MINUTES OF THE SAUK VALLEY COLLEGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

October 9, 1978

The Board of Trustees of Sauk Valley College met in regular meeting at 8:00 p.m. on October 9, 1978 in the Board Room of Sauk Valley College, Rural Route #1, Dixon, Illinois.

Call to Order: Chairman Reigle called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m. and the following members answered roll call:

Minutes: It was moved by Member Koenig and seconded by Member Prescott that the Board approve the minutes of the September 25 meeting as presented. Motion voted and carried.

Election Judges: It was moved by Member Prescott and seconded by Member Koenig that the Board adopt the attached resolution appointing alternate judges for the October 17 election. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Grievance #14: It was reported that Grievance #14 involving Ron Happach had been settled.

Solar Greenhouse: The attached memorandum was presented to the Board outlining plans to seek a grant from the U.S. Department of Energy to build (with student labor) a solar greenhouse for the college.

President's Report: Molly Bulfer, student representative, reported on the recent ASB election at which time a Treasurer and four lay members were elected. Dr. Cole reported on committee meeting minutes, the status of the referendum effort, the quarterly report on affirmative action, a report from the Registrar on "Students Who Attend", Faculty Development Committee, EMTA Grant, Community College Bulletin, and the student newspaper, Sauk Talk.

Adjournment: Since there was no further business, it was moved by Member Prescott and seconded by Member Powers that the Board adjourn. The meeting adjourned at 8:33 p.m. Motion voted and carried.

RESOLUTION APPOINTING ALTERNATE JUDGES

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of Community College District Number 506, Counties of Whiteside, Lee, Ogle, Henry, Bureau, and Carroll, State of Illinois, heretofore appointed Judges to serve at the special election called for Tuesday, the 17th day of October, 1978, and

WHEREAS, 22 Judges heretofore appointed have indicated they are unable to serve and it is necessary to appoint replacements, and

WHEREAS, MARILYN VINSON, the designated representative of LORNA KEEFER, Secretary of the Board of Trustees, made a search for qualified electors residing within Precincts 3, 5 and 13 to serve as Judges, but was unable to locate such individuals, and said MARILYN VINSON has filed an Affidavit to this effect with the Board of Trustees,

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Trustees of said Community College District Number 506, finds that there are no Judges available for Precincts 3, 5 and 13 from among the qualified electors residing in said Precincts, and that in order to conduct the election, it is necessary to appoint alternate Judges for those individuals who have indicated they are unable to serve.

The Board further finds that pursuant to authority contained in Section 103-7.8 of Chap. 122, Ill. Rev. Stats., it is necessary and desirable to appoint Judges who are qualified electors in other Precincts within the Community College District, to serve as replacement Judges in Precincts 3, 5 and 13.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the individuals named on the sheet attached hereto and made a part hereof are appointed to serve as replacements for the individuals named to serve in the Precincts shown opposite their respective names.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said Judges be paid in accordance with the schedules established for their respective school district in accordance with the program of compensation heretofore adopted by the Board.

I, MARILYN VINSON, being first duly sworn, on oath state:

1. That I am the duly authorized representative of LORNA KEEFER, Secretary of the Board of Trustees of Sauk Valley College, and as such, I have been advised that twenty-two of the Judges heretofore appointed by the Board of Trustees to serve at the special election called for the 17th day of October, 1978, are unable to serve.

2. That upon receiving this information, I contacted the representatives of the respective school districts from which the Judges were selected, as well as other Judges who were appointed, and I obtained the names of additional electors residing within the respective precincts who are qualified to serve as Judges.

3. That I contacted each of the individuals selected for alternative Judges and was able to secure replacements for individuals who resided within the respective precincts, with the exception of LOIS CASSENS at Precinct No. 3, ELEANOR WASHBURN at Precinct No. 5, and WINONNA BLAKE, at Precinct No. 13.


4. That I made numerous phone calls to representatives of various school districts, other Judges, members of the community, and individuals who served as Judges in previous years.

