MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING SAUK VALLEY COLLEGE BOARD

September 8, 1969

The Board of Sauk Valley College met in regular meeting at 8:00 p.m. on September 8, 1969 in the President's Office at Sauk Valley College, Rural Route #1, Dixon, Illinois. Chairman Schuneman called the meeting to order at 8:10 p.m. and the following members answered roll call: Catherine Perkins, Kenneth Reuter, Gerald Stuff, Warren Walder, Clayton Schuneman. Peter Dillon and Orval DeWeerth were absent.

It was moved and seconded that the minutes of the August 25, 1969 meeting be approved as presented. Motion voted and carried.

It was moved and seconded that the Board approve the appointment of John O'Banion as Instructor of English effective September 1, 1969 at a salary of \$8,175 for the academic year. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Member DeWeerth arrived at 8:15 p.m.

Mr. Gus Hinueber gave a progress report on the referendum.

It was moved and seconded that the Board allow faculty children to attend the Child Care Center at the rate of:

\$100 per semester	one child	one-half day
\$180 per semester	one child	full day
\$180 per semester	two children	one-half day

Motion voted and carried.

It was moved and seconded that the Charge-Back figure for students attending Sauk Valley College from "Out-of-District" high schools and other community colleges be set at \$32.25 per semester hour as per the audit calculation involving the costs from the prior year.

It was moved and seconded that a fee of \$10.00 be charged for each proficiency exam administered by the college. In a roll call vote the following was recorded: Ayes Members Perkins, Reuter and Schuneman. Nays-Members DeWeerth, Stuff and Walder. Motion failed for lack of a majority. It was then moved and seconded that proficiency examinations be administered by the college with no fee charged and the following vote was recorded: Ayes Members DeWeerth, Perkins, Reuter, Stuff, and Walder. Nays-Member Schuneman. Motion carried.

It was voted that enrollment figures after the close of registration on September 8, 1969 were 1,350 students for a total of 15,908 credit hours.

Dr. Sabol gave a progress report on Graphics for the new building and also informed the Board of the dates of the IACJC fall meetings.

It was moved and seconded that the following policy on student housing be adopted by the Board. Motion voted and carried.

All housing arrangements are the responsibility of the student. The Student Services Office maintains a list of accommodations that are offered by the residents of the Sauk Valley College District and the surrounding area. The College does not inspect these accommodations nor screen them for desirability

A lengthy discussion was held on a proposal to change the compensation for over-load and part-time teachers. Dr. Sabol noted that in the past the teachers had been paid as follows:

Instructor - Asst. Professor	\$180 per credit hour
Associate Professor - Professor	\$200 per credit hour
Outside Consultants	\$225 to \$250 "

Dr. Sabol said he was now regarding the following:

Faculty members - 1/36th of their annual contract

Part-time Faculty:

Instructor-Asst. Professor	\$200 per credit hour
Associate Professor- Professor	\$225 per credit hour
Outside consultants	\$250 per credit hour

In the discussion that followed, Dr. Sabol pointed out that anything over 16 hours was usually considered overload; that department heads were to teach 15-18 hours per year; and that if this increase was granted the part-time and overload for the first semester should amount to approximately \$18,958. It was the consensus of the Board that this matter be tabled for further study and until all the overload is assigned for the first semester.

It was moved and seconded that the attached administrative calendar be approved as presented. Motion voted and carried.

Dr. Sabol presented the following construction report to the Board:

Unit I concrete slab work is now complete. Glass is being installed today (9-8-69). Sprayed acoustic is being applied to the ceiling area. Undercoat work was started so that fin tube could be installed. Finish trades continue with painting, installation of wire glass, chalk and tack boards. Elevator number one is being completed for use by Royal. Water storage tank has been filled, will now be drained and refilled and chlorine added. Fire pumproom piping is nearly completed and final connection of electric and diesel fire pump is under way. Unit II concrete walks are 90% complete. Unit III gym walls are 25% complete. Masons continue in short supply. Unit IV has trades on all floors. Quarry tile floor in basement kitchen is complete and 75% complete at second floor serving area. Sprinkler system awaits the finish of the ceiling before sprinklerheads are attached. Mechanical equipment screen is in place on the roof. Blacktop is complete on lots 8, 9, and 10. Grasstex has been applied to track but still gets two seal coats. Footing was poured for part of the retaining wall in harbor. Excavating was kept dry with pump and well points. Drain tile not complete because of rain Friday afternoon and Saturday morning. Seeding was started the first of last week. Royal and Servco are scheduled to meet with Dale Nederhoff and with Donovan Construction on September 9th to make up their installation schedule. Royal and Servco both have equipment stored in the building.

