MINUTES OF THE SAUK VALLEY COLLEGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

April 10, 1978

The Board of Trustees of Sauk Valley College met in regular meeting at 7:30 p.m. on April 10, 1978 in the Board Room of Sauk Valley College, Rural Route #1, Dixon, Illinois.

Call to Order: Chairman Coplan was absent so Vice-Chairman William Reigle called the meeting to order and the following members answered roll call:

Absent: Ron Coplan

Minutes: It was moved by Member Keefer and seconded by Member Koenig that the Board approve the minutes of the March 27 meeting as presented. Motion voted and carried.

Clerical and Maintenance Freeze Policy: Discussion was held on the recent appointment of a replacement for the Secretary to the Dean of Arts and Sciences. The attached memorandums were presented to the Board from Dean Edison and Dean Bunch. Mr. Edison requested an interpretation from the Board on their recent policy to freeze the hiring of clerical and maintenance personnel. Mr. Reigle explained that the Board would approve the filling of a vacant position from "within" the institution but did not want to hire new people from outside the college at this time. He also said if this proved a hardship in regard to any future vacancies, the administration should ask the Board for approval before hiring a replacement.

It was then moved by Member Keefer and seconded by Member Prescott that the Board approve the transfer of Judy Scribner from the Information Center to Secretary to the Dean of Arts and Sciences at the same rate of pay authorized for Eleanor Ridenhower, the Dean's previous secretary. The position in the Information Center will not be filled at this time. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Fund Transfer:

It was moved by Member Keefer and seconded by Member Pasada that the Board approve the transfer of \$371 from the Criminal Justice, Food Service, and Community Education supplies to the student employee account to provide money to employ a clerical worker for the remainder of the school year. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Data Processing:

President Cole presented memorandums to the Board from Walter Clevenger on the Data Processing budget transfers. These items are to be studied by the Board with action to be taken at the next meeting. Dr. Cole said if any Board member had any questions they should be submitted before the next meeting.

Work Shops:

The Board was reminded of the Evaluation Workshop to be held at Alton and the Board Policy Workshop sponsored by the IASB. Dr. Cole said if any members wanted to attend either of these workshops, they should notify his secretary.

Down Periods:

Member Prescott requested further information and discussion on proposed down periods, four-day weeks and recommendations for pay increases for support staff.

Referendum:

Member Fisher raised a question on the referendum and Dr. Cole gave a status report on the formation of a referendum committee.

Election Canvass:

It was moved by Member Prescott and seconded by Member Fisher that the Board adopt the attached resolution canvassing the results of the Board of Trustees' election held April 8, 1978 in which incumbents William Reigle and Lorna Keefer were re-elected to the Sauk Valley Board. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Adjournment:

Since there was no further business, it was moved by Member Pasada and seconded by Member Powers that the Board of Trustees of Sauk Valley College adjourn sine die. Motion voted and carried.

Temporary Officers:

Dr. Cole was then appointed temporary chairman and Marilyn Vinson temporary secretary.

Dr. Cole called the Board to order and the following members answered roll call:

Chairman:

Dr. Cole said he would receive nominations for Chairman of the Board. Member Keefer moved that William Reigle's name be placed in nomination for Chairman. Since there were no further nominations, Member Keefer moved that nominations be closed and that the secretary cast a unanimous vote for William Reigle. In a roll call vote, all voted aye except for Member Reigle who passed. Motion carried.

Vice-Chairman:

It was moved by Member Fisher that Juanita Prescott be nominated for Vice-Chairman. Since there were no further nominations, Member Fisher moved that nominations be closed and that the secretary cast a unanimous vote for Juanita Prescott. Member Powers seconded this motion. In a roll call vote, all voted aye except Member Prescott who passed. Motion carried.

Secretary:

It was moved by Member Prescott that Lorna Keefer be nominated for Secretary. Since there were no further nominations, it was moved by Member Prescott and seconded by Member Powers that the nominations be closed and that the secretary cast a unanimous ballot for Lorna Keefer. In a roll call vote, all voted aye except Member Keefer who passed. Motion carried.

Treasurer and Depositories:

It was moved by Member Prescott and seconded by Member Powers that the Board reaffirm the appointment of Robert Edison as Treasurer of the Sauk Valley College district and designate all the banks in the college district and Harris Trust and Savings of Chicago as legal depositories for the funds of the college. Motion voted and carried.

Board Policies:

It was moved by Member Keefer and seconded by Member Koenig that all existing policies and regulations of the Board be continued until altered, amended or abolished. Motion voted and carried.

