August 31, 1987

The Board of Trustees of Sauk Valley Community College met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. on August 31, 1987 in the third floor Board Room of Sauk Valley Community College, 173 Illinois Route 2, Dixon, Illinois.

Call to Order: Chair Groharing called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and the following members answered roll call:

Minutes: It was moved by Member Simpson and seconded by Member Peterson that the Board approve the minutes of the July 27 meeting. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried. Student Trustee Peck advisory vote: aye.

Treasurer's Report: It was moved by Member Andersen and seconded by Member Simpson that the Board approve the Treasurer's Report as presented. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried. Student Trustee Peck advisory vote: aye.

Bills Payable: It was moved by Member Peterson and seconded by Member Simpson that the Board approve bills in the following amounts:

Public Hearing: Chair Groharing said a Public Hearing would now be held on the 1987-88 budget. There were no comments or inquiries from any citizens.

1987-88 Budget: It was moved by Member Andersen and seconded by Member Peterson that the 1987-88 budget be approved as presented. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried. Student Trustee Peck advisory vote: aye.

Sign Landscaping: It was moved by Member Berrettini and seconded by Member Simpson that the Board approve an expenditure of up to \$2,100 from the Site and Construction Fund to landscape the area by the new sign. In a roll call vote, the following was recorded: Ayes: Members Berrettini, Peterson, Simpson, Wolf, and Groharing. Nays: Members Andersen and McDonald. Motion carried. Student Trustee Peck advisory vote: aye.

Working Cash Fund: It was moved by Member Berrettini and seconded by Member Andersen that the Board approve the attached resolution to permit the borrowing of funds from the Working Cash Fund to the Education Fund and the Building Fund for the remainder of FY88 and the first portion of FY89. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Student Trustee Peck advisory vote: aye.

Tuition Income: The attached report on tuition income data for the Spring semester of 1987 was presented to the Board as an information item.

Executive Session: At 7:40 p.m. it was moved by Member Peterson and seconded by Member Berrettini that the Board adjourn to executive session to discuss the appointment, employment or dismissal of an employee. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Student Trustee Peck advisory vote: aye.

Regular Session: At 8:10 p.m. the Board returned to regular session.

Resignations: It was moved by Member Andersen and seconded by Member Peterson that the Board accept the resignations of David Lovekin, John O'Banion and Ken McLean. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Student Trustee Peck advisory vote: aye.

Temporary Faculty Appointment:	It was moved by Member Andersen and seconded by Member Simpson that the Board approve the temporary appointment of Gary Carlson to a full-time faculty position for the fall semester, effective August 21, 1987. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried. Student Trustee Peck advisory vote: aye.
Part-time Faculty List:	It was moved by Member Simpson and seconded by Member McDonald that the Board approve the list of part-time faculty and authorize the administration to hire from this list as needed for the 1987-88 academic year. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried. Student Trustee Peck advisory vote: aye.
Administrative Appointment:	It was moved by Member Berrettini and seconded by Member Simpson that the Board approve the appointment of William Weathers as Business Manager, under the conditions outlined and a negotiable starting date. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried. Student Trustee advisory vote: aye.
RAMP:	It was moved by Member Simpson and seconded by Member Berrettini that the attached Resource Allocation and Management Plan be approved and submitted to the ICCB. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried. Student Trustee advisory vote: aye.
Building Deficiencies:	Architect Don Turner and a Capital Development Board representative (Lloyd Holldorf) were in attendance at the meeting. Mr. Turner made a report to the Board on the status of the construction defects project and also reviewed the condition of the college roof and proposed remedies.
Architect:	It was moved by Member Andersen and seconded by Member Peterson that the Board designate Donald A. Turner of Turner-Witt Associates as the college architect of record and that he begin the process of re-roofing the college facilities using Life, Health, and Safety Act funds. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried. Student Trustee Peck advisory vote: aye.
Reports:	Student Trustee Peck reported on Pow-Wow Day to be held on September 9th on the back lawn and the Open House to be held by the Student Senate on September 15 and 16.

Dr. Behrendt reported on the Foundation meeting held on August 18th and said there would be a survey sent to Foundation Directors on the possibility of having Foundation meetings more often than four times a year. He said the next scheduled meeting will be held on November 17.

Departure:

Member Robert Wolf left the meeting at 9 p.m.

