SAUK VALLEY COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING MINUTES

December 18, 2000

The Board of Trustees of Sauk Valley Community College met in regular session at 7 p.m. on December 18, 2000 in the third floor Board Room of Sauk Valley Community College, 173 Illinois Route #2, Dixon, Illinois.

Call to Order: Chair Simpson called the meeting to order and the following members answered roll call:

Consent Agenda: It was moved by Member Wolf and seconded by Member Thompson that the Board approve the Consent Agenda as presented. Member von Bergen Wessels then requested that Item D-1 Minutes, Item D-2 Treasurer's Report, and Item D-4 Bills Payable be removed from the Consent Agenda. In a roll call vote on the balance of the Consent Agenda, all voted aye. Motion carried. Student Trustee Bond advisory vote: aye.

Minutes: Member von Bergen Wessels requested that the November 27, 2000 meeting minutes (Page 1 - Payroll) should be amended to include the following - "Trustee von Bergen Wessels wishes to register a continuing objection to any salaries charged to the Tort Fund other than security personnel".

It was then moved by Member von Bergen Wessels and seconded by Member Thompson that the Board approve the amended minutes of the November 27, 2000 meeting. In a roll call vote, the following was recorded: Ayes - Members Andersen, Jensen, Thompson, von Bergen Wessels and Simpson. Abstain: Members

Wolf and Varga. Motion carried. Student Trustee Bond advisory vote: aye.

Treasurer's Report: Discussion was held on the Treasurer's Report. It was then moved by Member von Bergen Wessels and seconded by Member Thompson that the Board approve the Treasurer's Report. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried. Student Trustee advisory vote: aye.

Bills Payable: The Board discussed the Bills Payable and the College attorneys were asked to include time entries on future bills. It was moved by Member Wolf and seconded by Member Thompson that the Board approve the bills payable. In a roll call vote, the following was recorded: Ayes - Members Andersen, Jensen, Thompson, Varga, Wolf, and Simpson. Nays - Member von Bergen Wessels. Motion carried. Student Trustee Bond advisory vote: aye.

Tuition Waivers Request: It was moved by Member Andersen and seconded by Member Wolf that the Board approve tuition waivers for dually enrolled high school students. Discussion followed. It was then moved by Member Jensen and seconded by Member Thompson that the Board amend the original motion to indicate the approval was for one year when the Board will revisit this decision in order to ascertain the cost to the College. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried. Student Trustee Bond advisory vote: aye. In a roll call vote on the amended motion, the following was recorded: Ayes - Members Andersen, Jensen, Thompson, Varga, Wolf, and Simpson. Nays - Member von Bergen Wessels. Student Trustee Bond advisory vote: aye.

Closed Session: At 7:35 p.m. it was moved by Member Thompson and seconded by Member Andersen that the Board adjourn to closed session to discuss the appointment, employment, compensation, discipline, performance or dismissal of specific employees of the College, and closed session minutes consideration. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried. Student Trustee Bond advisory vote: aye.

Regular Session: The Board returned to regular session at 7:50 p.m.

Closed Session Minutes:	It was moved by Member Andersen and seconded by Member Thompson that the Board approve the November 27, 2000 closed session minutes as presented. In a roll call vote, the following was recorded: Ayes - Members Andersen, Jensen, Thompson, von Bergen Wessels and Simpson. Abstain: Members Wolf and Varga. Motion carried. Student Trustee Bond advisory vote: aye.
Instructional Faculty Appointment:	It was moved by Member Andersen and seconded by Member Jensen that the Board approve the appointment of John D. Nelson as an Assistant Professor (Step 10) of Business, effective January 5, 2001 at a 10-month salary of \$36,907. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried. Student Trustee Bond advisory vote: aye.
Counseling Faculty Appointment:	It was moved by Member Andersen and seconded by Member Varga that the Board approve the appointment of Terry Lyn Funston as counselor (Instructor Step 2) effective January 2, 2001 at a pro-rated salary of \$32,762. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried. Student Trustee Bond advisory vote: aye.
Wrestling Discussion:	After the discussion on Item J-1 Wrestling, it was moved by Member Wolf and seconded by Member Thompson that the Board request Attorney Pace make a legal performance review of the College's Title IX compliance in it's athletic programs and advise the Board within 60 days of the consequence of adding another gender-specific sport (wrestling). In a roll call vote, the following was recorded: Ayes - Members Andersen, Jensen, Thompson, Varga, Wolf, and Simpson. Nays - Member von Bergen Wessels. Student Trustee Bond advisory vote: aye.
OAS Students' Petition:	It was moved by Member Andersen and seconded by Member Varga that the Board request the administration explore possible areas of funding for new tables and chairs for the OAS Lab and report back to the Board. In a roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried. Student Trustee Bond advisory vote: aye.