In a discussion on estimated heating costs for the new building, it was agreed that the Board should enter into a contract with Northern Illinois Gas Company. This contract to be based on their latest proposal calling for rate schedule #4 with rider #9.

It was moved and seconded that the Board approve Dean Cias' recommendation to create the position of "Associate Dean of Student Services" whose duties are attached. This position to be assigned a current staff members and will involve no additional renumeration. Motion voted and carried.

It was moved and seconded that the Board approve the attached resolution calling for the special referendum election on September 27, 1969. In a roll call vote all voted aye. Motion carried.

Member Stuff requested a list of Agriculture students that were enrolled in "on the job" training this past summer. He also requested information on where each student was working.

Member DeWeerth inquired about the enrollment under our Law Enforcement grant.

Since there was no further business, it was moved and seconded that the Board adjourn. The next regular meeting will be on September 22, 1969, with a work session scheduled for 7:30 p. m. September 15, 1969. The following vote was recorded: Ayes Members DeWeerth, Perkins, Reuter, Stuff, Walder and Schuneman. Nays-0. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:40 p.m.

**Proposed Designation
of
ASSOCIATE DEAN OF STUDENT SERVICES**

The Associate Dean of Student Services is directly responsible to the Dean of Student Services. His primary duty shall be to represent the Dean of Student Services and the Student Services staff in the event the Dean is not available.

The Associate Dean of Student Services shall:

- 1) Act for the Dean of Student Services in those student cases requiring immediate disciplinary action or review when the Dean is not available.**
- 2) Upon direction from the Dean, he shall assume the duties of supervising and administrating the functions of student admissions, student activities, student health services, student counseling and testing, student financial aid and student placement and vocational services.**
- 3) Assist the Dean of Student Services by serving on committees regarding student welfare.**
- 4) Assist the Dean in the preparation of research studies and surveys involving students.**
- 5) Serve as a liaison between the Student Services Department and the Registrar.**
- 6) Perform any other supervisory or administrative tasks in the Student Services Department as assigned by the Dean of Student Services.**

No additional compensation would be involved for this assignment.

MINUTES of the regular meeting of the Board of Junior College District Number 506, Whiteside, Lee, Ogle, Henry and Bureau Counties, Illinois, held on the 8th day of September, 1969 at 8:00 o'clock P.M.

The President called the meeting to order and directed the Secretary to call the roll.

Upon the roll being called, Clayton R. Schuneman, the President and the following members answered present:

Orval DeWeerth, Catherine Perkins, Kenneth Reuter, Gerald Stuff,
Warren Walder, and Clayton Schuneman.

The following members were absent from the meeting:

Peter Dillon

The President stated that there should be considered the sufficiency of the present educational fund tax rate of the District and the present building fund tax rate of the District and the need for increasing the same in order that the District may have sufficient educational funds to properly and adequately maintain the educational standards of the District and sufficient building funds to maintain the buildings of the District and for other building purposes as provided by law. After a full and complete discussion of the need for increasing the present educational and building tax rates and the amount of the increase required in order to provide an efficient and adequate program, to maintain the buildings of the District and for other building purposes, Member Perkins presented and the following resolution was read:

RESOLUTION

Section 1. That a special election be and the same is hereby called to be held in and for Junior College District Number 506, Counties of Whiteside, Lee, Ogle, Henry and Bureau, State of Illinois, on Saturday, the 27th day of September, 1969, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of said District the proposition of increasing the annual tax rates of said District for educational and building purposes as hereinafter set forth in the form of notice to be given of said election, and that the polls at said special election shall be opened at twelve o'clock Noon and closed at seven o'clock P.M., Central Daylight Savings time of that day.

Section 2. That for the purpose of said election, said Junior College District shall be divided into 25 voting precincts and that the boundaries of said voting precincts and the number of the polling place designated for each voting precinct shall be as hereinafter set forth in the form of the notice to be given of said election.

