

MINUTES OF THE SAUK VALLEY COLLEGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

April 23, 1979

The Board of Trustees of Sauk Valley College met in regular meeting at 7:30 p.m. on April 23, 1979 in the Board Room of Sauk Valley College, R.R. #1, Dixon, Illinois.

Call to Order: Chairman Reigle called the meeting to order and the following members answered roll call:

Vote Canvass of Trustees Election: The Board was presented the Vote Canvass of the Trustee Election held April 14, 1979 in which Juanita Prescott and John Fassler were elected to the Sauk Valley Board.

Temporary Chairman: The Board appointed George Cole to act as temporary chairman to re-organize the Board. Dr. Cole then appointed Judy Scribner to serve as temporary secretary.

Call to Order: Dr. Cole called the meeting to order and the following members answered roll call:

Nominations: Dr. Cole noted that nominations would now be received for Chairman of the Board of Trustees.

Chairman: It was moved by Member Koenig and seconded by Member Keefer that the name of William Reigle be placed in nomination for chairman, that nominations be closed, and that the secretary cast a unanimous ballot for William Reigle. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Vice-Chairman: It was moved by Member Fisher and seconded by Member Keefer that the name of Juanita Prescott be placed in nomination for Vice-Chairman of the Board, that nominations be closed, and that the secretary cast a unanimous ballot for Juanita Prescott. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Secretary: It was moved by Member Prescott and seconded by Member Koenig that the name of Lorna Keefer be placed in nomination for Secretary of the Board, that nominations be closed, and that the secretary cast a unanimous ballot for Lorna Keefer. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Treasurer: It was moved by Member Pasada and seconded by Member Prescott that the Board reaffirm the appointment of Robert Edison as Treasurer of Sauk Valley College. Motion voted and carried.

Depositories: It was moved by Member Prescott and seconded by Member Fisher that the Board designate all the banks in the college district and Harris Trust and Savings of Chicago as legal depositories for the funds of the college. Motion voted and carried.

Meetings: It was moved by Member Keefer and seconded by Member Prescott that the Board designate the second and fourth Mondays of each month as the regular meeting dates at 7:30 p.m. except for daylight savings time when the meetings will be held at 8:00 p.m. Motion voted and carried.

Board Policies: It was moved by Member Prescott and seconded by Member Fisher that all existing policies and regulations of the Board be continued until altered, amended or abolished. Motion voted and carried.

Welcome: Chairman Reigle welcomed John Fassler as a new member of the Board and congratulated Juanita Prescott on her re-election.

Minutes: It was moved by Member Keefer and seconded by Member Koenig that the Board approve the minutes of the April 9 meeting as presented. Motion voted and carried.

Treasurer's Report: It was moved by Member Prescott and seconded by Member Powers that the Board approve the Treasurer's Report as presented. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Bills Payable: It was moved by Member Powers and seconded by Member Koenig that the Board approve the bills in the following amounts:
Educational Fund: \$291,877.37
Building Fund: 32,563.10
Bond and Interest #1: 460.94
In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Payroll: It was moved by Member Fisher and seconded by Member Koenig that the Board approve the payroll of March 30 in the amount of \$104,955.32 and the payroll of April 15 in the amount of \$150,722.03. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Work Study Fund Transfer: It was moved by Member Koenig and seconded by Member Fisher that the Board approve work study fund transfers so that as much work study money as possible will be utilized in order to maximize available money next year. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Resolution on Judges for Referendum: It was moved by Member Keefer and seconded by Member Koenig that the Board approve the Resolution for Judges for the May 10 Referendum. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Affirmative Action Quarterly Report: The Board reviewed the Affirmative Action Quarterly Report. Don Foster answered questions Board members had regarding Section 504 Compliance for Handicapped Persons.

Maintenance Vacancy: It was moved by Member Prescott and seconded by Member Koenig that the Board approve filling a vacancy in the Maintenance area created by the resignation of Bert Cornstubble. The job is to be advertised as Boiler/Security Person. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Veteran's Clerical Vacancy: It was moved by Member Koenig and seconded by Member Pasada that the Board approve filling a vacancy in the Veteran's Office created by the resignation of Elizabeth Keller. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Snow Removal
Refund:

Dean Edison reported that the college received \$2,281.00 as a refund for the snow emergency declared last January. This amount represents the maximum allowable under the program and represented two-thirds of a total cost of \$3,420.00.

Income Tax
Deductions:

Dean Edison presented a report which was distributed to all faculty members explaining income taxes withheld from retroactive pay received by the faculty after the contract settlement of April 26, 1979.

One and Five
Year Plan:

Dean Strickland distributed the One and Five Year Plan to Board members. This matter was tabled until the next meeting.

President's Report:

Barb Pasada, Student Trustee, reported that there had not been a meeting of the Associated Students Board because of spring vacation. Discussion was held on the possibility of Sauk hosting the annual meeting of Student Trustees next year. Ms. Pasada will get more details for further discussion.

Dr. Cole introduced James Barber, Assistant Dean of Adult and Continuing Education, who gave a lecture/slide presentation on the Community Services Program at SVC.

Executive Session:

At 8:48 it was moved by Member Fisher and seconded by Member Koenig that the Board adjourn to executive session at the request of the President to discuss a personnel matter.

Regular Session:


At 9:31 p.m. it was moved by Member Fisher and seconded by Member Pasada that the Board return to regular session. Motion carried.