Statement:

Mr. Reigle expressed the appreciation of the Board to Ronald Coplan for his four years of leadership and service as Chairman of the Board. He noted that the Board had agreed to honor Mr. Coplan's request to relinquish the chairmanship, which he has held for four years. Mr. Reigle noted that Mr. Coplan had taken a leadership role through good times and bad times and his efforts have been "beyond the call of duty".

Mr. Reigle went on to say that the Board has taken actions recently that have not been easy. A lot of time has been spent in discussing these actions. All items have been thoroughly studied and properly documented. He noted that members of the Board have been seriously concerned and this has been demonstrated by their prompt attendance at meetings and work sessions over the past months.

He said the college has serious financial problems and further work must be done in the area of student enrollment. He pointed out that the instructional staff is vital to the education of the students, but a strong administrative staff is also needed. He requested students and staff at the college to unite noting that the college has everything to gain by working together. He pointed out that the college would need a strong, dedicated Board and staff effort to pass the referendum.

One and Five-Year Plan:

Dick Holtam presented the Board with their copies of the One and Five-Year Plan to be studied and acted on at the next meeting.

President's Report:

Student Trustee, Barb Pasada, reported on the results of the ASB election held April 7th and April 8th.

President Cole reported on the North Central Visitation meeting he attended with John Sagmoe and Don Foster and also enclosed copies of the committee meeting minutes.

Executive Session:

At 8:30 p.m. it was moved by Member Pasada and seconded by Member Fisher that the Board adjourn to executive session to discuss a grievance and pending litigation. In a roll

call vote the following was recorded: Ayes Members Fisher, Keefer, Powers, Prescott, Reigle, Koenig and Pasada. Motion carried.

Regular Session:

At 9:54 p.m. it was moved by Member Powers and seconded by Member Fisher that the Board return to regular session. In a roll call vote the following was recorded: Ayes Members Fisher, Keefer, Powers, Prescott, Reigle, Koenig and Pasada. Motion carried.

Adjournment:

Since there was no further business, it was moved by Member Prescott and seconded by Member Pasada that the Board adjourn. The next regular meeting will be April 24, 1978 at 7:30 p.m. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Appointment of Secretary for Dean of Arts and Sciences

On March 10, 1978, prior to the Board Meeting on March 13, 1978, I received a letter of resignation from my secretary, Eleanor Ridenhower.

I consulted with you immediately realizing that the Board was considering a policy to freeze all clerical and support staff at the March 13, 1978 meeting. We agreed that consideration for filling this position should be delayed until after the March 13 Board of Trustees meeting.

In order to comply with the policy approved by the Trustees on March 13, 1978, we decided to fill this secretarial position internally. Mrs. Judy Scribner, from the Information Center, has accepted this position. Mrs. Scribner has attained the necessary skills for this office through the Secretarial Science program at Sauk Valley College, and has been highly recommended by Don Foster, Glenn Bailey, and JoAnn Babel, who is the supervisor of the Information Center.

Moving Mrs. Scribner out of the Information Center creates a vacancy in that area. In complying with the Trustees austerity policy, the Information Center position will be covered with workstudy students through July 1, 1978. At that time the position will be reviewed regarding the 1978-79 budget allocations.

In the meantime we are having difficulty in finding and retaining qualified workstudy students with the necessary secretarial skills to work in the Information Center as well as laboratory assistants for work in the Biology, Chemistry, and Physics laboratories.

I recommend that we increase the pay scale to \$3.00 per hour for workstudy secretarial students and laboratory assistants where specific skills are required. Also we should encourage the Secretarial Science Program at SVC to place more secretary interns in various positions where students would qualify for workstudy. This new pay rate would make SVC more competitive with similar positions that are available to students in the community.

RE: New Computer Contract

I would like to recommend that Sauk Valley College enter into a new five-year contract with NCR for a computer system. Below, I will state my reasons:

Why a new system.

Presently, Sauk Valley College is into the third year of a five-year contract with NCR. The present system is at the top of the limit of main memory. As a result, Sauk Valley can not run some of its administrative programs or the educational class programs, when the on-line system is running.

The new system, NCR 8450, will have more memory, will be five times faster, and will have a large top end. This will give SVC the ability to run all our administrative programs and educational classes at the same time as the on-line segment is running.

It is imperative that the on-line system be running at all times.

Why a five-year contract.

By going to a five-year contract, SVC receives a 20% discount.

What effect does this have on the Data Processing Budget.

In FY78, \$3,332.00 was budgeted per month for computer rental. The new system will cost approximately \$3,152.00 per month.

I feel that this system would enhance the computer operation at Sauk Valley College, at no increase in budgeted money.

: Purchase of NCR 796-101 Computer Terminals.