Board Retreat
Agenda Items: Chair Simpson reminded the Trustees to get their Board Retreat items to President Behrendt for the January 26th Board Retreat.

Reports: Student Trustee Bond did not have a report.


ICCTA Representative Thompson reminded the Board of the ICCTA meeting scheduled for January 12 and 13, 2001 in Champaign.

616.01 Code of Student Conduct and Disciplinary Procedures for Sauk Valley Community College

The **Code of Student Conduct** has been established to control action going beyond the exercise of such rights, to maintain order on campus and to guarantee the broadest range of freedom for all who come to learn at Sauk Valley Community College.

Each student is responsible for knowledge of and compliance with this **Code of Student Conduct**, which is available through the Student Activities Office (1M4), the Counseling Office (1H2) or from the Office of the Vice President of Student Services (3L10).

The College further recognizes each student's right to procedural due process, including notice, an opportunity to respond to the allegations, and an appeal process. Any student cited for violation of the **Code of Student Conduct** will:

1. Receive notice of the alleged violation.

The notice will include:

- the specific code violations; and
- reference to the process and rights of students as indicated in the **Code of Student Conduct**.

2. Be provided an opportunity to respond to the charges.
3. If necessary, appeal the decision.
4. Not be permitted to withdraw from the College with a clear record until such charges have been resolved.

Students wishing to discuss the alleged violation before the hearing occurs should contact the Vice President of Student Services.

I. Proscribed Conduct

A. Jurisdiction of the College

The **Code of Student Conduct** applies and discipline may be imposed for conduct

which occurs on College premises, at off campus recreational or instructional sites, at any College-sponsored event, or at any College supervised or provided activity, transportation or facility.

B. Conduct--Rules and Regulations

Students at Sauk Valley Community College are expected to demonstrate qualities of morality, honesty, civility, honor, and respect. Behavior which violates these standards for which discipline may be imposed includes, but is not limited to, the following:

1. Acts of dishonesty, including, but not limited to:
 - a. cheating which includes, but is not limited to:
 - 1) use of any unauthorized assistance, resources or materials in taking quizzes, tests or examinations;
 - 2) dependence upon the aid of sources beyond those authorized by the instructor in writing papers, preparing reports, solving problems, or carrying out other assignments; or
 - 3) the acquisition, without permission, of a test or other academic material belonging to Sauk Valley Community College, to any department, or to any staff.
 - b. plagiarism which includes, but is not limited to:
 - 1) use, by paraphrase or direct quotation, of the published or unpublished work of another person without full and clear acknowledgment;
 - 2) unacknowledged use of materials prepared by another person;
 - 3) use of any agency engaged in the selling of term papers or other academic materials.
 - c. furnishing false information to any College official, faculty member or office.
 - d. forgery, alteration or misuse of any College document, record, form, or instrument of identification.
 - e. alteration or sabotage of another student's work, such as tampering with laboratory experiments.

- f. tampering with the election of any College-recognized student organization or the student trustee election.
2. Disruption or obstruction of any operation of the College, including , but not limited to, teaching, disciplinary proceedings, College activities, public services functions on or off campus, or other authorized non-College activities when the act occurs on College premises.
3. Physical abuse, verbal abuse, threats, intimidation, harassment, hazing coercion, and/or other conduct which threatens or endangers the health or safety of any person.
4. Sexual harassment which includes any unwelcome sexual advances or requests for sexual favors or any conduct of a sexual nature when:
 - a. such conduct has the purpose or effect of interfering with an individual's educational performance or extracurricular activities; or creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive educational environment.
 - b. such conduct has the purpose or effect of interfering with an individual's work performance; or creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive working environment.
5. Attempted or actual theft of or damage to property of the College or other property of a member of the College community or other personal or public property.
6. Failure to comply with directions of College officials or law enforcement officers acting in performance of their duties and/or failure to identify oneself to these persons when requested to do so.
7. Unauthorized possession, duplication or use of keys to any College premises; or unauthorized entry to, occupancy of, or use of College premises.
8. Violation of published College policies, rules, regulations, or procedures.
9. Violation of federal, state, local law or Board policy.