Chair Groharing reminded the Trustees of the September ICCTA meeting on the 11th and 12th in Springfield and reported that he had been named Chair of the State Relations Committee.

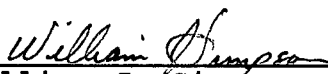
President Behrendt reported on the Trustee election to be held on November 3 at which time two trustees will be elected for six year terms, and that Richard Groharing and William Yemm had filed nominating petitions. He also reported on fall enrollment which is up from last year (about 8.5%); that the Foundation had extended their appreciation to the Board for the Board resolution; that the college had received their Certificate of Recognition from the ICCB; that our Small Business Center received their full award of \$18,500; that the college had received another Energy Management Award for the 1987 year; that the Student Services division had realigned duties involving Tom Breed and Jan Woodhouse; that as of this date there were 73 applications for the vacant Dean of Instruction position; that the professional staff retreat at Lorado Taft had been successful; that annual reports for the Business Office, Data Processing, Public Information and Office of Planning and Development had been distributed; and that the new Fall Sports Guide was distributed.

A period of time shall be set aside at this meeting as the time for the "Public Hearing" during which time the Board will receive comments or inquiries from any citizens present.

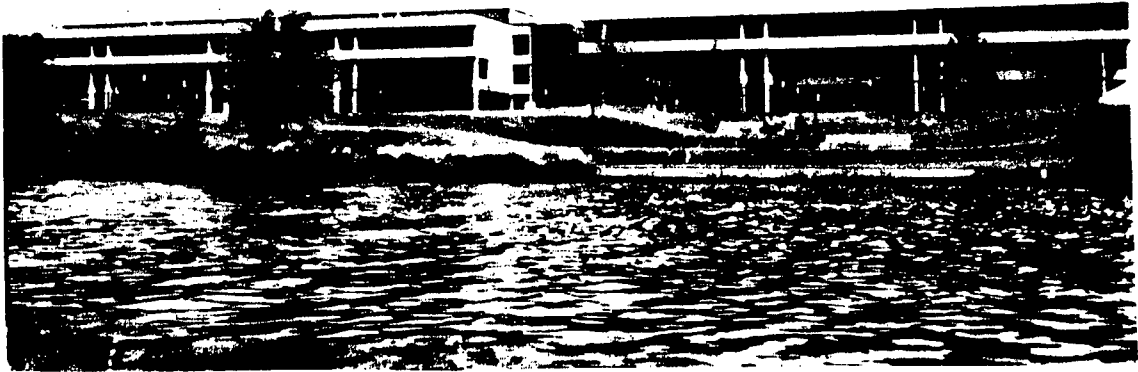

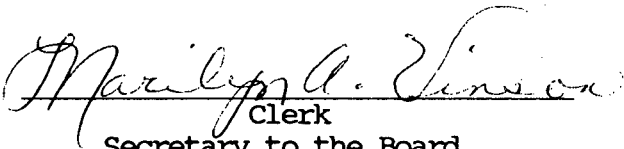
CERTIFICATION OF BUDGET

INFORMATION

Public Act 83-881 amends Section 643 of the Revenue Act, and provides that the governing body of each taxing district, including any township, shall file with the County Clerk, within 30 days of its adoption, a certified copy of its budget and appropriation ordinance. In addition, the chief fiscal officer (treasurer) must certify an estimate of revenues, by source, anticipated to be received by the taxing district in the following fiscal year.

The Act goes on to provide that failure to file the required documents shall authorize the County Clerk to refuse to extend the tax levy imposed by the taxing district. However, it also states that the County Clerk's refusal to extend taxes may continue only until such documents are filed and after the clerk has given timely notice of such failure to file to the taxing district. Nevertheless, while failure to file would not appear to cause any irreparable problem, it is advisable to file in a timely fashion so that the chances of future problems are eliminated.

In order to assist Illinois officials in complying with P.A. 83-881, a form of Certification of Budget and Appropriation Ordinance in Accordance with P.A. 83-881 is on the opposite side of this page.