Section 3. That notice of said election shall be given by publishing notice thereof at least once in The Daily Gazette of Sterling, Illinois and once in the Dixon Evening Telegraph of Dixon, Illinois, the same being newspapers published in and having a general circulation within the territory of the District, the date of publication of such notice to be at least ten days prior to the date set for said election, and that the notice shall be in substantially the following form:

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

NOTICE is hereby given that on Saturday, the 27th day of September, 1969, a special election will be held in and for Junior College District Number 506, Whiteside, L , Ogle, Henry and Bureau Counties, Illinois, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of said Junior College District the following propositions:

PROPOSITION TO INCREASE MAXIMUM
ANNUAL EDUCATIONAL TAX RATE

Shall the maximum annual tax rate for the educational purposes of Junior College District Number 506, Whiteside, Lee, Ogle, Henry and Bureau Counties, Illinois, be increased and established at .21 percent on the full, fair cash value of taxable property as equalized or assessed by the Department of Revenue, instead of .12 percent, the maximum rate otherwise applicable to the next taxes to be extended for said purpose?

- (a) An estimate of the approximate amount of educational taxes extendible under the maximum rate now in force for said Junior College District is \$533,093.57 .
- (b) An estimate of the approximate amount of educational taxes extendible under the proposed increased rate is the sum of \$932,913.75 .

PROPOSITION TO INCREASE MAXIMUM
ANNUAL BUILDING TAX RATE

Shall the maximum annual tax rate for the building purposes and the purchase of school grounds of Junior College District Number 506, Whiteside, Lee, Ogle, Henry and Bureau Counties, Illinois, be increased and established at .08 percent on the full, fair cash value of taxable property as equalized or assessed by the Department of Revenue, instead of .03 percent, the maximum rate otherwise applicable to the next taxes to be extended for said purpose?

- (a) An estimate of the approximate amount of building fund taxes extendible under the maximum rate now in force in said Junior College District is \$133,273.39 .

(b) An estimate of the approximate amount of building fund taxes extendible under the proposed increase rate in said Junior College District is \$355,395.72.

That for the purpose of said election said Junior College District is divided into twenty-five precincts and the boundaries and polling places are as follows:

PRECINCT NO. 1

Shall consist of all that part of Prophetstown-Lyndon Community Unit District Number 3, Whiteside and Henry Counties, Illinois, lying within Junior College District Number 506, described as that part of the District which lies North of the Rock River.

POLLING PLACE: Lyndon Junior High School, Lyndon, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 2

Shall consist of all that part of Prophetstown-Lyndon Community Unit District Number 3, Whiteside and Henry Counties, Illinois, lying within Junior College District Number 506, described as that part of the District which lies South of the Rock River.

POLLING PLACE: Prophetsto City Hall, Prophetstown, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 3

Shall consist of all that part of Junior College District Number 506 which is situated within Sterling Township High School District Number 300, Whiteside and Lee Counties, Illinois, except Townships 22 North, Ranges Six and Seven East of the 4th P.M., Whiteside County, Illinois, commonly known as Genesee and Jordan Townships.

POLLING PLACE: Sterling Township High School, Fifth Avenue Entrance, 1608 Fifth Avenue, Sterling, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 4

Shall consist of all that part of Sterling Township High School District Number 300, Whiteside and Lee Counties, Illinois, located within Townships 22 North, Ranges Six and Seven East of the 4th P.M., Whiteside County, Illinois, commonly known as Genesee and Jordan Townships, all within Junior College District Number 506.

POLLING PLACE: Town Hall, Coleta, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 5

Shall consist of all that part of Rock Falls Township High School District Number 301, Whiteside and Lee Counties, Illinois, lying in the County of Lee, State of Illinois, all within Junior College District Number 506.

POLLING PLACE: Nelson School, Nelson, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 6

Shall consist of all that part of Rock Falls Township High School District Number 301, Whiteside and Lee Counties, Illinois, lying within the County of Whiteside, State of Illinois, all within Junior College District Number 506.

POLLING PLACE: Rock Falls High School, 101 12th Avenue, Rock Falls, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 7

Shall consist of all that part of Dixon Unit School District Number 170, Lee and Ogle Counties, Illinois, lying within Junior College District Number 506 described as: That part of the District which is located within Sections 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 in Township 22 North, Range 9 East of the 4th P.M., Ogle County, Illinois, commonly known as Grand Detour Township and also that part of said Unit School District in Lee County, Illinois which is located North and West of Rock

River, except that part which is located in Precinct No. 8, the excepted portion being the area East and South of a line drawn as follows:--Commencing at the North end of the Galena Avenue Bridge over Rock River and running North along the center of North Galena Avenue to an extension of the West line of Chapel Hill Memorial Park; thence North to the South line of the Dixon Country Club property; thence due East to Rock River.