10. Gambling in any form.
11. Use, possession or distribution of a narcotic or other chemical substance except as expressly permitted by law.
12. Use, possession or distribution of alcoholic beverages except as expressly permitted by the law and College regulations, as well as public intoxication.
13. Illegal or unauthorized possession of firearms, fireworks, explosives, other weapons, or dangerous chemicals on College premises, off-campus instructional sites, or at College-sponsored or supervised functions.
14. Participation in a campus demonstration which disrupts the normal operations of the College and infringes on the rights of other members of the College community; leading or inciting others to disrupt scheduled and/or normal activities within any campus building or area; intentional obstruction which unreasonably interferes with freedom of movement, either pedestrian or vehicle, on campus.
15. Obstruction of the free flow of pedestrian or vehicular traffic on College premises, or at College-sponsored or supervised functions.
16. Conduct performed in such unreasonable manner as to alarm another and which is disorderly; aiding, abetting, or procuring another person to breach the peace.
17. Theft or other abuse of computer time, including but not limited to:
 - a. unauthorized entry into a file to use, read or change the contents, or for any other purpose;
 - b. unauthorized transfer of a file;
 - c. unauthorized use of an individual's identification and password;
 - d. use of computing facilities to interfere with the work of a student, faculty member or College official;
 - e. use of computing facilities to interfere with operation of the College and other computing systems;
 - f. unauthorized use or copying of copyrighted software;

- g. The installation or use of a program whose effect is to damage the media or files;
- h. Unauthorized use of computer time for personal, business or illegal purposes;
- 18. Unauthorized use of College telephones or facsimile (fax) machines.
- 19. Abuse of the student conduct review procedure, including, but not limited to:
 - a. Failure to obey the summons of a Student Conduct Review Board or College official;
 - b. falsification, distortion or misrepresentation of information before a Student Conduct Review Board.
 - c. disruption or interference with the orderly conduct of a proceeding;
 - d. bringing about charges without cause;
 - e. attempting to discourage an individual's proper participation in or use of the procedure;
 - f. attempting to influence the impartiality of a member of the Student Conduct Review Board prior to and/or during the course of the proceeding;
 - g. harassment (verbal or physical) and/or intimidation of a member of the Student Conduct Review Board to, during and/or after a proceeding;
 - h. failure to comply with the sanction(s) imposed under the **Code of Student Conduct**;
 - I. influencing or attempting to influence another person to commit an abuse of the process.
- 20. Children are not to accompany students to classes unless special instructor permission is given and they are not to be left unattended.

C. Violation of Federal, State or Local Laws and College Discipline

- 1. College disciplinary proceedings may be instituted against a student charged with violation of a federal, state or local law which is also a violation of this Code; that

is, if both violations result from the same factual situation without regard to pending civil litigation in court or criminal arrest and prosecution. Proceedings under this Code may be carried out prior to, simultaneously with, or following civil or criminal proceedings off campus.

When a student is charged by federal, state or local authorities with a violation of law, the College will not request or agree to special consideration for that individual because of his or her status as a student. If the alleged offense is also the subject of a proceeding before the Student Conduct Review Board, however, the College may advise off-campus authorities of the existence of the Code and of how such matters will be handled within the College community. The College will cooperate fully the law enforcement of criminal law on campus and in the conditions imposed by criminal courts for the rehabilitation of violators who are also students.

II. Vice President of Student Services Authority

- A. The Vice President of Student Services is responsible for administration of the **Code of Student Conduct**.**
- B. The Vice President of Student Services has the authority, in the Vice President's discretion, to impose discipline as provided herein Sections 4 A (1), (2), (3), (4), (5), (6), (7), (8), (9), and (10). The Vice President of Student Services has the authority and discretion to recommend College suspension or College expulsion. The Vice President of Student Services may, in her/his discretion, refer any disciplinary matter to the Student Conduct Review Board.**
- C. The Vice President may delegate her/his authority to one or more other administrators. All references to the "Vice President of Student Services" or to "the Vice President" in this **Code of Student Conduct** includes such designees, unless specifically stated to the contrary.**

- D. Confidential files should be maintained by the Vice President of Student Services for the purpose of recording actions taken incident to Article 616.01.

III. Procedures in Cases Involving Possible Discipline

A. Charges or Claims of Violation of Code of Student Conduct

Any member of the College community may file charges against any student for misconduct. Charges will be prepared in writing and directed to the Vice President of Student Services. Any charge should be submitted within five administrative work days after the event takes place.

B. Investigation

The Vice President of Student Services will Conduct an investigation to determine if the charges should proceed. Following the investigation, the Vice President of Student Services shall make a determination of whether there are sufficient facts to warrant a belief that a violation of the **Code of Student Conduct** could have occurred.

C. Notice to Student

Any student against whom charges of misconduct have been filed shall be notified of the accusation of violation of the **Code of Student Conduct**, as provided in this Policy.

D. Hearing

In the event the Vice President of Student Services determines there is cause to believe there may have been a violation of the **Code of Student Conduct**, the Vice President shall determine whether the matter may be resolved informally, without a hearing. If the problem is not resolved informally, in her/his discretion the Vice President will either: (1) conduct a hearing, at which time the accused student shall have the opportunity to respond to the charge; or (2) refer the matter to the Student Conduct Review Board for a hearing. The Vice President shall be responsible for the conduct of the hearings he/she holds, and for establishing the rules which shall apply for the particular hearing. The Vice President shall inform the student of the rules which shall be applied.