STATUS REPORT OF WORK TO DATE

1. Architect/Engineer approved by CDB Board on January 15, 1987.
2. After reviewing previous reports, the A/E met with the College Administration, Mr. Richard Behrendt, Mr. Robert Edison, and Mr. Norman Welch, on January 21, 1987, to review the scope of the project and offer different alternatives of facing the concrete and repair of the concrete flat work and retaining walls.
3. Prepared a Proposal Scope of Project (copy attached) for review by CDB on February 4, 1987.
4. Had a meeting on February 25, 1987, at Testing Engineer's office in Dixon with Bob Leslie, Bob Krause (Wiss, Janney, Elstner Associates) and Lloyd Holdorf of CDB to discuss testing procedures in order to test for the degree of corrosion of the structural concrete reinforcing steel.
5. Employed Western Waterproofing of Springfield, Illinois and Builders Sales & Service Company of Moline, Illinois. Western Waterproofing used the epoxy injection method and the chemical injection method to test the best method to seal the concrete cracks. Results of this test indicated the epoxy injection method as the best and least time consuming method to use. In addition, they sealed two windows with a polyurethane sealant. Builders Sales & Service Company applied a synthetic plaster (Dryvit) over cracks which had been sealed and also minor cracks not sealed to determine the amount of movement which the synthetic plaster would accept. The installation of the synthetic plaster was installed at the north side of the College building so that it would be subject to the most severe weather conditions and also for constant review by the College Board and Administration. This work was accomplished in the middle of April.
6. On April 14 and 15, 1987 the A/E made an extensive investigation of the problem of the settlement of sidewalks, masonry retaining wall deterioration and settlement, foundation leaks, and other related problems. From this investigation we have established total areas and recommended methods for correction. During summer, Charles Smith, TWA field observer, has been carefully reviewing the quantity of structural concrete cracks in order to show them on construction documents.

7. Along with Mr. Holldorf, our original intention was to separate the project into two phases.

The first phase was to include the correction of the masonry retaining walls, flat concrete work, loading dock, column bases, and correct basement leaks. This work was originally scheduled to be started in July, 1987, but funds were not released.

The second phase is to consist of repair of structural concrete cracks, installation of facing material on structural concrete columns, beams, sun screens, and the resealing of the glass curtain wall. This work was scheduled to be started in the spring of 1988. We felt this work should be delayed in order to give the College Board and Administration adequate time to review the test results of the facing material.

Since funds were not released when originally expected, it will now be necessary to bid both phases of the work at one time.

8. Funds for this project are scheduled to be released in January, 1988. Because of the nature of the work, we will prepare construction documents as two bid packages as follows:

Bid Package No. 1

- a. Remove existing masonry retaining walls, reshape landscaped area, install catch basins at the northeast main entrance.
- b. Demolish all remaining masonry retaining walls, rebuild to original height but install weeps, thru-wall flashing and slate cap.
- c. Repair concrete retaining wall adjacent to loading dock.
- d. Remove concrete slabs between columns and install ground cover.
- e. Remove concrete walks which have settled and re-install, seal construction and control joints. Install heating mats at the two north entrances of the College to eliminate glazing of the concrete in the winter.
- f. Seal concrete walk construction and control joints of sidewalks not removed adjacent to building.
- g. Remove existing sealant, clean surface and re-install sealant at building perimeter.
- h. Remove existing exterior concrete stairs which have settled and install new stairs.
- i. Construct two handicap ramps at the north entrances, install handicap curb entrance.

- j. Seal existing slabs at water storage building roof.
- k. Remove existing loading dock, install new concrete dock, repair foundation and install bumper posts and dock bumpers.
- l. Reshape asphalt drive south of auto-body shop area.
- m. Overlay asphalt in loading dock area.
- n. Repair ten leaks in foundation walls throughout building.
- o. Raise settled retaining walls at two locations.
- p. Clean, tuckpoint and seal masonry wing walls at auto-body shop area.
- q. Reshape four areas north of building to drain to existing catch basins and install sod.
- r. Replace deteriorated brick, clean and seal brick at depressed study area north of building.

Bid Package No. 2

- a. Patch deteriorated foundations.
- b. Patch deteriorated column bases.
- c. Seal structural concrete cracks by the epoxy injection method.
- d. Apply new facing material to all exterior concrete.
- e. Reseal all curtain wall to concrete joints throughout college.

We propose to release documents for bidding in January, 1988, with construction work to begin in May of 1988. All work should then be completed during the summer with final completion by October, 1988. This will result in the least inconvenience to the operation of the College. Work will be scheduled with the successful contractors to maintain continuous access to the College.

