Rock River; all of Township 21 North, Range 4 East of the 4th P.M. except Sections 6, 7, and 18 and the $W\frac{1}{2}$ of Sections 5, 8 and 17 in said Township; part of Township 22 North, Range 4 East of the 4th P.M., described as all of Sections 1, 2, 11, 12, 13, 14, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, the $E\frac{1}{2}$ of Sections 29 and 32 and all of Sections 33, 34, 35 and 36 in said Township; all of Township 22 North, Range 5 East of the 4th P.M., except Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, and the $E\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 5, the $N\frac{1}{2}$ of Sections 10, 11 and 12, and the $SE\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 12 and the $E\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 13 in said township; part of Township 22 North, Range 6 East of the 4th P.M. described as all of Sections 14, 15, 16, 17, 19 through 36 inclusive, the $E\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 18, the $S\frac{1}{2}$ of Sections 9 and 10, the $S\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 11, except the $S\frac{1}{2}$ of the $SE\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 11, the $W\frac{1}{2}$ of the $SE\frac{1}{4}$ and the $E\frac{1}{4}$ of the $SW\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 12, the $S\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 13, the $E\frac{1}{2}$ of the $NW\frac{1}{4}$ and the $W\frac{1}{2}$ of the $W\frac{1}{2}$ of the $NE\frac{1}{4}$ and the $SE\frac{1}{4}$ of the $NE\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 13; part of Township 22 North, Range 7 East of the 4th P.M. described as all of Sections 1, 2, 3, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 19 through 36 inclusive, the $S\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 18, the $SW\frac{1}{4}$ and the Westerly $\frac{1}{4}$ of the $SE\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 17, all of Section 16 except the $N\frac{1}{2}$ of the $NW\frac{1}{4}$ and excepting part of Lot 9 as per school survey described as follows: Beginning 1 chain East of the center of the Section and running thence West to the West line of the Section, thence South 10 chains to the Southwest Corner of said Lot 9, thence East to the center of Elkhorn Creek 36.18 chains more or less, thence Northerly in the center of said Creek 3.20 chains, thence East 2.10 chains, thence Northwesterly in a direct line to the place of beginning.

Shall consist of all that part of Morrison Community High School District Number 307, Whiteside County, Illinois, lying East of Highway 78 and outside the corporate limits of Morrison, Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Hiddleson School, Chadwick Slab, North of Rt. 30, Morrison, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 3

Shall consist of all that part of Morrison Community High School District Number 307, Whiteside County, Illinois, lying West of Highway 78 and outside the corporate limits of Morrison, Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Union Grove Town Hall, in said Union Grove Township, Whiteside County, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 4

Shall consist of the area within the corporate limits of Prophetstown, Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Prophetstown Community High School, Prophetstown, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 5

Shall consist of all that part of Prophetstown Community High School District Number 308, Whiteside and Henry Counties, Illinois, lying outside the corporate limits of Prophetstown, Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Centerville School, East of Route 78, Prophetstown, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 6

Shall consist of the area within the corporate limits of Tampico, Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Tampico City Hall, Tampico, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 7

Shall consist of the area within the corporate limits of Deer Grove, Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Hahnman Grade School, Deer Grove, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 8

Shall consist of all that part of Tampico Township High School District Number 302, Whiteside and Bureau Counties, Illinois, lying outside the corporate limits of Tampico and Deer Grove, in the State of Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Maple Hill School, 1.5 miles East of Tampico, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 9

Shall consist of the area within the corporate limits of Sterling, Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Sterling Township High School, 1608 Fourth Avenue, Sterling, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 10

Shall consist of the area within the corporate limits of Coleta, Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Town Hall, Coleta, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 11

Shall consist of all that part of Sterling Township High School District Number 300, Whiteside and Lee Counties, Illinois, lying West of Highway 88 and outside the corporate limits of Sterling and Coleta in the State of Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Emerson School, Emerson, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 12

Shall consist of all that part of Sterling Township High School District Number 300, Whiteside and Lee Counties, Illinois, lying East of Highway 88, outside the corporate limits of Sterling, Illinois and Township 22 North, Range 7 East of the 4th P.M., Whiteside County, Illinois, commonly known as Jordan Township.

PRECINCT NO. 13

Shall consist of all that part of Rock Falls Township High School District Number 301, Whiteside and Lee Counties, Illinois, lying East of Highway 88 and outside the corporate limits of Rock Falls and Nelson in the State of Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: East Coloma School, Dixon Road, Rock Falls, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 17

Shall consist of all that part of Rock Falls Township High School District Number 301, Whiteside and Lee Counties, Illinois, lying West of Highway 88 and outside the corporate limits of Rock Falls and Nelson, in the State of Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Riverdale School, Prophetstown Road, Rock Falls, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 18

Shall consist of the area within the corporate limits of Dixon, Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Lobby of Lancaster Gymnasium, Dixon High School, Dixon, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 19

Shall consist of all that part of Dixon Unit School District Number 170, Lee and Ogle Counties, Illinois, lying outside the corporate limits of Dixon, Illinois and North of the Rock River except that portion of said District lying East of the West line of Sections 3 and 10 and North of the Rock River in Township 22 North, Range 9 East of the 4th P.M., Ogle County, Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Leo's Place, 1319 Palmyra Road, Dixon, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 20

Shall consist of all that part of Dixon Unit School District Number 170, Lee and Ogle Counties, Illinois, lying outside the corporate limits of Dixon, Illinois and South of the Rock River plus that portion of said District lying East of the West line of Sections 3 and 10 and North of the Rock River in Township 22 North, Range 9 East of the 4th P.M., Ogle County, Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Hall's L P Gas Service, Route 52 South, Dixon, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 21

Shall consist of the area within the corporate limits of Amboy, Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Amboy City Hall, Amboy, Illinois

PRECINCT NO. 22

Shall consist of the area within the corporate limits of Sublette, Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Sublette City Hall, Sublette, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 23

Shall consist of the area within the corporate limits of Harmon, Illinois.

POLLING PLACE: Harmon Village Hall, Harmon, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 24

Shall consist of all that part of Amboy Community Unit School District Number 272, Lee County, Illinois, lying outside the corporate limits of Amboy, Illinois and within Townships 20 and 21 North, Range 10 East of the 4th P.M. and Township 20 North, Range 11 East of the 4th P.M., all in Lee County, Illinois, said Townships being commonly known as Amboy, Nachusa-China and Lee Center.

POLLING PLACE: Conibear Motel, Junction of Highways 30 and 51, Lee County, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 25

Shall consist of all that part of Amboy Community Unit School District Number 272, Lee County, Illinois, lying outside the corporate limits of Sublette, Illinois and within Township 19 North, Range 8 East of the 4th P.M.; Township 19 North, Range 9 East of the 4th P.M.; Township 19 North, Range 10 East of the 4th P.M.; and Township 19 North, Range 11 East of the 4th P.M., all in Lee County, Illinois, said Townships being commonly known as Hamilton, East Grove, May and Sublette.

PRECINCT NO. 26

Shall consist of all that part of Amboy Community Unit School District Number 272, Lee County, Illinois, lying outside the corporate limits of Harmon, Illinois and within Townships 20 and 21 North, Range 9 East of the 4th P.M., and Township 20 North, Range 8 East of the 4th P.M., all in Lee County, Illinois, said Townships being commonly known as Marion, South Dixon and Harmon.

Shall consist of all the area within the corporate limits of Polo, Illinois.

Shall consist of all of that part of Polo Community Unit School District Number 222, Ogle, Lee and Whiteside Counties, Illinois, lying outside the corporate limits of Polo, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 4
