MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING

SAUK VALLEY COLLEGE BOARD

March 9, 1967

President Walder called the meeting to order and requested the secretary to call the roll. The following members were present: Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor, and Warren E. Walder. None were absent.

Since all members were present, Mr. Tabor moved to waive prior notice and to meet at 4:00 P.M., March 9, 1967, in the College Library conference room. Mr. Reuter seconded the motion. The roll was called and the following voted 'Aye': Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor, and Warren E. Walder. None voted 'Nay.' The motion carried.

Mr. Stuff moved to approve the minutes as submitted. Mr. Schuneman seconded the motion. The motion carried.

There were no bills to be presented for payment.

Mr. Reuter moved to approve the revised faculty schedule as presented by Dr. Sabol and herewith attached. Mr. Dillon seconded the motion. After a complete and thorough discussion, the secretary called the roll and the following voted 'Aye': Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor, and Warren E. Walder. None voted 'Nay.' The motion carried.

Mr. Schuneman moved to increase Dr. Sabol's annual salary by \$1,500. Mr. Dillon seconded the motion. The roll was called and the following voted 'Aye': Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor, and Warren E. Walder. None voted 'Nay.' The motion carried.

Mr. Castendyck reported that the contract for lease of the Dussler property had been properly signed and executed. He also reported that the deed for the balance of the Schuler property involved in the original site purchase had been recorded. Mr. Castendyck also reported that a petition will be filed to remove the total property from the tax rolls for the current year if possible.

Dr. Sabol reported that the fringe benefit insurance package for the staff is not completed and will be presented for later consideration.

Dr. Sabol reported that legislation is being presented for State funding of the Colleges' share of retirement benefits as is now done with the other colleges and universities of the State. If

the proposed legislation becomes fact, it is hoped the junior colleges may recover funds they have already contributed.

Dr. Sabol reported that 120 students have applied for next Fall. The Board discussed means of contacting and encouraging the interest of the schools having students outside the College district.

The Board discussed the printing of ballots for the Board election and decided to continue rotating between the printers in the outlying areas.

Dr. Sabol reported that the option to purchase that the Board has for the additional Schuler property including the residence and other outbuildings is quite general in nature and that he wishes to assess the value and usefulness of the buildings before making a recommendation as to exercising the option.

Dr. Sabol reported that the Dixon FFA would complete payment of the lease contract as soon as the amount of acreage can be accurately determined.

Mr. Schuneman moved to adopt the attached resolution calling for a Board election on April 8, 1967, describing the 24 precincts, The use of voter affidavits in lieu of poll books and the election of two board members for the two expiring terms. The motion also included provision for paying election judges \$7.50 per day.

Mr. Stuff seconded the motion.

The secretary called the roll and the following voted "Aye": Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Clayton R. Schuneman, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor, and Warren E. Walder. None voted 'Nay.' The motion carried, and the resolution was unanimously adopted.

There being no further business to come before the Board, Mr. Dillon moved to adjourn to the regular meeting March 27, 1967. Mrs. Perkins seconded the motion.

President Walder declared the meeting adjourned.

appointments will be made on an individual basis and that final salary and
rank will be dependent upon personal qualifications as well as education and
experience.

- a. Instructor: Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university in the field of specialization. Two years of professional experience.
- b. Assistant Professor: Master's degree in the field of specialization or a total of 150 semester hours of credit from an accredited college or university, including an undergraduate major and satisfactory graduate courses in the field of specialization. Four years of professional experience.
- c. Associate Professor: Professional diploma or a master's degree in the field of specialization and a minimum of 180 semester hours of credit from an accredited college or university, or a total of 180 semester hours of college credit, not less than 30 of which must be graduate courses in the field of specialization. Eight years of professional experience, at least two of which shall be successful college teaching.
- d. Professor: Doctor's degree or a total of 200 semester hours of credit from an accredited college or university, including not less than 60 semester hours of graduate courses, 30 of which must be in the field of specialization. Ten years of experience, at least five of which shall be successful college teaching.

WHEREAS, the terms of Peter W. Dillon and Kenneth L. Reuter as members of the Board of Junior College District Number 506, Whiteside, Lee, Ogle, Henry, and Bureau Counties, Illinois, are about to expire, and

WHEREAS, an election will be necessary to fill the vacancies thereby created,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of said Junior College District Number 506 as follows:

Section 1

That an election be and the same is hereby called for the purpose of electing two members to the Board of Junior College District Number 506 to serve for full terms of three years each, said election to be held on Saturday, the 8th of April, 1967, and the polls at said election shall be open from 12:00 Noon to 7:00 P.M. on that day.

