MINUTES OF THE SAUK VALLEY COLLEGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

November 18, 1985

The Board of Trustees of Sauk Valley College met at Emerald Hill Country Club on November 18, 1985 at 5:30 p.m. to conduct an Orientation for the new Board members.

Orientation: Dr. Garner welcomed the following members to the Orientation Session:

The Board then adjourned to the college to start the regular meeting.

Call to Order: At 7:40 p.m. in Room 2K2 of the college, President Garner called the meeting to order and the following members answered roll call:

Chair: Dr. Garner then called for nominations for Chair of the Board of Trustees. It was moved by Member Andersen and seconded by Member Wolf that the name of Richard Groharing be placed in nomination for Chair. It was moved by Member Wolf and seconded by Member Simpson that nominations be closed. Motion voted and carried.

Chair: In a roll call vote on the motion to elect Richard Groharing as Chair, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Vice-Chair: The names of Ed Andersen and William Simpson were put in nomination for Vice-Chair. It was then moved and seconded that nominations be closed. Motion voted and carried. On a roll call vote, Ed Andersen was elected Vice-Chair by a 5 to 2 vote.

Secretary: The name of William Simpson was put in nomination for Secretary. Member Wolf moved and Member Groharing seconded that nominations be closed. Motion voted and carried. In a roll call vote to elect William Simpson as Secretary, all voted aye. Motion carried. Dr. Garner then turned the meeting over to Chair Groharing.

Treasurer: It was moved by Member Simpson and seconded by Member Wolf that the Board reaffirm the appointment of Robert Edison as Treasurer of the Sauk Valley College district. Motion voted and carried.

Attorney: It was moved by Member Simpson and seconded by Member Wolf that the Board reaffirm the appointment of Ward, Murray, Pace and Johnson as the law firm for the college district. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Depositories: It was moved by Member Simpson and seconded by Member Borrel that the Board designate all banks in the college district and the Harris Trust and Savings in Chicago as legal depositories for the funds of the college. Discussion was held on the possibility of depositing funds in area savings and loan institutions. In a roll call vote, the following was recorded: Ayes: Members Andersen, McDonald, Peterson, Simpson, Wolf, Groharing and Borrel. Nays: 0. Abstain: Member Berrettini. Motion carried.

Meetings: It was moved by Member Andersen and seconded by Member Simpson that the Board continue to meet on the 4th Monday of every month, with the time to be changed to 7:00 p.m. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

ICCTA: It was decided that the ICCTA representative will be appointed at a future meeting.

Policies: It was moved by Member Andersen and seconded by Member McDonald that all existing policies and regulations of the Board be continued until altered, amended or abolished. Motion voted and carried.

Minutes: It was moved by Member Simpson and seconded by Member Andersen that the Board approve the minutes of the November 12th meeting as presented. Motion voted and carried.

Treasurers Report: It was moved by Member Simpson and seconded by Member Peterson that the Board approve the Treasurer's Report as presented. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Disbursements: It was moved by Member Andersen and seconded by Member Simpson that the Board approve the following disbursements:

In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Payroll: It was moved by Member Simpson and seconded by Member Borrel that the Board approve the payroll of October 31 in the amount of \$205,570.80. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Site and Construction: The attached annual report on Site and Construction expenditures was presented to the Board as an information item.

Liability Insurance: It was moved by Member Andersen and seconded by Member Peterson that the Board approve paying the premium of \$99 to General Casualty Company for a personal umbrella liability policy for Donald Foster. In a roll call vote the following was recorded: Ayes: Members Andersen, Berrettini, McDonald, Peterson, Simpson, Groharing and Borrel. Nays: Member Wolf. Motion carried.