E. Imposition of Discipline, and Decision After Hearing

If on informal resolution there is agreement as to discipline, the Vice President shall impose the disciplinary action agreed upon. If the Vice President conducts a hearing and determines that a violation of the Code of Student Conduct occurred, the Vice President may impose discipline as authorized in Section II, or, in her/his discretion, she/he may refer the matter to the Student Conduct Review Board for hearing. In the event that the Vice President of Student Services believes after hearing that the violation warrants College suspension or College expulsion, the Vice President shall refer the matter to the Student Conduct Review Board for hearing and disposition. If, after the hearing, the Vice President determines no violation of the Code occurred, she/he shall render such decision.

F. Appeals

Rights to appeal are as provided in Section VI.

IV. Disciplinary Actions

A. The following are types of disciplinary action which may be imposed, singly or in combination:

1. **Warning** - Verbal or written notice to the student that the student is violating or has violated institutional rules, policies and/or regulations and that the continuation of such conduct or actions may result in further disciplinary action.
2. **Reprimand** - A formal letter of reprimand sent to the student stating the violations of the **Code of Student Conduct**. Repetition of conduct resulting in reprimand may result in further disciplinary action described below in paragraphs 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, or 12.
3. **Disciplinary Probation** - A specified period of observation and review of conduct during which the student must demonstrate compliance with College rules and regulations. Terms of probation and the probationary period will be

determined at the time the sanction is imposed. A student on disciplinary probation is subject to suspension for any further disciplinary referrals.

4. **Limitation to Participate in a Selective Admission Program** - Suspension or denied access to the opportunity to participate in a selective admission program.
5. **Suspension of Privileges or College Services** - Suspension of loss of rights to specified privileges and College services for a specific period of time.
6. **Restitution** - Compensation for loss, damage or injury. This may take the form of appropriate service and/or monetary or material replacement.
7. **Discretionary Sanctions** - Work assignments, service to the College or neighboring communities, or other related discretionary assignments.
8. **Limited Access** - Administrative restriction to selected parts/locations of campus sites.
9. **Withdrawal from class** - Administrative withdrawal with consequent loss of tuition and fees from a class or classes.
10. **Temporary Suspension from Class** - Temporary suspension of the opportunity to participate in a class.
11. **College Suspension** - Separation of the student, with consequent loss of tuition and fees, from the College for a definite period of time, after which the student may be eligible to return. Conditions for re-admission may be specified.
12. **College Expulsion** - Permanent separation, with consequent loss of tuition and fees, of the student from the College.

B. When the student violation is deemed severe enough by the Vice President of Student Services to warrant possible College expulsion or College suspension, the Vice President of Student Services will file with the President of the College and the Co-chairs of the Student Conduct Review Board a notice of the necessity to convene for disciplinary action. Written notice to the student involved shall be served by certified mail, addressed

to his/her usual place of abode or hand delivered. The notice shall include or contain the following:

1. a copy of these policies;
2. specific factual allegations of misconduct and reference to any specific rules which the facts, as alleged, violate;
3. notification of the Student Conduct Review Board convening time.

C. Students may be directed to participate in counseling or educational seminars in lieu of, or in addition to, the imposition of disciplinary actions described in A above.

D. Other than College expulsion, disciplinary sanctions will not be made part of the student's permanent academic record, but will become part of the student's confidential record maintained by the Vice President of Student Services.

E. The following sanctions may be imposed upon clubs, groups or organizations:

1. Those sanctions listed in Section A Paragraphs 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8.
Deactivation - loss of all privileges, including College recognition, for a specified period of time.

V. Temporary Suspensions

A. Class Suspension

An instructor or the Vice President of Student Services may temporarily suspend the opportunity of a student to participate in a class, if either determines that the continued presence of the student would disrupt the educational process, or endanger the physical well-being of others in the classroom or immediate area.

1. **Communication of Suspension of Student** - The temporary suspension of the student will be promptly communicated to the student.
 - a) If prompt action dictates that the temporary suspension be only communicated orally due to the urgency of the situation, the student will be given oral notification and then receive written notification of the reasons for the temporary

suspension within three administrative work days from the removal.

(b) Except as provided in sub (a) above, the temporary suspension of a student must be communicated to the student in writing, and the written notice shall state the reasons for the temporary suspension.

(c) All temporary suspensions from the classroom initiated by the instructor shall be reported to the appropriate academic administrator or supervisor, and to the Vice President of Instruction and the Vice President of Student Services within one administrative work day of the temporary suspension from the classroom.

2. Any student temporarily suspended from a class by an instructor may be readmitted to that class only by the appropriate academic administrator or the Vice President of Student Services, following a conference with student.

B. College Suspension

In her/his discretion, the Vice President of Student Services may impose a College suspension prior to the hearing before the Student Conduct Review Board. Interim suspension may be imposed only:

1. To insure the safety and well-being of members of the College community or preservation of College property; or
2. To insure the student's own physical or emotional safety and well-being; or
3. To avoid a threat of disruption of or interference with the normal operations of the College.