Section 2

For the purpose of this election, the said Junior College District Number 506 shall be and the same is hereby divided into twenty-four election precincts, which precincts and the polling places therefor are hereinafter set forth in the form of Notice of said election.

Section 3

Notice of said election shall be given by publishing notice thereof at least once in The Daily Gazette of Sterling, Illinois, and once in the Dixon Evening Telegraph of Dixon, Illinois, the same being newspapers published in and having a general circulation within the territory of the district, the date of publication of such notice to be at least ten (10) days prior to the date set for such election, and that said notice shall be in substantially the following form:

NOTICE OF ELECTION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN That on the 8th day of April, 1967, an election will be held in and for Junior College District Number 506, Whiteside, Lee, Ogle, Henry, and Bureau Counties, Illinois, for the purpose of electing two members to the Board of said Junior College District Number 506 for the full term of three years.

For the purpose of this election, the following precincts and polling places are hereby established:

PRECINCT NO. 1

Shall consist of all that part of Junior College District Number 506 which is situated within Morrison Community High School District Number 307, Whiteside County, Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Coliseum Building, Morrison, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 2

Shall consist of all that part of Junior College District Number 506 which is situated within Prophetstown Community High School District Number 308, Whiteside and Henry Counties, Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Prophetstown City Hall, Prophetstown, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 3

Shall consist of all that part of Junior College District Number 506 which is situated within Sterling Township High School District Number 300, Whiteside and Lee Counties, Illinois, except Townships 22 North, Ranges Six and Seven East of the 4th P.M., Whiteside County, Illinois, commonly known as Genesee and Jordan Townships.

POLLING PLACE: Sterling Township High School, 1608 Fourth Avenue, Sterling, Illinois

PRECINCT NO. 4

Shall consist of all that part of Sterling Township High School District Number 300, Whiteside and Lee Counties, Illinois, located within Townships 22 North, Ranges Six and Seven East of the 4th P.M., Whiteside County, Illinois, commonly known as Genesee and Jordan Townships, all within Junior College District Number 506.

POLLING PLACE: Town Hall, Coleta, Illinois

PRECINCT NO. 5

Shall consist of all that part of Rock Falls Township High School District Number 301, Whiteside and Lee Counties, Illinois, lying in the County of Lee, State of Illinois, all within Junior College District Number 506.

POLLING PLACE: Nelson Village Hall, Nelson, Illinois

PRECINCT NO. 6

Shall consist of all that part of Rock Falls Township High School District Number 301, Whiteside and Lee Counties, Illinois, lying within the County of Whiteside, State of Illinois, all within Junior College District Number 506.

POLLING PLACE: Rock Falls High School, 101 12th Avenue, Rock Falls, Illinois

PRECINCT NO. 7

Shall consist of all that part of Dixon Unit School District Number 170, Lee and Ogle Counties, Illinois lying within Junior College District Number 506 described as: That part of the District which is located within Sections 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 in Township 22 North, Range 9 East of the 4th P.M., Ogle County, Illinois, commonly known as Grand Detour Township and also that part of said Unit School District in Lee County, Illinois which is located North and West of Rock

River, except that part which is located in Precinct No. 8, the excepted portion being the area East and South of a line drawn as follows:--Commencing at the North end of the Galena Avenue Bridge over Rock River and running North along the center of North Galena Avenue to an extension of the West line of Chapel Hill Memorial Park; thence North to the South line of the Dixon Country Club property; thence due East to Rock River.

POLLING PLACE: The Jefferson School, 4th Avenue, Dixon, Illinois

PRECINCT NO. 8

Shall consist of all that part of Dixon Unit School District Number 170, Lee and Ogle Counties, Illinois, lying within Junior College District Number 506 described as: That part of the District which lies North of Rock River and South and East of a line drawn as follows:--Commencing at the North end of the Galena Avenue Bridge over Rock River and running North along the center of North Galena Avenue to an extension of the West line of Chapel Hill Memorial Park; thence North to the South line of the Dixon Country Club property; thence due East to Rock River.

