## MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING

### SAUK VALLEY COLLEGE BOARD

#### MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING

#### SAUK VALLEY COLLEGE BOARD

April 12, 1967

President Warren E. Walder called a regular meeting of the Board of Sauk Valley College to order in the Library Conference Room at 7:30 P.M., April 12, 1967.

The secretary called the roll and the following were present: Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor, and Warren E. Walder. Absent was Clayton R. Schuneman.

Mr. Tabor moved the adoption of the attached resolution canvassing the Board election as of April 8, 1967, and the certification of the election of Peter W. Dillon and Kenneth L. Reuter to three-year terms to the Board of Sauk Valley College. Mr. Stuff seconded the motion, and the roll call indicated the following voting "Aye": Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor, and Warren E. Walder. None voted "Nay." The motion carried, and the resolution was unanimously adopted.

Proceeding to organize for the coming year, Mr. Tabor nominated Warren E. Walder for president of the Board. Mr. Dillon seconded the nomination.

Mr. Tabor moved the nominations cease and the secretary cast a unanimous ballot for Mr. Walder as president. Mr. Reuter seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Mr. Tabor then nominated Catherine R. Perkins as secretary of the Board. Mr. Dillon seconded the nomination.

Mr. Stuff moved that nominations cease and a unanimous ballot be cast for Mrs. Perkins as secretary. Mr. Dillon seconded the motion. The motion carried. Both Mr. Walder and Mrs. Perkins were declared elected to their respective offices.

Mr. Tabor moved that the existing policies and regulations of the Board be continued until altered, amended, or abolished. Mr. Reuter seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Mr. Reuter moved to reaffirm the appointment of Pauline Howe as College treasurer and to designate all banks in the district and the Harris Trust Company of Chicago as legal depositories for College funds. Mr. Stuff seconded the motion. The roll was called, and the

following voted "Aye": Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor, and Warren E. Walder. None voted "Nay." The motion carried.

Mr. Tabor moved to approve the minutes as submitted. Mr. Reuter seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Mr. Dillon moved to allow for payment of a bill from Engel Electric in the amount of \$48,908.78, which is part payment as per contract for site lighting, payable from the Site and Construction Fund. Mr. Tabor seconded the motion. The roll was called, and the following voted "Aye": Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor, and Warren E. Walder. None voted "Nay." The motion carried.

Dr. Sabol presented for approval the appointment of Stuart Y. Keller to the staff as Assistant Professor of Physics at a salary of \$9,400. Mr. Tabor moved to approve the appointment. Mr. Reuter seconded the motion. The roll was called and the following voted "Aye": Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor, and Warren E. Walder. None voted "Nay." The motion carried.

Mr. Dillon moved to authorize Mr. Edison to list specifications to enable bidding for the staff group insurance package. Mr. Stuff seconded the motion. The roll was called and the following voted "Aye": Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor, and Warren E. Walder. None voted "Nay." The motion carried. The Board discussed the necessity of keeping the specifications liberal in order to attract more bidders.

Mr. Dillon moved to direct the architects to prepare specifications and bidding documents for blacktopping the roads and existing parking lots. Mr. Reuter seconded the motion. At this point, the Board discussed the desirability and cost of installing curb and gutter along the roadways. For action on the original motion, the roll was called and the following voted "Aye": Peter W. Dillon, Catherine R. Perkins, Kenneth L. Reuter, Gerald S. Stuff, Forrest L. Tabor, and Warren E. Walder. None voted "Nay." The motion carried.

Dr. Sabol reported that student applications for Fall have passed the 200 mark.

The Board discussed providing a line for electric service for a future sign at the traffic divider island at the entrance. It would need to be wired, from an existing light, under the road prior to application of blacktop.

Dr. Sabol reported that Dixon High School FFA had paid \$1,510 as rental of the portion of the campus they had planted to corn.

Mr. Walder and Mrs. Perkins planned to attend the conference of Illinois Association of Community and Junior Colleges at O'Hare Inn in Chicago on April 15, 1967, the meeting having been postponed from April 8, 1967, because of board elections.

Mr. Dillon moved to adjourn to the regular meeting April 24, 1967. Mr. Reuter seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned.

WHEREAS, the Board of Junior College District No. 506, Whiteside, Lee, Ogle, Henry, and Bureau Counties, Illinois did on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of March, 1967 call a regular election for the purpose of electing two (2) members to the Board of said College, and

WHEREAS, the Board has caused a proper notice to be given of said election by publishing notice thereof once in The Daily Gazette of Sterling, Illinois, and once in the Dixon Evening Telegraph of Dixon, Illinois, the same being newspapers published in and having a general circulation within the territory of the district, the date of publication of such notice being at least ten (10) days prior to the date of said election, which notice did specify the precincts where the election was to be held, the time of the opening and closing of the polls, and the purpose of the election, all as evidenced by an Affidavit of the publishers of said newspapers, and having attached thereto newspaper clippings of such notice as so published, which said notices and Affidavits are now on file with and are part of the permanent records of the Board of said Junior College District and are in words and figures as follows:

**POLLING PLACE:** Sterling Township High School, 1608 Fourth Avenue, Sterling, Illinois.

**PRECINCT NO. 4**

Shall consist of all that part of Sterling Township High School District Number 300, Whiteside and Lee Counties, Illinois, located within Townships 22 North, Ranges Six and Seven East of the 4th P.M., Whiteside County, Illinois, commonly known as Genesee and Jordan Townships, all within Junior College District Number 506.

**POLLING PLACE:** Town Hall, Coleta, Illinois.

Shall consist of all that part of Dixon Unit School District Number 170, Lee and Ogle Counties, Illinois, lying within Junior College District Number 506 described as: That part of the District in Lee County, Illinois, in Townships 21 and 22 North, Range 9 East, commonly known as Dixon Township, and Townships 21 and 22 North, Range 10 East, commonly known as Nacusa, which lies East of the 4th P.M., Ogle County, Illinois, commonly known as Grand Detour Township and also that part of said Unit School District in Lee County, Illinois, which is located North and West of Rock River with a point 20 rods North of the South line of Section 22 in Dixon Township; thence East to State Highway Route No. 2; thence South along the center of said Route No. 2 to a point 20 rods South of the center of Section 26 (said point being 20 rods South of the Hill Corner); thence East to a line 1/4 mile East of the boundary line between Sections 25 and 26 in Dixon Township, and South along this line to the South boundary line of School District 170; thence East and South to the East boundary of the school district.

Shall consist of all that part of Dixon Unit School District Number 170, Lee and Ogle Counties, Illinois, lying within Junior College District Number 506 described as: That part of the District bounded on the North by Rock River, on the West by the Illinois Central Railroad main line right-of-way, on the South by Seventh Street and one the East by a line drawn as follows: - Commencing at the Southwest corner of Oakwood Cemetery; thence North to the Northwest

corner of Oakwood Cemetery; thence East along the North line of the cemetery to the Northeast corner thereof; thence Northerly to the Southeast corner of Idlewild Subdivision; thence North to the Northeast corner of Idlewild Subdivision; thence West to Ravine Avenue and thence North along the center line of Ravine Avenue to Rock River.
