LIFE SAFETY ROOFING PROJECT

Last September, the Board approved a Tax Levy under the Protection Health and Safety Act to allow us to begin re-roofing the college on a three-year basis. During this first year, the levy will raise approximately \$316,000. However, as the attached memo from Dean Edison outlines, if we wait for the money to arrive the project would actually be delayed a year. Therefore, we would like to begin the project by using currently available funds as certificates of deposit expire and then replace that funding whenever the new levy monies arrive.

RECOMMENDATION: Board approval to expedite the roofing project through the approval of the temporary borrowing of other college funds not to exceed \$316,000 with those funds to be replaced by the receipt of the 1987 Protection Health and Safety monies.

SUBJECT: Life & Safety Project

The Board of Trustees approved a Life Safety Project for Sauk Valley Community College at its meeting of September 28, 1987. This Project was to involve a new roof for T-1 and T-2 and the gymnasium of our permanent facility.

This Project has proceeded through the architect and the Illinois Community College Board and has resulted in a tax levy for the current year of approximately \$316,000.

Inasmuch as taxes in our community are normally received in July and December of the succeeding calendar year, it is apparent that we cannot complete our roofing projects during a desirable period of time unless we wait until the Summer of 1989, which would not coincide with our request to proceed with the new roofs. Inasmuch as the roof of the current facility will require a three year project, I do not feel that we should lose a whole year in our process of reroofing this facility. Since the roof over the gymnasium is still leaking in several spots at different times, I believe that it is imperative that we make repairs as soon as possible, and I would therefore like to recommend that the Board of Trustees give me approval to expedite this contract and to request the architect to proceed with detailed plans and specifications and to approve the temporary borrowing of other College funds pending the receipt of the 1987 tax monies in order to plan, bid, and complete the roof repairs during the forthcoming summer period.

I am recommending that we employ Mr. Robert D. Farrell as Assistant Director of Planning and Resource Development. This position is funded by the Title III grant.

Qualifications

Mr. Farrell meets all educational qualifications required for the position. He holds a Masters Degree in Speech and Drama. In addition he has completed all coursework and examinations required for a PhD but has not completed a dissertation.

Experience

Mr. Farrell is well acquainted with community colleges having worked 10 years at Itasca Community College (MN) and three years at Nicolet College (WI). He is a part-time instructor at Rock Valley College, Highland Community College, and Kishwaukee College.

Mr. Farrell's fund raising and grant-writing experience is extensive. He has worked in this field regularly since 1977 with success. He has served as a reader for granting agencies and has trained boards and volunteers in fund-raising methods.

References

Mr. Farrell's references were very positive. Four former associates or supervisors were contacted. All pointed to Mr. Farrell's listening skills, creativity, ability to work with and motivate volunteers, and writing skills. All believed his skills fit very well with the position requirements.

RE: RECOMMENDATION TO PROMOTE THOMAS BREED
TO THE RANK OF ASSISTANT PROFESSOR

The following information is provided to support the recommendation for promotion of Thomas Breed:

1. Mastery of Subject Matter: Thomas Breed holds a Master of Arts Degree in Community College Education from Western Michigan University, Kalamazoo, Michigan. He earned a Bachelor Degree at the same institution. His graduate program was specifically tailored to prepare for a career in counseling and student personnel administration. He has also taken coursework at Kalamazoo Valley Community College, where his program included a balance of theoretical and applied coursework. More recently, Tom has taken graduate work at the University of Iowa. In addition, he has participated in extensive student advising and placement testing training programs in Illinois.
2. Demonstrated Counseling/Student Personnel: Mr. Breed has received above average annual evaluations from both the Director of Counseling and the Dean of Student Services. Tom's initial assignment at the college was Coordinator of the JTPA/Career and Assessment Center. The program he developed and administered exceeded the goals established for the first year of operation. Based on the success of the program, the grant was renewed for another year. In his second year, Tom was selected for a full-time position of Counselor/Coordinator of Student Activities. In this position, he was responsible for supervising a comprehensive student activities program that cut across all departments of the college and required interaction and decision-making with all staffing levels. As a full-time

counselor, Tom also provides counseling and advising services to the allied health students and coordinates their advising services.