During the interim suspension, students will be denied access to the campus (including classes), to off-campus instructional sites, and/or to all other College activities or privileges for which the student might otherwise be eligible, as the Vice President of Student Services determines appropriate.

VI. Appeals

A. Disciplinary Action by Designees of Vice President of Student Services

A decision reached, or discipline imposed by a designee of the Vice President of Student Services may be appealed in writing within five administrative work days to the Vice President of Student Services. The Vice President of Student Services shall render a decision on the appeal within five administrative days after receipt of the appeal.

B. Decision by Vice President of Student Services or Student Conduct Review Board

A decision reached or discipline imposed by the Vice President of Student Services herself/himself, or by the Student Conduct Review Board may be appealed to the President of the College.

1. Time and Manner of Appeal - Appeal to the President shall be in writing containing the materials described in subsection 2 below, and must be presented to the Office of the President within five administrative work days from the date of issuance of the decision of the Student Conduct Review Board, or the Vice President of Student Services, as appropriate.
2. Content of Written Appeal - The written appeal shall include such information as the person bringing the appeal deems necessary to show that the decision reached was erroneous.
3. Record on Appeal - In considering the appeal, the President shall have available the report from the Student Conduct Review Board, or the Vice President of Student Services as appropriate along with any written documentation submitted at the hearing.
4. Time for President's Decision - The President shall render a decision on the appeal within ten administrative work days after receipt of the last to be received report and written documentation.
5. Referral to Board of Trustees - Upon review of the materials, if the College President deems it necessary, the President may defer the responsibility for decision on the appeal to the Board of Trustees of the College. In the event of such deferral, the President shall notify the accused student, and the Vice President of Student Services, and the

matter shall be presented to the Board for its consideration at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting. The Board shall render a decision on the appeal after due consideration.

- C. Rehearing - The right to appeal does not entitle a student to a full rehearing of his/her case.
- D. Scope of Appeal - An appeal will be limited to review of the initial process except when appropriate new evidence is presented.
- E. Change of Disciplinary Action on Appeal - If discipline is imposed, the Vice President of Student Services, the President or the Board of Trustees (as appropriate), who hears the appeal, may not impose a more severe disciplinary action than the original disciplinary action imposed. A disciplinary action may be reduced on appeal.
- F. Finality of Decision - The decision on appeal of the Vice President of Student Services under paragraph A above shall be final. The decision of the President on appeal pursuant to paragraph B shall be final, unless the President shall defer the decision to the Board of Trustees of the College, in which case the decision of the Board of Trustees shall be final.

II. Definitions

- A. The term "College" means Sauk Valley Community College.
- B. The term "student" for the purposes of this code, includes all persons applying for admission or taking credit or non-credit courses provided by the College both full-time and part-time.
- C. The term "faculty member" means all full- or part-time teachers, counselors and librarians, excluding interns and student teachers.
- D. The term "official" includes any person employed by the College performing assigned administrative or professional staff responsibilities.
- E. The term "member of the College Community" includes any person who is a student, faculty member, College official, or any other person employed by the College. A person's status in a particular situation will be determined by the Vice President of Student Services.

- F. The term "College premises" includes all land, buildings, facilities, and other property in the possession of or owned, used, or controlled by the College (including adjacent streets and sidewalks).
- G. The term "organization" means any number of persons who have complied with the formal requirements for College recognition.
- H. The term "will" is used in the imperative sense.
- I. The term "may" is used in the permissive sense.

VIII. Interpretation and Revision

- A. Any question of the interpretation regarding the **Code of Student Conduct** will be referred to the Vice President of Student Services or a designee for final determination.
- B. The Code will be reviewed periodically and amended as necessary under the direction of the Vice President of Student Services.

5. Multiple Accused Students - In hearings involving more than one accused student, the chairs of the Student Conduct Review Board, at their discretion, may require that the proceedings concerning each student be conducted separately.
6. Right to Present Evidence - The Vice President of Student Services, the accused student, and the Student Conduct Review Board may present witnesses or other evidence relating to the matter before the Student Conduct Review Board.
7. Order of Proceeding - The order of proceeding shall be as follows: the Vice President of Student Services shall first make an explanation of the charge or charges involved, and summarize the evidence to be presented by the Vice President of Student Services. The Vice President shall then present such evidence and witnesses as she deems appropriate relevant to the issues before the Student Conduct Review Board. Upon conclusion of the presentation, the accused student may summarize any evidence the accused student intends to produce to the Board, and shall then proceed to offer testimony of any witnesses, and any documentary evidence the accused student may desire, relevant to the issues before the Student Conduct Review Board. After the accused student has concluded the presentation of witnesses and documentary evidence, the Vice President of Student Services may offer any additional witnesses or evidence desired. Thereafter, the Student Conduct Review Board may call any different witnesses and any additional evidence not previously presented.
8. Receipt of Documentary Evidence - Pertinent records, exhibits and written statements may be accepted by the Student Conduct Review Board in the discretion of the chairs.
9. Argument - After submission of all evidence, the Chairs shall call for any final remarks. The Vice President of Student Services may address any arguments to the Board. At the conclusion of the Vice President of Student Services' remarks, the accused student may address the Board regarding the matter being considered by the Board.