POLLING PLACE: The Washington School, 703 East Morgan, Dixon, Illinois

PRECINCT NO. 9

Shall consist of all that part of Dixon Unit School District Number 170, Lee and Ogle Counties, Illinois, lying within Junior College District Number 506 described as: That part of the District in Ogle County, Illinois which is located West and North of Rock River and East of the East line of Section 4 in Township 22 North, Range 9 East of the 4th P.M., commonly known as Grand Detour Township, and also that part of the District in Lee County, Illinois in Townships 21 and 22 North, Range 9 East, commonly known as Dixon Township, and Townships 21 and 22 North, Range 10 East, commonly known as Nachusa, which lies East of Rock River and North and East

of the following line:-- Commencing at the intersection of the East bank of Rock River with a point 20 rods North of the South line of Section 22 in Dixon Township; thence East to State Highway Route No. 2; thence South along the center of said Route No. 2 to a point 20 rods South of the center of Section 26 (said point being 20 rods South of the Hill Corner); thence East to a line 1/4 mile East of the boundary line between Sections 25 and 26 in Dixon Township, and South along this line to the South boundary line of School District 170; thence East and South to the East boundary of the school district.

POLLING PLACE: The Grand Detour School, Grand Detour, Illinois

PRECINCT NO. 10

Shall consist of all that part of Dixon Unit School District Number 170, Lee and Ogle Counties, Illinois, lying within Junior College District Number 506 described as: That part of the District bounded on the North by Rock River, on the West by the Illinois Central Railroad main line right-of-way, on the South by Seventh Street and on the East by a line drawn as follows:--Commencing at the Southwest corner of Oakwood Cemetery; thence North to the Northwest corner of Oakwood Cemetery; thence East along the North line of the cemetery to the Northeast corner thereof; thence Northerly to the Southeast corner of Idlewild Subdivision; thence North to the Northeast corner of Idlewild Subdivision; thence West to Ravine Avenue and thence Northerly along the center line of Ravine Avenue to Rock River.

POLLING PLACE: The South Central School, 207 Fifth, Dixon, Illinois

PRECINCT NO. 11

Shall consist of all that part of Dixon Unit School District Number 170, Lee and Ogle Counties, Illinois, lying within Junior College District Number 506 described as:-- That part of the District bounded on the North by Rock River, on the East by the Illinois Central Railroad main line right-of-way,

on the South by the middle line of Sections 7 and 8 in Township 21 North, Range 9 East, Lee County, Illinois, commonly known as South Dixon and on the West by the West lines of Townships 21 and 22 North, Range 9 East, Lee County, Illinois, commonly known as Dixon and South Dixon Townships.

POLLING PLACE: The Lincoln School, Lincoln Avenue, Dixon, Illinois

PRECINCT NO. 12

Shall consist of all that part of Dixon Unit School District Number 170, Lee and Ogle Counties, Illinois, lying within Junior College District Number 506 described as: That part of the District lying South and East of Rock River which is not included in Precincts Nos. 9, 10, and 11, the area included in the Precinct being as follows:--Commencing at the intersection of the Easterly bank of Rock River with an extension of the center line of Ravine Avenue in the City of Dixon and running Northeasterly along Rock River to a point 20 rods North of the South line of Section 22 in Township 22 North, Range 9 East, commonly known as Dixon Township; thence East to the center line of State Bond Issue Route No. 2; thence South along the center of said Route No. 2 to a point 20 rods South of the center of Section 26 in Dixon Township; thence East to a line 1/4 mile East of the boundary line between Sections 25 and 26 in said Dixon Township; and South along this line to the South boundary line of School District 170; thence following the East, South, and West boundaries of the District to the intersection of the West boundary of the District with the South bank of Rock River; thence Easterly along the South bank of Rock River to the West line of said Dixon Township; thence South to the center of the West line of Section 7 in Township 21 North, Range 9 East, commonly known as South Dixon Township; thence East along the center of Sections 7 and 8 to the Illinois Central Railroad main line right-of-way; thence Northerly along said railroad right-of-way to the center line of Seventh Street in the City of Dixon; thence Easterly along the center line of Seventh Street to an extension of the Westerly line of Oakwood Cemetery; thence Northerly along said Westerly line of Oakwood

Cemetery to the Northwest corner thereof; thence Easterly along the North line of the cemetery to the Northeast corner thereof; thence Northerly to the Southeast corner of Idlewild Subdivision; thence North to the Northeast corner of Idlewild Subdivision; thence West to Ravine Avenue and thence Northerly along the center line of Ravine Avenue to Rock River.