POLLING PLACE: The Jefferson School, 4th Avenue, Dixon, Illinois

PRECINCT NO. 8..

Shall consist of all that part of Dixon Unit School District Number 170, Lee and Ogle Counties, Illinois, lying within Junior College District Number 506 described as: That part of the District which lies North of Rock River and South and East of a line drawn as follows:--Commencing at the North end of the Galena Avenue Bridge over Rock River and running North along the center of North Galena Avenue to an extension of the West line of Chapel Hill Memorial Park; thence North to the South line of the Dixon Country Club property; thence due East to Rock River.

POLLING PLACE: The Washington School, 703 East Morgan, Dixon, Illinois

PRECINCT NO. 9

Shall consist of all that part of Dixon Unit School District Number 170, Lee and Ogle Counties, Illinois, lying within Junior College District Number 506 described as: That part of the District in Ogle County, Illinois which is located West and North of Rock River and East of the East line of Section 4 in Township 22 North, Range 9 East of the 4th P.M., commonly known as Grand Detour Township, and also that part of the District in Lee County, Illinois in Townships 21 and 22 North, Range 9 East, commonly known as Dixon Township, and Townships 21 and 22 North, Range 10 East, commonly known as Nachusa, which lies East of Rock River and North and East

of the following line:-- Commencing at the intersection of the East bank of Rock River with a point 20 rods North of the South line of Section 22 in Dixon Township; thence East to State Highway Route No. 2; thence South along the center of said Route No. 2 to a point 20 rods South of the center of Section 26 (said point being 20 rods South of the Hill Corner); thence East to a line 1/4 mile East of the boundary line between Sections 25 and 26 in Dixon Township, and South along this line to the South boundary line of School District 170; thence East and South to the East boundary of the school district.

POLLING PLACE: The Grand Detour School, Grand Detour, Illinois

PRECINCT NO. 10

Shall consist of all that part of Dixon Unit School District Number 170, Lee and Ogle Counties, Illinois, lying within Junior College District Number 506 described as: That part of the District bounded on the North by Rock River, on the West by the Illinois Central Railroad main line right-of-way, on the South by Seventh Street and on the East by a line drawn as follows:--Commencing at the Southwest corner of Oakwood Cemetery; thence North to the Northwest corner of Oakwood Cemetery; thence East along the North line of the cemetery to the Northeast corner thereof; thence Northerly to the Southeast corner of Idlewild Subdivision; thence North to the Northeast corner of Idlewild Subdivision; thence West to Ravine Avenue and thence Northerly along the center line of Ravine Avenue to Rock River.

POLLING PLACE: The South Central School, 207 Fifth, Dixon, Illinois

PRECINCT NO. 11

Shall consist of all that part of Dixon Unit School District Number 170, Lee and Ogle Counties, Illinois, lying within Junior College District Number 506 described as:-- That part of the District bounded on the North by Rock River, on the East by the Illinois Central Railroad main line right-of-way,

on the South by the middle line of Sections 7 and 8 in Township 21 North, Range 9 East, Lee County, Illinois, commonly known as South Dixon and on the West by the West lines of Townships 21 and 22 North, Range 9 East, Lee County, Illinois, commonly known as Dixon and South Dixon Townships.

POLLING PLACE: The Lincoln School, Lincoln Avenue, Dixon, Illinois

PRECINCT NO. 12

Shall consist of all that part of Dixon Unit School District Number 170, Lee and Ogle Counties Illinois, lying within Junior College District Number 506 described as: That part of the District lying South and East of Rock River which is not included in Precincts Nos. 9, 10, and 11, the area included in the Precinct being as follows:--Commencing at the intersection of the Easterly bank of Rock River with an extension of the center line of Ravine Avenue in the City of Dixon and running Northeasterly along Rock River to a point 20 rods North of the South line of Section 22 in Township 22 North, Range 9 East, commonly known as Dixon Township; thence East to the center line of State Bond Issue Route No. 2; thence South along the center of said Route No. 2 to a point 20 rods South of the center of Section 26 in Dixon Township; thence East to a line 1/4 mile East of the boundary line between Sections 25 and 26 in said Dixon Township; and South along this line to the South boundary line of School District 170; thence following the East, South, and West boundaries of the District to the intersection of the West boundary of the District with the South bank of Rock River; thence Easterly along the South bank of Rock River to the West line of said Dixon Township; thence South to the center of the West line of Section 7 in Township 21 North, Range 9 East, commonly known as South Dixon Township; thence East along the center of Sections 7 and 8 to the Illinois Central Railroad main line right-of-way; thence Northerly along said railroad right-of-way to the center line of Seventh Street in the City of Dixon; thence Easterly along the center line of Seventh Street to an extension of the Westerly line of Oakwood Cemetery; thence Northerly along said Westerly line of Oakwood

Cemetery to the Northwest corner thereof; thence Easterly along the North line of the Cemetery to the Northeast corner thereof; thence Northerly to the Southeast corner of Idlewild Subdivision; thence North to the Northeast corner of Idlewild Subdivision; thence West to Ravine Avenue and thence Northerly along the center line of Ravine Avenue to Rock River.