10. **Deliberation** - After the conclusion of the arguments, the Student Conduct Review Board shall enter into deliberations to reach its decision.
11. **Absence of the Accused Student** - In all cases, the facts and support of any charges will be presented and considered whether or not the accused student attends the hearing. Except in the event the student is charged with failing to obey the summons of the Student Conduct Review Board, or summons of College official, no student may be found to have violated the Code of Student Conduct simply because the student failed to appear before the Student Conduct Review Board.
12. **Continuances** - The Student Conduct Review Board, in its sole discretion, may grant a continuance of proceedings when specifically requested by the accused student.
13. **Miscellaneous** - Matters relating to recess of proceedings, adjournment, relevance of matters submitted, limitation on time of argument, and orderly conduct of proceedings are in the discretion of the Chairs.

618.01 Student Conduct Review Board

Student Conduct Review Board shall be a subcommittee of the Student Services College Committee and shall be composed of four full-time faculty members. The Student Services Committee shall appoint the four faculty representatives and the four student members to the Student Conduct Review Board at the first meeting of the semester.

Any vacancies shall be filled by a 2/3 majority vote of all members of the Student Conduct Review Board. The Board shall designate one student member and one faculty member to act as co-chairs. The chairs shall be responsible for:

- a) chairing all meetings and hearings;
- b) providing accurate minutes of all meetings and hearings to Board members and others (when appropriate);
- c) ensuring that all procedures during hearings meet statutory and procedural requirements;
- d) keeping accurate records of all meetings, hearing, and hearing outcomes;
- e) ensuring that all sanctions are submitted in writing to the Vice President of Student Services.

All action taken by the Student Conduct Review Board under these procedures shall be taken by majority of the members present. A quorum shall consist of five members present. No member of the Board who was not present at the hearings shall vote upon sanctions except with the consent of the accused student , the Vice President of Student Services, and the Student Conduct Review Board.

Members are responsible for:

- a) possessing a copy of and being familiar with the process and its attendant policies and procedures;
- b) attending all meetings;
- c) maintaining strict confidentiality about all information pertaining to meetings and hearings.

The Vice President of Student Services shall facilitate the hearing by the Student Conduct Review Board, and shall provide advice to the Chairs regarding conduct of all hearings, and the application of College procedures and policies. The Vice President of Student Services may, in her/his discretion, have legal counsel to the College available to advise the Student Conduct Review Board regarding conduct of the proceeding and the application of College policies and law.

619.01 Decision of the Student Conduct Review Board

The Student Conduct Review Board shall render its written decision within ten administrative work days of the hearing. It shall send its decision to the Vice President of Student Services, to the President of the College, and to the accused student. Any minority opinions of the Student Conduct Review Board shall be transmitted, along with the decision of the Student Conduct Review Board.

1. When a student is found not guilty of violating the **Code of Student Conduct**, a written statement to the student will be issued that no violation of the **Code of Student Conduct** has been determined, and all records will be expunged.
2. When the Student Conduct Review Board determines that a student has violated the **Code of Student Conduct**, the Student Conduct Review Board will collectively determine the disciplinary action to be imposed, as provided in Section IV.
3. In the event the Student Conduct Review Board is unable to agree upon a decision, the Student Conduct Review Board shall so advise the President of the College and the Vice President of Student Services within the time provided above. The Vice President of Student Services shall forward the materials required by Policy 621.01 to the Board of Trustees at its next regularly scheduled meeting. The Board shall then set a time for disposition of the matter. The Board will establish such procedures as are appropriate under the specific circumstances to permit resolution of the matter.

620.01 Action by the College President

When the decision of the Student Conduct Review Board is final, the College President shall direct such actions as are necessary to carry out the decision.

All Student Conduct Review Board decisions are effective upon notification to the student by certified mail or hand delivery.



GENERAL BACKGROUND

The Office of Student Financial Assistance at Sauk Valley Community College awards more than 2.3 million dollars in federal, state, and institutional assistance annually. The OSFA is also responsible for awarding SVCC Foundation scholarships and all federal and state veteran's benefits.

INTRODUCTION

During the fall of 2000, the OSFA distributed a customer service survey to 300 registered student assistance applicants. The survey is an exact copy of a survey collected from students during Fall 1999. The purpose of the survey is to identify areas of improvement and areas that need to be addressed.

