MINUTES OF THE SAUK VALLEY COLLEGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

April 25, 1977

The Board of Trustees of Sauk Valley College met in regular meeting at 8:00 p.m. on April 25, 1977 in the Board Room of Sauk Valley College, Rural Route #1, Dixon, Illinois.

Call to Order: Chairman Coplan called the meeting to order at 8:04 p.m. and the following members answered roll call:

Minutes: It was moved by Member Keefer and seconded by Member Koenig that the Board approve the minutes of the April 11 meeting with the correction to reflect that the nominations and election of the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer of the Board were conducted with a roll call vote. In a roll call vote the following was recorded: Ayes: Members Fisher, Keefer, Koenig, Powers, Prescott, Thompson and Coplan. Nays: 0. Motion carried.

From Visitors: Cookie Kiszely read a letter on behalf of her husband, Stephan F. Kiszely, Drama Director at Sterling High School regarding the drama program at Sauk Valley College, as per the attached.

Treasurer's
Report: It was moved by Member Koenig and seconded by Member Keefer that the Board approve the attached Treasurer's Report. Motion voted and carried.

Payroll: It was moved by Member Koenig and seconded by Member Fisher that the Board approve the March 31 payroll in the amount of \$111,452.66 and the April 15 payroll in the amount of \$103,961.33. In a roll call vote the following was recorded: Ayes: Members Fisher, Keefer, Koenig, Powers, Prescott, Thompson and Coplan. Nays: 0. Motion carried.

Tenure: It was moved by Member Keefer and seconded by Member Prescott that the Board grant tenure to the following individuals effective July 1, 1977:

Motion voted and carried.

Extra Increments: Following discussion, it was moved by Member Prescott and seconded by Member Keefer that the Board accept Dr. Cole's recommendation not to provide extra increments for David Lovekin and Edward Beatty but that a special commendation should be placed in their file for the outstanding contributions each of these individuals has made during the past academic year. Motion voted and carried.

Promotions: Following discussion, it was moved by Member Keefer and seconded by Member Prescott that the Board approve the following promotions as a group, effective with the 1977-78 academic year.

Carl Gates from Instructor, Step XI to Assistant Professor, Step VIII; Steve Johnson from Assistant Instructor, Step IV to Instructor, Step II; Joan Melvin from Assistant Instructor, Step XI to Instructor, Step IX; John O'Banion from Assistant Professor, Step V to Associate Professor, Step II; and Karen Pinter from Assistant Professor, Step XI to Associate Professor, Step VIII. In a roll call vote the following was recorded: Ayes: Members Fisher, Keefer, Koenig, Powers, Prescott, Thompson and Coplan. Nays: 0. Motion carried.

Donation: It was moved by Member Prescott and seconded by Member Thompson (Fisher) that the Board accept the donation of John W. Bopp of \$100 to the senior citizen scholarship fund at Sauk Valley College and empower the President to write a letter of appreciation to Mr. Bopp and to forward the check to the SVC Foundation for deposit and dispersal. Motion voted and carried.

Ag Land Lab: Following discussion it was moved by Member Koenig and seconded by Member Prescott that the Board allow the agriculture department to utilize seven acres of the land adjacent to the present Land Lab as a soybean experimental plot. Motion voted and carried. Member Thompson voted no.

Budget Amendment: It was moved by Member Prescott and seconded by Member Koenig that the Board approve the attached budget amendment. In a roll call vote the following was recorded: Ayes: Members Fisher, Keefer, Koenig, Powers, Prescott, Thompson and Coplan. Nays: 0. Motion carried.

Budget: Dr. Cole advised the Board that he would have a 1977-78 budget review available by June 16.

Grievance: The attached letter to the SVC Faculty Association from the Board of Trustees' Grievance Hearing Committee was presented to the Board.

Positions: A lengthy discussion followed regarding a position in the theater department at SVC. Dr. Cole agreed to come in with a recommendation at the May 9 Board meeting on this position and also consider personnel needs in the electronics area, the heating & refrigeration area, and the law enforcement area.

Building Repairs: Attorney Castendyck advised the Board that he had received a communication from the IBA with regard to setting priorities for repairing the building and accomplishing these repairs as soon as possible now that the Donovan Case was settled. Chairman Coplan appointed the following committee to consider the recommendations of the IBA and the Capital Development Board with regard to these repairs.

Academic Calendar: It was moved by Member Koenig and seconded by Member Prescott that the Board accept the attached Sauk Valley College calendar for the 1977-78 academic year. Motion voted and carried.