PROPOSED SCOPE OF PROJECT

The total scope of work for the final repair of construction defects at the Sauk Valley Community College as outlined by CDB is as follows:

1. Exterior concrete crack and spalling repairs of concrete spandrel beams, sunshades, wall girders and columns.
2. Remove and replace damaged and settled concrete sidewalks and stairs at the exterior perimeter of the building.
3. Patch and repair brick planter walls and evaluate the possible removal of certain retaining walls.
4. Seal cracks in basement walls in order to prevent water penetration.
5. Point and repair distressed brick work at pump house walls and at northwest corner of building.
6. Rake out and repatch concrete veneer patches.
7. Remove and replace sealant around glass curtain wall.
8. Remove and replace exterior concrete slabs at the pump house and kitchen area.

In order to further define the scope of the project and to outline the procedures required to achieve the final satisfactory results, the following is a defined scope of planned work proposed for the repair of construction defects.

In order to initiate portions of the work, the project shall be divided into two phases with work as outlined.

PHASE I

1. Remove and replace damaged and settled concrete sidewalks and stairs at the exterior perimeter of the building.

SCOPE OF WORK

- a. Identify areas of slabs to be considered.
 - b. Make test borings to establish condition of soil below slabs and steps.
 - c. Remove concrete slabs, sidewalks and stairs of areas to be replaced.
 - d. Remove unsuitable soil and install new compacted fill.
 - e. Test new compacted fill for specified compaction.
 - f. Re-install concrete sidewalks, steps, stairs and other damaged concrete flat work.
2. Patch and repair brick planter and retaining walls.
 - a. Investigate condition of all brick planter and retaining walls.
 - b. Study and determine which retaining walls can be eliminated without effecting the aesthetics of the facility.
 - c. Study drainage around the perimeter of the building to determine if proper drainage is occurring.
 - d. Remove existing retaining walls which are to be eliminated, store good face brick and do necessary grading and landscaping.
 - e. Remove and rebuild retaining walls and planters which are recommended for rebuilding because of aesthetics. Rebuild new walls and planters in conformance with recommended practice, using weeps, thru-wall flashing, proper mortar and epoxy mortar on horizontal surfaces or Indiana limestone with sealed joints.
 3. Seal cracks in basement walls to prevent water penetration.
 - a. Determine location of all cracked foundation walls.
 - b. If the cracked basement walls are at locations where the flat slab work is occurring or the exterior, the cracks should be sealed and waterproofed on the exterior.
 - c. If cracked basement walls are at other locations, then determination will be made by investigating the cracks and establishing the best method of repair.
 4. Point and repair distressed brick work at pump house walls and at northwest corner of building.
 - a. Investigate extent of damaged brick work.
 - b. Remove all brick work and reconstruct using recommended practice for masonry construction in cold climates. Use weeps, thru-wall flashings, proper mortar and rake and point masonry joints with epoxy mortar.

5. Remove and replace exterior concrete slabs at the pump house and kitchen area.
 - a. Investigate and establish cause of leaks and deterioration of concrete work.
 - b. Provide necessary testing to determine causes.
 - c. Remove slabs, test soil at kitchen area, remove soil and re-install compacted gravel. Re-install slabs with proper details for conditions of a cold climate.
6. Make a thorough study of similar areas throughout the College facility in order to determine if other similar problems may have developed since the initial investigation.

PHASE II

1. Exterior concrete crack and spalling repair of concrete spandrel beams, sunshades, wall girders and columns.
 - a. Investigate structural condition of reinforcing in structural components throughout the College facility.
 - b. Install test sample of epoxy grout by injection method and seal joint by cutting and sealing.
 - c. Install test samples of selected materials for aesthetics of structural repair for observation and reaction as well as approval.
 - d. After observing test samples and after receiving approval, prepare contract documents for selected procedures for reinforced concrete repair.
2. Remove and replace sealant around glass curtain wall.
 - a. Select panel adjacent to area where concrete repair and material test will occur, and, during the same period, install a test sample of one bay of curtain wall sealant by sealant manufacturer.

During the investigations and material testing of the proposed work, the Architect/Engineer shall monitor work in progress and also other elements of the building to verify if all areas within the general limits of the scope of work are covered.

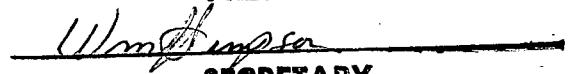
