The Board commended Dean Robert Edison and the Building and Grounds staff for the energy savings over the past years as outlined in the Energy Profile for Community Colleges (attached).

Tax
Abatement:

Mayor Kuhlemier from the city of Rock Falls was present at the meeting and told the Board that the city was aggressively pursuing new industry as a means of creating new jobs to alleviate the high unemployment rate of the area. He went on further to explain that

other communities have been competing with Rock Falls and these communities offer (as one incentive) the abatement of certain taxes against property of the industry. He said that the city was asking the various local taxing bodies to consider the concept of using abatement of taxes for new industries who are relocating within Whiteside County and also for expansion of existing industries presently located within the county.

After further discussion, it was moved by Member Mandrgoc and seconded by Member Groharing that the Board approve the idea in concept with specific requests to be acted upon when they are presented at future meetings. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Mayor Kuhlemier thanked the Board for their time and their favorable action.

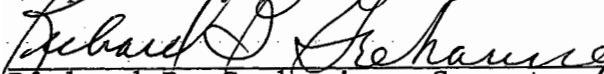
Adjournment:

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF TAX
ABATEMENT

We have received a request from the business and governmental bodies of Rock Falls to adopt the attached resolution.

Mayor Kuhlemier of Rock Falls will be present at the meeting to provide information and answers to questions.

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF TAX ABATEMENTS

WHEREAS, the area of Whiteside County and Sterling and Rock Falls are currently suffering ill effects from the economic recession afflicting America, with effects of extremely high unemployment, and

WHEREAS, the City Government of the City of Rock Falls has been aggressively pursuing the relocation to the Rock Falls, Sterling and Whiteside County area of new industry as a means of creating new jobs to alleviate the high unemployment rate of the area, and

WHEREAS, it has become apparent that other states and communities have also been competing with the City of Rock Falls for the enticement of new industry and that in their dealings with new industry, that other areas are offering as one incentive to any new industrial corporation the abatement of certain taxes against property of that industry, and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of all of the citizens of Whiteside County and Sterling and Rock Falls that industrial development organizations be able to compete effectively with other states in negotiations to entice industries to relocate to this area,

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by Sauk Valley College Board of Trustees that this body, acting by and on behalf of the Citizens it was elected to represent, does hereby support the concept of the use of abatement of taxes for new industries who are relocating within Whiteside County and Sterling and Rock Falls, Illinois and for expansion of existing industries presently located within Whiteside County and Sterling and Rock Falls, Illinois, and IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that this body expresses its willingness and desire to consider favorably any specific proposal for the abatement of taxes for any new industry at the time that such proposal may be presented to this Board, it being understood that any such proposal shall conform to the requirements of Section 643 of Chapter 120 of Illinois Revised Statutes, and this body further finding that this Resolution is a statement of intention and support for the concept of tax abatements, but that it is not binding upon this body as to any specific proposal that may be presented in the future, this body specifically reserving unto itself the right to consider any proposal for tax abatements at the time that the same shall be presented.

103.01 Trustee Election

The election of the members of the board shall be held each year, at the time and in the manner provided by law and each member shall be elected for a term of ³⁶ years unless otherwise provided herein. Each member must on the date of the election be a citizen of the United States, of the age of 18 years or over, and a resident of the State and the territory which on the date of the election is included in the college district for at least one year immediately preceding the election. Removal of residence from the district by any member constitutes a resignation from and creates a vacancy on the board.

Whenever a vacancy occurs, the remaining members shall fill the vacancy until the next annual election. The successor must have the same type of qualifications as his predecessor. If the remaining members fail so to act within 30 days after the vacancy occurs, the ^{regional} ~~county~~ superintendent of schools ~~who conducted the election for the establishment of the college district shall call an election within 30 days to~~ ^{shall} fill the vacancy for the unexpired term. A vacancy on the college board occurs upon the happening of any event which creates a vacancy on a board of trustees under the relevant provision of law.