Student Records: The item on the proposed policy on student records is to be discussed at the next meeting.

Board Workshop: Chairman Coplan advised the Board there will be a Board Workshop at 4 p.m. on Monday, May 9, in the Board Room at Sauk Valley College. Members are to send any questions or items they may wish discussed at this workshop to Dr. Cole and he will prepare the agenda for the workshop.

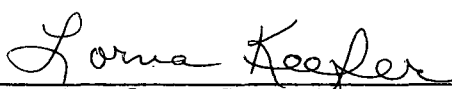

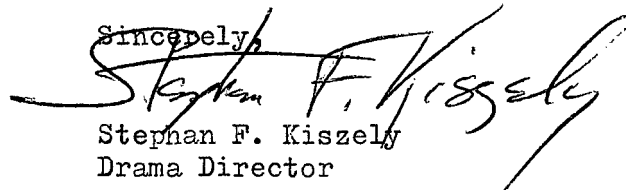
Dear Ladies and Gentlemen,

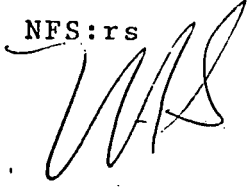

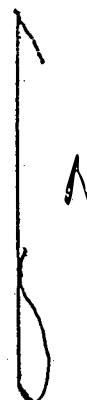
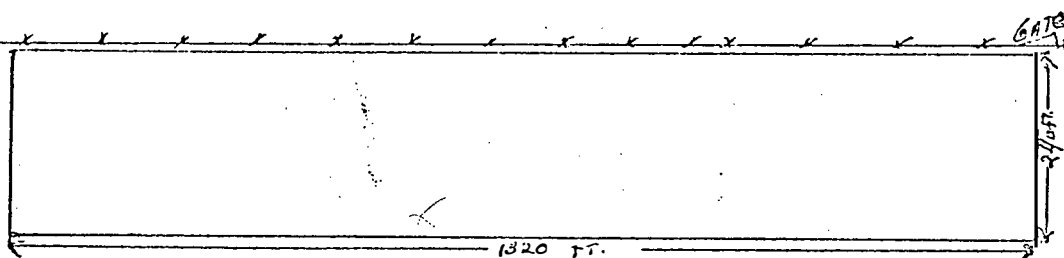
The Agriculture Department requests the use of approximately 7 acres of campus for a soybean demonstration plot. This has been requested by a great majority of the visitors that attended "Agronomy Day" last September. The area we are requesting use of is located at the northwest corner of the campus. Beginning at the second fence post east of the old road along the large maple trees that are in a north-south line, and bordering our corn demonstration plot on the east, the area extends eastwardly along but 8 feet away from the fence line running parrallel to Route 2 for 1320 feet, then south 240 feet then west parallel and 240 feet distance from the beginning line for 1320 feet to end at the old road and the east boundry of the corn demonstration plot.

RE: Board Meeting April 25, 1977 - Recommended Budget Amendment.

For some time it has been apparent that the budget for gas for the current year is not adequate and this shortage has been mentioned on several occasions. On the assumption that our severe winter is now over, I would now estimate that the deficiency in the gas budget will approximate \$21,000 for the current fiscal year.

I have also reviewed the electricity invoices and I feel there will be some savings in this account, as well as some savings in the contractual account, since we did not divide one room as was previously bid by the architect.

In order to revise the adjustment for the gas allowance I would like to recommend the following budget adjustments for Board approval:

Dear Sirs:

We hereby acknowledge receipt of your communication of April 6, 1977 addressed to George Cole regarding summer school contracts and compensation.

It is our understanding that the issue is whether or not the Board of Trustees has the authority to determine summer school compensation rates without first negotiating the same with the Sauk Valley College Faculty Association.

In an effort to resolve this matter as expeditiously and inexpensively as possible, the Chairman of the Board of Trustees has referred this matter to the Board of Trustees' Grievance Hearing Committee and has authorized the Committee to proceed at Step 3 of the Grievance Procedures. The willingness of the Board to proceed to Step 3 should not, however, be construed as an agreement on the part of the Board to proceed to Step 4 if the matter is not resolved. The Board has expressed concern as to whether or not this is an arbitrable matter and has indicated that it wishes to retain its right to seek a Declaratory Judgment if such action is deemed necessary or appropriate.

We would appreciate your contacting President Cole so that a mutually acceptable time may be arranged for a hearing on this matter.