The 300 students selected were a random sample drawn from 681 registered student assistance applicants in the SCT Banner database. The survey was conducted in mid-October to correspond with the time frame of the 1999 survey. The sample was not stratified by an external factors, (i.e., ethnicity, age, etc.) due to the relatively homogenous student assistance applicant population in the database.

THE SURVEY INSTRUMENT

The survey was an exact duplicate of the survey used in Fall 1999. Staff from the Office of Grants, Planning and Institutional Research and from the OSFA worked on its design. It was mailed out along with a brief cover letter and a stamped self-addressed return envelope to the 300 selected participants. This is a change from last year when the survey was mailed to 200 participants, and the remaining 100 were contacted by telephone. The change was implemented to increase the number of responses.

Each survey was individually numbered in the bottom right hand corner. This was done to establish the participant's status in the application process. The survey consisted of seven statements and one open ended question. The participants were to circle the appropriate response to the statement.

RESPONSES

Of the 300 registered student assistance applicants, 75 returned the survey. This is a response rate of exactly 25%, which is a slight gain over the Fall 1999 survey. The chart on the following page shows a comparison of the Fall 1999 responses and the Fall 2000 responses by question. Areas of significant improvement (5% or more increase) are shaded. Areas of significant concern (5% or more decrease) are presented in bold.

FINDINGS

A correlation analysis of the responses was conducted to identify patterns among the responding participants. In addition to comparing the responses to application completion date, processing completion date, and award amounts, the Fall 2000 survey was also compared to age and dependency status. After reviewing this information, several findings became apparent.

1. Non-traditional students submitted the three strongest negative comments and evaluations. Two of the students were female, and all were between the ages of 28 and 49. The award amounts did not seem to affect the students' perceptions, but all three completed the application process in the first two weeks of classes. Since this is traditionally our busiest time, the majority of our complaints occur during this time period. These three students represent all of the strongly disagree responses in the Fall 2000 survey.
2. The OSFA made an effort to mail out award letters much earlier in previous years. This effort was undertaken as a response to the findings of the 1999 survey. The responses to the 2000 survey demonstrate that awarding financial assistance earlier in the year had a definite positive impact. The attached scattergrams illustrate the overall improvement from 1999 to 2000. The date the file is completed is compared to the average of all seven statements. Strongly agree is scored as a 5, agree is a 4, neutral a 3, etc. Responses are designated by the diamond shaped icons.
3. The comments to the open-ended question reflect that students are uncomfortable with work-study students having access to personal financial information. Given the current size of our office staff, limiting the work study employees access to such information would make it difficult to accomplish our daily activities.
4. Students also wrote regarding concerns over the availability of scholarship and scholarship information. The OSFA does have a scholarship book with all incoming scholarships posted alphabetically. However, most students find this process cumbersome and time consuming.
5. The most important finding of the 2000 survey is drawn from the six students who disagreed with the statement; "The OSFA provides accurate information". After analyzing the backgrounds of these six respondents, it was discovered that all six were either non-traditional students or had difficulty maintaining eligibility within the guidelines of the OSFA Satisfactory Academic Progress policy.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. OSFA staff need to make a conscious effort to be more sensitive to non-traditional students. We need to be sure to anticipate possible problems in advance, in order to meet their needs. If the OSFA succeeds in taking more proactive measures with these students, the negative findings should decrease.
2. The OSFA should continue to award financial assistance as early as possible. The benefits of early awarding have had an incredible impact of many areas of our office. If possible we need to voice our concerns to SCT with regards to late software release dates. The late software release was the only reason we were unable to package even earlier in the 2000-2001 award year.
3. We need to increase the visibility of scholarship information on campus. The current format provides a great deal of information, but very few students take advantage of it. Specific methods to address this finding include; making an effort to increase student awareness of the FASTWeb Internet Scholarship Search, continue including the scholarship application in the FAFSA packet, and creating a visible presence in the common area outside of the OSFA.
4. The OSFA should continue our efforts to increase student understanding of financial assistance.

One suggestion is to increase the financial assistance portion of the Psychology 100 Orientation class.

5. We also need to consider additional professional staffing during the busiest office periods. This may temporarily address the work-study employee issues, while allowing for the same level of productivity.

BACKGROUND

In 1999, the Illinois legislature funded each community college in the state with \$12,500 to be used to provide tuition assistance to students who were dually enrolled in high school and college. The purposes of the dual enrollment program was to shorten the time to degree for high achieving high school students, to provide enrichment for those students who had completed most of their high school requirements, and increase the college attendance rates of all high school students.

At Sauk Valley Community College, we used this year's appropriated money to pay the tuition of those students who were dually enrolled in their local, in-district, high school and SVCC. In order to take advantage of this program, the student had to have the consent of his/her high school counselor and/or principal and have tested into college level course work. Additionally, students enrolled in Sauk's current program "Honors in Escrow" could also take advantage of this free tuition.