107.01 Organization and Meeting of the Board of Trustees

will meet on or before the first Monday in December (or the first
Board ~~shall~~ certify the election results and organize Monday
by electing a Chairman, Vice-Chairman, and a Secretary, ^{following an} election) to

on the fourth Monday of each calendar month except when
changes are announced in advance. Meetings will be
scheduled for 7:30 p.m. unless otherwise announced in
advance.

108.01 Duties and Responsibilities of Board Officers

- A) Chairman: The Chairman shall preside at all meetings and shall perform such duties as are imposed upon that office by law or by action of the Board. ~~The Chairman of the Board during the fall semester of each year shall sign all of the diplomas for commencement being held for that academic year.~~
- B) Vice-Chairman: The Vice-Chairman shall serve in the Chairman's absence.
- C) If the Chairman and Vice-Chairman are absent from any meeting or refuse to perform their duties, a Chairman pro-tempore shall be appointed by the Board from among their numbers.
- D) Clerical duties for the Board are performed by a support staff person employed at the college who is called the Secretary to the Board. This person performs the following duties:

Attends all meetings of the Board of Trustees and records all official business of the Board. ~~These duties include typing the rough draft of the minutes, presenting it for approval to the President, Assistant to the President for Public Information, and to the Dean of Business Services. The minutes are then distributed to all full-time staff, board members and the foundation.~~ *Represents the Board in working with local election officials in all Board elections a*

~~The Board election held every other year (also any referendums) is also a responsibility of the Secretary. This will include ordering supplies, accepting petitions, arranging for legal notices, ordering ballots. These duties are to be performed within the legal limits specified and are outlined in detail in the Secretary's job description. The Board Secretary should be free from other responsibilities in order to work the evening, holiday and weekend hours sometimes required. In summation, the Secretary to the Board is charged with the responsibility of all Board elections and keeping an accurate and true record of all Board proceedings as required by law.~~ *referenda*

109.01 Duties and Responsibilities of the Board of Trustees

- A) Select, appoint and establish the salary and conditions of employment of the President of the College.
- B) Determine the broad general policies for governing the college. Present yearly, short and long term direction for the college, to the President.
- C) Approve the annual budget.
- D) Give prior approval of all contractual agreements.
- E) Act upon the recommendation of the President for the appointment and subsequent employment status of employees in accordance with established personnel policies.
- F) Approve rates of compensation for regular full-time and/or part-time employees and annually review all salary schedules.
- G) Act upon recommendations of the President on site and physical plant development and utilization.
- H) Act upon recommendations of the President on matters of major repair and maintenance of buildings, grounds and equipment.
- I) Act upon competitive bids for supplies and equipment ~~\$2,500~~ ^{\$5,000} and for construction and/or repairs in excess of ~~\$2,500~~. All vendors to have affirmative action and OSHA programs.
- J) Approve curricular offerings of the College upon the recommendation of the President.
- K) Approve the annual Administrative and Academic Calendar of the College.
- L) Act upon the recommendations of the President in all matters of policy pertaining to the welfare of the college.

116.01 Board Ethics

Board ethics are not intended to encompass the full responsibility and good judgement expected of a trustee, its intent is one of general direction:

- 1) Regular attendance is necessary. If one is unable to attend a meeting, the Chairperson should be notified. Trustees unable to attend meetings for an extended period are asked to consider resignation.
- 2) Packets are to be studied before the scheduled board meeting.
 - a) Questions and comments are encouraged and each trustee has the responsibility to participate in discussion.
 - b) ~~Old and new business on~~ The agenda provides an opportunity for each trustee to pursue concerns and questions.
- 3) It is generally assumed that from time to time trustees will disagree on an issue. All discussion should take place at the meeting. When a consensus has been reached, the full board will accept the decision of the majority.
- 4) The Chairperson should be aware of the interests, concerns and talents of each trustee. Every attempt should be made to include them fully in the Boards activities.

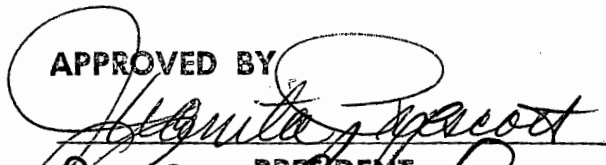