7. That the names of the individuals who agreed to serve in the Precincts in which they would serve are as follows: BARBARA MOORE, Precinct No. 3; JOANN COMPTON, Precinct No. 5; and CLARA WALGRAVE, Precinct No. 13.

8. That despite my search, I know of no qualified electors residing within the aforesaid Precincts 3, 5 and 13 who are willing to serve as Judges of the special election to be held on October 17, 1978.

OBJECT: APPLICATION GRANT
SOLAR GREENHOUSE

As part of the Midwest appropriate Technology Grant Program, the U.S. Department of Energy is accepting applications for energy-related Grants up to \$50,000.00. The Grant Application must be in Chicago on October 23, 1978.

The Industrial Technical Department, and the Agriculture Department, are in the process of developing a Grant Application for a Solar Greenhouse. It would be erected in the area directly south of the present Agriculture Department.

Would you please inform the Board of Trustees, at their October 9th, 1978, meeting, of our intentions to apply for a \$45,000.00 Grant. By using the Grant monies and by involving the students in the Industrial Technical and Agriculture Curricula, we will not be requiring any additional funds from the College.

Specifically, we are asking for a Grant to develop a demonstration Solar Greenhouse which would provide for the growing of food products and other plants, as well as a supplemental source for heating family dwellings. Tests will be performed on the efficiency of various Solar collectors and storage devices. Sauk Valley College is in a unique position to integrate the construction of this Greenhouse into our many course offerings.

Mr. Norman Spencer and Mr. Ronald Happach have agreed to function as Co-Chairmen for this project. The Concrete Technology students in our Construction Program could pour the concrete necessary for the structure, as well as the brick work involved. The Electrical Wiring class could do all of the wiring as part of their laboratory experience. The Drafting students could prepare the detailed construction drawings. The Heating and Air Conditioning students would oversee the selection of Solar panels and storage devices.

The structure will be approximately 25 ft. wide, and, 75 ft. long and utilize movable Solar panels that can function as Solar collectors and, also as insulated walls.

Aesthetically, the building can be designed to blend into the existing College structure. It will be erected in sections that are partitioned so that a reduced portion of the Greenhouse will be utilized in the severe winter months.

Heat-storage areas of the entire structure, however, will be used to return heat to this limited section of the Greenhouse. The excess heat transferred to the main College building, during the Spring and Fall, will offset any additional heat that may be required in the days when the sun does not shine for long periods of time.

Mr. Norman Spencer and I will be available at the Board meeting, if there are any specific questions. The Board will be given many opportunities to review the proposed structure, if the Grant is received.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT NUMBER 506 COUNTIES OF WHITESIDE, LEE, OGLE, HENRY, BUREAU AND CARROLL STATE OF ILLINOIS

NOTICE is hereby given that a special election has been called and will be held in and for Community College District Number 506, Counties of Whiteside, Lee, Ogle, Henry, Bureau and Carroll, State of Illinois, on Tuesday, the 17th day of October, 1978, at which election there shall be submitted to the legal voters of said Community College District Number 506, the following propositions:

PROPOSITION TO INCREASE MAXIMUM ANNUAL EDUCATIONAL TAX RATE

Shall the maximum annual tax rate for educational purposes of Community College District Number 506, Counties of Whiteside, Lee, Ogle, Henry, Bureau and Carroll, State of Illinois, be increased and established at .16 per cent on the full, fair cash value of taxable property as equalized or assessed by the Department of Local Government Affairs, instead of .12 per cent, the maximum rate otherwise applicable to the next taxes to be extended for said purposes?

- The approximate amount of educational taxes extendible under the maximum rate now in force in said Community College District is \$741,201;
- The approximate amount of educational taxes extendible under the proposed increased rate is the sum of \$988,268.

