Sabol's office. Mr. Dillon seconded the motion. The roll was called and the following voted "Aye": Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff, Warren E. Walder and Forrest L. Tabor. None voted "Nay". The motion carried and the meeting adjourned.

P.M., ON THE 31ST DAY OF JANUARY,
1966.

The President called the meeting to order and directed the Secretary to call the roll.

Upon the roll being called, Forrest L. Tabor, the President, and the following members answered present:

Peter W. Dillon, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff, Warren E. Walder, and Catherine R. Perkins.

The following members were absent from the meeting:

None

The President then declared that this Board should proceed with further consideration of the site necessary to be acquired for junior college purposes, the buildings necessary to be constructed thereon, the equipment necessary to be acquired for such buildings, the estimated cost of such site, buildings and equipment, the means of financing the same, and the amounts necessary to be transferred to the Illinois Building Authority in accordance with the provisions contained in Article V of the Public Junior College Act of the State of Illinois, all of such being necessary in order that the Board can establish and maintain a comprehensive junior college program in and for the District. After a full discussion of the desired building program and the means of financing the same, Member Warren Walder presented and the Secretary read in full the following resolution:

RESOLUTION CALLING SPECIAL ELECTION

WHEREAS, Junior College District No. 600, Counties of Whiteside, Lee, Ogle, Henry and Bureau and State of Illinois, was heretofore organized pursuant to an election held in and for said District on June 8, 1965 and pursuant to an election held therein on July 8, 1965, a Board, consisting of seven (7) members, was duly elected and such persons so elected did convene on July 12, 1965 and proceeded to organize as a Board for said Junior College District; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to an in compliance with the applicable provisions of Article IV of the Public Junior College Act of the State of Illinois, the Board has taken necessary action so that said District has been converted into and is now a Class I Junior College District; and

WHEREAS, in order that the Board of said Junior College District may proceed as quickly as possible to establish and maintain a comprehensive junior college program in and for the District, it will be necessary for the said Board to acquire a site and to build and equip thereon suitable buildings for junior college purposes, all as authorized by the provisions of said Public Junior College Act; and

WHEREAS, the Board has heretofore determined that it will be necessary that funds be made available for the purpose of paying the cost of acquiring a site for junior college purposes and to build and equip suitable buildings thereon and to provide funds for transfer to the Illinois Building Authority, in accordance with the provisions contained in Article V of the said Public Junior College Act of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, it is hereby found and determined that there are not sufficient funds on hand and available for the purpose of paying the cost of acquiring a site for junior college

purposes and building and equipping suitable buildings thereon and to provide funds for transfer to the said Illinois Building Authority and for such purpose it will require the expenditure of not less than Three Million Nine Hundred Seventy-five/and ^{Thousand} no/100----- Dollars (\$ 3,975,000.00), and it is necessary and for the best interests of the District that said District borrow the sum of \$ 3,975,000.00 and issue bonds of the District therefor in the said aggregate amount of \$ 3,975,000.00 :

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It and It Is Hereby Resolved by the Board of Junior College District No. 600, Counties of Whiteside, Lee, Ogle, Henry and Bureau and State of Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. That it is necessary and for the best interests of the District in order that the District may establish and maintain a comprehensive junior college program in and for the District, that a site be acquired for junior college purposes and that suitable buildings be constructed thereon, with necessary equipment, and that funds be provided for transfer to the Illinois Building Authority in accordance with the provisions contained in Article V of the Public Junior College Act of the State of Illinois.

Section 2. That it is necessary that funds be provided for the purpose of paying the cost of acquiring a site for junior college purposes and building and equipping suitable buildings thereon and to provide funds for transfer to the Illinois Building Authority in accordance with the provisions contained in Article V of the Public Junior College Act and for such purpose it will require the expenditure of not less than \$ 3,975,000.00 and it is necessary and for the best interests of the Junior College District that said District borrow the sum of \$ 3,975,000.00 for such purpose and issue bonds of the District in evidence thereof in the aggregate amount of \$ 3,975,000.00 .

Section 3. That for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of the Junior College District the proposition of issuing bonds of said District to the amount of \$3,975,000.00 to provide funds for the purpose referred to in Section 2 hereof, a special election be and the same is hereby called to be held in and for said District on Saturday, the 26th day of February, 1966, and that the polls at said election shall be opened from 12:00 o'clock Noon to 7:00 o'clock P.M. of that day.

Section 4. That for the purpose of said election said Junior College District shall be divided into fourteen voting precincts and the boundaries of said voting precincts and the name of the polling place designated for each voting precinct shall be as hereinafter set forth in the form of notice to be given of said election, as such form of notice is hereinafter described in Section 5 of this resolution.

Section 5. That notice of said election be given by the Secretary of this Board by publishing notice thereof once in the The Daily Gazette of Sterling, Illinois /and once in the Dixon Evening Telegraph of Dixon, Illinois /, the same being newspapers published in and having a general circulation in the said Junior College District, the date of the publication of such notice to be at least ten (10) days prior to the date set for such election, and that such notice shall be in substantially the following form:

NOTICE is hereby given that on Saturday, the 26th day of February, 1966, a special election will be held in and for Junior College District No. 600, Counties of Whiteside, Lee, Ogle, Henry and Bureau and State of Illinois, for the purpose of voting

upon the following proposition:

Shall the Board of Junior College District No. 600, Counties of Whiteside, Lee, Ogle, Henry and Bureau and State of Illinois, issue bonds of said District to the amount of Three Million Nine Hundred Seventy-five thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$3,975,000.00) for the purpose of borrowing money to pay the cost of a site for junior college purposes and to build and equip suitable buildings thereon and to provide funds for transfer to the Illinois Building Authority in accordance with the provisions contained in Article V of the Public Junior College Act of the State of Illinois?

That for the purpose of said election said Junior College District has been divided into fourteen voting precincts, the boundaries of each precinct and the name of the polling place designated for each precinct being as follows:

Shall consist of all that part of Junior College District No. 600 which is situated within Morrison Community High School District No. 307, Whiteside County, Illinois.

Shall consist of all that part of Junior College District No. 600 which is situated within Prophetstown Community High School District No. 308, Whiteside and Henry Counties, Illinois.

VOTING PRECINCT NUMBER 3

Shall consist of all that part of Junior College District No. 600 which is situated within Tampico Township High School District No. 302, Whiteside and Bureau Counties, Illinois.

Tampico, Illinois.

VOTING PRECINCT NUMBER 4

Shall consist of all that part of Junior College District No. 600 which is situated within Sterling Township High School District No. 300, Whiteside and Lee Counties, Illinois, except Townships 22 North, Ranges Six and Seven East of the 4th P.M., Whiteside County, Illinois, commonly known as Genesee and Jordan Townships.