Bids: It was moved by Member Peterson and seconded by Member Andersen that the Board accept the low bid of Dixon Motors in the amount of \$12,880 for a 1986 - 15 passenger Van for Student Activities. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Bids:

It was moved by Member Simpson and seconded by Member Peterson that the Board approve the low bid of Diesel Injection Service for a Hartridge Test Bench in the amount of \$6,545. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

It was moved by Member Andersen and seconded by Member Peterson that the Board approve the low bid of Viking Builders in the amount of \$104,900 to remodel the Data Processing Center. The total project cost shall not exceed \$120,000 with funding to come from the Site and Construction Fund. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

1986 Tax Levy:

It was moved by Member Simpson and seconded by Member Andersen that the Board approve the attached resolution for the 1986 Certificate of Tax Levy as presented. Motion voted and carried.

Grants:

It was moved by Member Peterson and seconded by Member McDonald that the Board authorize the administration to submit a grant application for a Strengthening Grant of up to \$200,000, along with the Assurance Form as required, with the college to be designated as the recipient of the grant, if awarded. Also, authorize the administration to submit a grant application for an Endowment Grant (with the Assurance Form as required) with the SVC Foundation to be designated as the recipient. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Donation:

It was moved by Member McDonald and seconded by Member Peterson that the Board accept the donation of Autodesk, Inc. of California of four copies of AutoCad 2.1 software with ADE 2 and 3. This will be used in our computer aided drafting program. Motion voted and carried.

Reports:

Student Trustee Borrel reported that the Student Senate had sponsored a very successful Bloodmobile visit with the Red Cross. She said that a food drive will be held for needy families and that the Senate was planning a Turkey Give-a-way.

Dick Groharing reported that he had not attended the ICCTA meeting in November.

Reports:

Mr. Groharing reminded the Board of the New Trustees Workshop held by the ICCTA in January. If Board members would like to attend they can make their own reservations or ask Mrs. Vinson to do the same.

There was no report on the Foundation. In regard to the status of the Incubator, the Board requested copies of the Incubator Board minutes.

Tax Abatement:

Dr. Garner told the Board that he had received a tax abatement request from a group in Dixon. It was the consensus of the Board that the administration follow the Abatement Policy and forward more information to the Trustees when it becomes available.

Christmas
Downtime:

It was moved by Member Simpson and seconded by Member Wolf that the Board approve the addition of one holiday to the Christmas Downtime period of December 20th through the first of January, 1986. This approval is for one year only. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Dr. Garner also reported on Bob Matter's illustrations in the Anthropology workbook, the Curriculum Innovation plan, current enrollment, and a letter from Beling and Associates indicating that all energy items had been completed at the college.

Evaluation:

Dr. Garner reminded the Board that it was time for his semi-annual evaluation. It was the consensus of the Board that they would meet early at 5:45 p.m. before the next meeting of December 16, 1985.

Adjournment:

Since the scheduled business was concluded, it was moved by Member McDonald and seconded by Member Peterson that the Board adjourn. The next regular meeting will be 7:00 p.m. December 16, as the regular meeting of December 23 has been cancelled. Motion voted and carried.

The meeting adjourned at 9:45 p.m.

AUTHORIZATION TO SUBMIT GRANT PROPOSALS

The Higher Education Act Title III, also known as the Institutional Aid program, awards grants to eligible institutions to assist them to develop academic, management and other programs which will strengthen the institution.

SVC is eligible to apply for these grants and propose to submit applications for two types of awards.

1. Strengthening Grant

This is a three year grant of up to \$200,000 per year. No matching funds are required. We propose to structure the grant to provide for two major activities:

- a. Integration of computers into instructional programs in all disciplines where it is appropriate. Funds would be used for equipment, software, curriculum development and staff development.
- b. Developing a comprehensive management information system. Funds would be used for equipment, software, staff development, and consultant assistant.

2. Endowment Grant

This grant would match, on a dollar for dollar basis, new endowment funds that are raised locally within

an eighteen month period. The proposed amount of the grant is \$150,000. The Sauk Valley College Foundation would be designated the grant recipient. Because the endowment award formula gives extra points to colleges who already have a strengthening grant, it is not highly likely that this grant will be obtainable this year. However, the college wishes to submit an application in order to determine its potential point score.

Regulations for the Institutional Aid Program requiring that the college's governing board authorize the filing of these applications and the Assurance forms attached.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the administration be authorized to submit the two proposed grant applications with the accompanying assurances as required.