PROPOSITION TO INCREASE MAXIMUM ANNUAL BUILDING TAX RATE

Community College District Number 506, located within Townships 21 and 22 North, Range 7 East of the 4th P.M., Whiteside County, Illinois, and Range 8 East of the 4th P.M., Lee County, Illinois, commonly known as Sterling and Jordan Townships in Whiteside County, and Palmyra Township in Lee County, which lies East of the center line of Locust Street and the center line of Route 88 as extended North and South in and from the City of Sterling, Illinois, and North of a line described as follows: the center line of LeFevre Road extended East from Locust Street to Freeport Road, South on the center line of Freeport Road to Illinois State Highway 2, commonly known as East Lincolnway and East on the center line of Illinois State Highway 2, to the East line of the District.

POLLING PLACE: Sterling High School, Southeast Entryway, 1603 Fifth Avenue, Sterling, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 6

Shall consist of all that part of Community College District Number 506 which is located within Townships 20, 21 and 22 North, Range 6 East of the 4th P.M., Whiteside County, Illinois, commonly known as Lyndon, Hopkins and Genesee Townships.

POLLING PLACE: Galt Junior High School, Galt, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 7

Shall consist of all that part of Rock Falls Township High School District Number 301, Whiteside and Lee Counties, Illinois, lying in the County of Lee, State of Illinois, all within Community College District Number 506.

POLLING PLACE: Nelson School, Nelson, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 8

Shall consist of all that part of Rock Falls Township High School District Number 301, Whiteside and Lee Counties, Illinois, lying within the County

City Hall, Amboy, Illinois.
PRECINCT NO. 14
Shall consist of all that part of Amboy Community Unit School District Number 272, Lee County, Illinois, which is located within that portion of Townships 19 and 20 North, Range Eleven East of the 4th P.M., Lee County, Illinois, commonly known as Sublette and Lee Center Townships, all within Community College District Number 506.

POLLING PLACE: Ellice Dinges Elementary School, Sublette, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 15

Shall consist of all that part of Amboy Community Unit School District Number 272, Lee County, Illinois, which is located within Township 19 North, Ranges 9 and 10 East of the 4th P.M., Lee County, Illinois, commonly known as East Grove and May Townships, all within Community College District Number 506.

POLLING PLACE: Maytown Elementary School, Maytown, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 16

Shall consist of all that part of Amboy Community Unit School District Number 272, Lee County, Illinois, which is located within Township 20 North, Range 9 East of the 4th P.M., Lee County, Illinois, commonly known as Marion Township, within Community College District Number 506.

Shall consist of all that part of Amboy Community Unit School District Number 272, Lee County, Illinois, which is located within that portion of Township 21 North, Ranges 9 and 10 East of the 4th P.M., Lee County, Illinois, commonly known as South Dixon and Nachusa Townships, all within Community College District Number 506.

Shall the maximum annual tax rate for building purposes of Community College District Number 506, Counties of Whiteside, Lee, Ogle, Henry, Bureau and Carroll, State of Illinois, be increased and established at .08 per cent upon the full, fair cash value of taxable property as equalized or assessed by the Department of Local Government Affairs, instead of .03 per cent, the maximum rate otherwise applicable to the next taxes to be extended for said purposes?

(a) An estimate of the approximate amount of building taxes extendible under the maximum tax rate now in force for said Community College District Number 506 is \$185,300.

(b) An estimate of the approximate amount of building taxes extendible under the proposed increased tax rate is the sum of \$494,134.

That for the purpose of said special election the following precincts and polling places are hereby established:

POLLING PLACE: Prophetstown-Lyndon Community Unit School District No. 3, Unit Office, 318 Lincoln Street, Prophetstown, Illinois.

PRECINCT NO. 3

Shall consist of all that part of Community Unit School District No. 5, lying within Community College District Number 506, located within Township 21 North, Range 7 East of the 4th P.M., Whiteside County, Illinois, and Range 8 East of the 4th P.M., Lee County, Illinois, commonly known as Sterling Township in Whiteside County and Palmyra Township in Lee County, which lies East of the center line of Locust Street and the center line of Route 88 in the City of Sterling, Illinois, and South of a line described as follows: The center line of LeFevre Road extended East from Locust Street to Freeport Road, South on the center line of Freeport Road to Illinois State Highway 2, commonly known as East Lincolnway, and East on the center line of Illinois State Highway 2 to the East line of the District.