POLLING PLACE: The Madison School, 620 Division Street Dixon, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 13

Shall consist of all that part of Junior College District Number 506 which is situated within Tampico Township High School District Number 302, Whiteside and Bureau Counties, Illinois, except the portion of said High School District described as: The West Half of Section 31 in Township 20 North, Range Seven East of the 4th P.M., commonly known as Montmorency Township and Sections 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 21, 22, 23, 28, 32, and 33, the South Half of Section 5, the North Half of Section 24, the Northwest Quarter and the West Half of the Northeast Quarter of Section 26, the West Half of Section 34 and all of Section 27 except the Southeast Quarter thereof, all in Township 19 North, Range 7 East of the 4th P.M., commonly known as Hahnaman Township, Whiteside County, Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Tampico High School, Tampico, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 14

Shall consist of all that part of Junior College District Number 506 which is situated within Tampico Township High School District Number 302, Whiteside and Bureau Counties, Illinois, described as: The West Half of Section 31 in Township 20 North, Range Seven East of the 4th P.M., commonly known as Montmorency Township and Sections 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 21, 22, 23, 28, 32, and 33, the South Half of Section 5, the North Half of Section 24, the Northwest Quarter and the West Half of the Northeast Quarter of

Section 26, the West Half of Section 34 and all of Section 27 except the Southeast Quarter thereof, all in Township 19 North, Range 7 East of the 4th P.M., commonly known as Hahnaman Township, Whiteside County, Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Hahnaman Consolidated School, Deer Grove, Illinois

PRECINCT NO. 15

Shall consist of all that part of Amboy Community Unit School District Number 272, Lee County, Illinois, which is located within that portion of Townships 20 and 21 North, Range Ten East of the 4th P.M., Lee County, Illinois, commonly known as Amboy and China Townships, all within Junior College District Number 506.

POLLING PLACE: Amboy City Hall, Amboy, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 16

Shall consist of all that part of Amboy Community Unit School District Number 272, Lee County, Illinois, which is located within that portion of Townships 19 and 20 North, Range Eleven East of the 4th P.M., Lee County, Illinois, commonly known as Sublette and Lee Center Townships, all within Junior College District Number 506.

POLLING PLACE: Sublette Public Elementary School, Sublette, Illinois

PRECINCT NO. 17

Shall consist of all that part of Amboy Community Unit School District Number 272, Lee County, Illinois, which is located within Township 19 North, Ranges 9 and 10 East of the 4th P.M., Lee County, Illinois, commonly known as East Grove and May Townships, all within Junior College District Number 506

POLLING PLACE: Maytown Elementary School, Maytown, Illinois

PRECINCT NO. 18

Shall consist of all that part of Amboy Community Unit School District Number 272, Lee County, Illinois, which is located within Township 20 North, Range 9 East of the 4th P.M., Lee County, Illinois, commonly known as Marion Township, within Junior College District Number 506.

POLLING PLACE: Walton Town Hall, Walton, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 19

Shall consist of all that part of Amboy Community Unit School District Number 272, Lee County, Illinois, which is located within that portion of Townships 21 North, Ranges 9 and 10 East of the 4th P.M., Lee County, Illinois, commonly known as South Dixon and Nachusa Townships, all within Junior College District Number 506.

POLLING PLACE: Eldena Elementary School, Eldena, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 20

Shall consist of all that part of Amboy Community Unit School District Number 272, Lee County, Illinois, which is located within Townships 19 and 20 North, Range 8 East of the 4th P.M., Lee County, Illinois, commonly known as Hamilton and Harmon Townships, all within Junior College District Number 506.

POLLING PLACE: Harmon Village Hall, Harmon, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 21

Shall consist of all that part of Junior College District Number 506 which is situated within Walnut Community High School District Number 508; Bureau, Lee, and Whiteside Counties, Illinois.
