MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING  
SAUK VALLEY COLLEGE BOARD

November 28, 1966

A regular meeting of the Sauk Valley College Board was called to order by President Warren E. Walder in the Library Conference Room at 7:30 P.M., November 28, 1966.

At roll call the following members were present: Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff and Warren E. Walder. Forrest L. Tabor was temporarily absent and arrived later in the meeting.

The Board warmly welcomed Gerald W. Smith, executive secretary of the Illinois Junior College Board, who was introduced by Dr. Sabol.

Mr. Dillon moved to approve minutes as submitted and corrected. Mr. Stuff seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Mr. Schuneman moved to approve the attached treasurer's report; Mr. Dillon seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Mr. Reuter moved to approve the attached monthly statement of budgetary items. Mr. Stuff seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Mr. Stuff moved to approve the payroll journal as presented in amount of \$40,484.76. Mr. Schuneman seconded the motion. The roll was called and the following voted "Aye": Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor and Warren E. Walder. None voted "Nay". The motion carried.

Mr. Schuneman moved to allow for payment bills as listed and attached in these amounts: Educational Fund \$29,187.49, Student Refunds \$1,359.05, Building Fund \$2,883.96 and Site and Construction Fund \$29,058.85. Mr. Dillon seconded the motion. The roll was called and the following voted "Aye": Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor and Warren E. Walder. None voted "Nay". The motion carried.

Mr. Reuter moved to add to the list of bills \$5,332 to Albrecht Well Drillers, which has been approved by the architects for payment subsequent to the listing of other bills. Mr. Tabor seconded the motion. The roll was called and the following voted "Aye": Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor and Warren E. Walder. None voted "Nay". The motion carried.

Mr. Schuneman moved to authorize a change order to Klein and Heckman in amount of \$2,613.81 for additional work necessitated by installation of laboratory tables. Mr. Reuter seconded the motion. The roll was called and the following voted "Aye": Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor and Warren E. Walder. None voted "Nay". The motion carried.

Mr. Schuneman moved to authorize the treasurer to reinvest \$2,600,000 in U.S. Treasury Bills for a ninety day period. Mr. Tabor seconded the motion. The roll was called and the following voted "Aye": Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor and Warren E. Walder. None voted "Nay". The motion carried.

Dr. Sabol reported that no recommendation had yet been received from Mr. Schuler or his architect as to their acceptance to a suggested access road.

Representatives from the Follett Book Company who have served the College Book Store under a contract for this first semester were present and discussed with the Board their proposal for an extended contract of five years or more. Dr. Sabol and Mr. Edison are to consider their proposal and make a recommendation to the Board taking into consideration the possible operation

by the College of its own bookstore.

After discussing the advantage to the staff of being introduced to the Junior College Journal, Mr. Reuter moved that the Board furnish each staff member, 37 in all, with a one year subscription to the Journal. Mr. Schuneman seconded the motion. The roll was called and the following voted "Aye": Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor and Warren E. Walder. None voted "Nay". The motion carried.

The Board discussed at some length a request from the architects for an expression of opinion regarding the climate control in the shop, kitchen area and gymnasium. It was the consensus that it is desirable to include these areas for climate control as a deduct alternate for bidding.

Dr. Sabol reported that the College Library has shelved and on order over 4000 volumes, which is approaching the intention to have approximately 5000 available by the second semester.

Dr. Sabol discussed and recommended that application be made through Title VI of the Education Act of 1963 for the following materials:

Language Laboratory  
Audio-Tutorial Laboratory  
Automatic Magnetic Tape Bank - for information retrieval  
Reading Program Materials - for developmental reading  
Books valued at \$20,000

The total project valued at \$56,714.18 could be available on a 50-50 matching basis.

Mr. Tabor moved that the staff pursue the application for the above listed equipment. Mr. Dillon seconded the motion. The roll was called and the following voted "Aye": Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor and Warren E. Walder. None voted "Nay". The motion carried.

Dr. Sabol read the ~~attached~~ letter from Mr. Beaumont of the State Office of Vocational Education and Rehabilitation in which he announced that Sauk Valley College had been chosen as an area vocational center and would be granted \$750,000 for equipment, which probably must be purchased or contracted for by June 30, 1967. Necessary matching funds for this grant will be that portion of the permanent building in which they will be housed.

Dr. Sabol reported receipt of a letter from the ad hoc committee appointed at the Edwardsville meeting of the boards of existing junior colleges suggesting that boards be prepared to make a decision about joining the Illinois Junior College Association for purposes of sharing information, problems and experiences with other boards with membership fees of about \$600.00. The Board agreed that it is desirable to have such membership and to help support it financially.

Dr. Sabol reported that he and the architects are continuing to solve the problems of the sanitary system to the satisfaction of the College and the State Sanitary Board. Dr. Sabol was empowered to seek an appeal from the recent ruling of the State requiring a holding pond for use in emergencies.

Mr. Edison reported that he had two proposals for snow removal from the drives and parking lots and recommended acceptance of the attached proposal from Kenney Excavating Company. Mr. Schuneman moved to accept the said attached proposal. Mr. Reuter seconded the motion. The roll was called and the following voted "Aye": Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor and Warren E. Walder. None voted "Nay". The motion carried.

Mr. Smith stated that he brought greetings from the Illinois Junior College Board and was currently visiting all the existing boards and colleges. Mr. Smith extended a personal invitation to the meeting the Illinois Junior College Board is hosting in Springfield on December 9 and 10 at which conference it is hoped that dialogue and exchange between the State Board and

boards of colleges will result in a keener understanding of their goals and responsibilities.

Mr. Smith displayed a map of the State on which were outlined existing and proposed colleges in varying stages of development. He also announced that the State Board expects to publish a news bulletin after the first part of the year.

The Board discussed the cost of defending a slander suit liability if one should ever occur, prompted by such an occurrence in the Chicago area.

Mr. Dillon moved to adjourn; Mr. Reuter seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned.