3. Interest in Students as Individuals: Tom has consistently presented a positive and student centered attitude. He currently carries a heavy counseling load and is sought out by both career and transfer students. In addition to regularly assigned counseling duties, Tom also serves as the faculty advisor to the Student Senate. The counseling coordinator states, "Tom is a very valuable member of our staff. He has shown the ability to accept increasing responsibility and has an excellent future in student personnel work."
6. Meritorious Service: Tom is completing four years of honorable service to SVCC. The counseling coordinator indicates that Tom has facilitated a number of new ideas designed to improve the delivery of counseling services. He has recently completed a revised transfer handbook which will be a significant contribution to our student advising program. Tom serves as the faculty advisor to the Student Senate, which often calls for extra time demands beyond the regular job. Tom is chairman of the Instructional Standards Committee and Executive Secretary of the SVCC Faculty Association. Although he is no longer the coordinator, Tom continues to be an involved member of the student activities program and often contributes his services on a volunteer basis to various student functions and committees.

7. Number of Years - Present Rank: Tom is completing his fourth year at Sauk Valley Community College. During the first year, he served as Coordinator of the JTPA Testing and Advisement Center. During the next two years, he served as Counselor/Coordinator of Student Activities. He currently holds the position of full-time counselor, with added assignments of allied health counselor and student senate advisor. His current rank is instructor.

Joan has also advanced her education by attending extensive workshops in career planning/DISCOVER programs and academic advising. Her academic preparation is very compatible with the mission and goals of the community college.
2. Demonstrated Counseling/Student Services Ability: Mrs. Kerber has demonstrated above average abilities in both her counseling and student services assistance. Her previous evaluations have also been excellent. Joan was instrumental in developing the Adult Resource Center and also developed a number of farm forums, highlighting counseling and career planning resources. She has also developed and successfully taught pre-employment skills courses to unemployed and dislocated workers. More recently, she has developed and taught a new job search skills course. She has taken the lead in providing computerized guidance services. She has also developed a variety of materials for staff and students that have been designed to facilitate more realistic career and educational counseling.

3. Interest in Students as Individuals: Joan has demonstrated a good counseling relationship with her clientele. This is reflected by the number of self-referrals made by students, and student referrals made by staff. She has taken the lead in developing a variety of student support systems including peer advising, computerized career counseling, special seminars, and short courses. Joan is a popular counselor.
4. Understanding of the Comprehensive Community College Program: Joan displays a good understanding of the community college philosophy. She is an advocate of access and opportunity, and this was especially evident when she started the Adult Resource Center. In addition, Joan has experienced the community college as a student, which has reinforced her commitment to its mission.
5. Potential for Continued Professional Growth: Joan has a great deal of potential in community college work. Her academic background in speech, interpersonal communications, and counseling makes her a valuable resource. She regularly assumes responsibility, initiates projects, volunteers for extra duties, and most importantly, cares about students. This year, she was selected as SVCC's nominee for the Women's Leadership Conference Program.
6. Meritorious Service: Joan has provided consistent leadership services to the college. She was also instrumental in developing the DISCOVER career planning program which has become an important retention tool. DATA PROCESSING USE POLICY-- SECOND READING

Since we occasionally are asked to provide modest one-time services such as test scoring, label generation, page scanning, etc., it seems both cumbersome and unnecessary to require Board approval for such minor requests which we would normally like to accommodate.

Since this policy was approved for first reading at the last meeting, we are now presenting it for final approval.

RECOMMENDATION: Final Board approval of the attached revised Data Processing Policy.

Present Policy

504.01 Data Processing

The data processing center shall be dedicated to the primary use of the Sauk Valley Community College. The only exception would be for providing services to other educational institutions within the college district. Any service fees and/or agreements for such services shall be approved by the Board of Trustees.

Proposed Policy

Page 504

Policy 504.01 Data Processing

All college data processing capabilities shall be dedicated to the primary use of Sauk Valley Community College. However, the President may, at his discretion, offer these services to other educational institutions and/or businesses. Such services will normally be provided on a fee basis and a schedule will be established for such charges. If any proposed service will have annual fees exceeding \$1,000, such services shall require prior approval by the Board of Trustees.