The dual enrollment program was met with great enthusiasm by the high school administrators and proved to be very successful. This Fall semester, a total of 95 students were dually enrolled in district high schools and Sauk Valley Community College. However, the success of the program has created another challenge. The \$12,500 appropriated by the legislature is gone. It is of vital importance that we continue this program in the Spring semester. In order to continue this program we must ask the Board to approve tuition waivers for those dually enrolled high school students.

While we do not know the precise number of students that would take advantage of this program, and therefore do not know the precise dollar amount the waivers would cost,

we believe this is a valid use of college dollars. The students would still pay fees, any costs for books, and the college would continue to get apportionment dollars as with any other enrolled student. Additionally, we may introduce students to Sauk who did not consider coming here either because they did not believe they wanted to go to college at all, or because they were interested in another institution.

It is our understanding that these state dollars provided to support this program will increase above this year's \$12,500 next year, but at a flat rate for all colleges. However, in subsequent years, the amount of money each college gets for this program will be dependent upon the number of in-district students who took advantage of the program in its first two years. We believe that the additional college money used to waive the student's tuition will be repaid when the additional state dollars are distributed.

REQUEST

We are suggesting that you ask the Board to waive the tuition of dually enrolled high school students that fall under the guidelines set by the college as listed above. We are not asking for a specific dollar amount, since that will not be determined until students have actually registered for courses.

We will provide to the Board each semester an accounting of the actual dollars waived, the number of students impacted, and any other information the Board would find valuable to determine the success of this program.

Either or both of us are available at any time to answer any questions you or the Board might have about this program. Thank you for your consideration.

Announcement Process

The Business faculty position was advertised in the Dixon Evening Telegraph, the Sterling Gazette and on the Sauk Scout, the Chronicle of Higher Education, the Quad City Times, and the Rockford Register Star.

Application Responses

Fourteen applications were received.

Screening

All of the Business, Technology & Natural Sciences faculty were invited to review the resume pool. A committee composed of Randall Bradshaw, Ann Daly, Dennis Day, Richard Eichman, Loren Niemeyer, Charles West and the Dean reviewed the applications of all candidates. Four candidates were invited to the campus for an interview, a teaching demonstration and a writing assignment. The college President and the Vice President of Instructional Services also interviewed the candidates.

Qualifications

1. Academic Background

Mr. Nelson graduated from the University of Oregon with a Masters in Business Administration in finance. He is also a certified business specialist. Mr. Nelson is a multi-disciplinary instructor who can teach Sauk Valley Community College's economics courses in addition to business courses.

2. Professional Background

Mr. Nelson is currently an adjunct faculty member and coordinator for the Small Business Development Center.

3. References

During his interview Mr. Nelson demonstrated enthusiasm and interest in both students and the college. He was very concerned in his teaching demonstration that students understood the material presented.

Mr. Nelson's references were checked including past students. References made the following statements about Mr. Nelson: "Very professional", "top shelf", "head and shoulders above others", "expected a lot from students", "respectful", related current events to the classroom learning process", "great rapport with students", and "made learning applicable."

Our screening committee has indicated that John Nelson should fit in well with our faculty and student body. I recommend the employment of John Nelson as the Assistant Professor of Business Step 10 without reservation of any kind.

SUBJECT: Community Athletic Request/Equity Report

Periodically, the athletic director and I receive community requests to add a particular sport to our intercollegiate athletic program. When we receive these requests, we take them very seriously since it is clear that the vision of Sauk Valley Community College has emphasized three major factors -- quality education, students and community needs.

In response to a recent community request to add wrestling to our intercollegiate athletic program, we have analyzed our current program with regard to meeting student/community needs, reviewed our Title IX compliance, and have done an analysis of this sport request. With this thorough review, we are then in a position to give an educated recommendation as to the feasibility of adding a new sport to our current program.

Current Student Needs:

In an attempt to keep a finger on the pulse of student interests, the students who attend PSY 100 (orientation class) are asked to fill-out a form outlining their interests. This form not only is a method of creating new clubs and programs, but also is a means of matching students with current programs and activities. In the past two years, there has been a marked increase in desire to revitalize our intramural program, but there has been no clearly stated pattern to adding an additional intercollegiate sport. I will be suggesting to the Counselors that in their proposed student survey for their program review, they add a question that directly addresses if we are meeting the needs of the students through our intercollegiate program or if other sports are desired.

Title IX Compliance:

There is a three-part test used by the U.S. Department of Education's Office of Civil Rights (OCR) in determining if an institution which sponsors an athletic program is in compliance with the 1972 amendment to the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 – commonly referred to as Title IX. This amendment was implemented to give women equal rights in universities receiving federal financial assistance. This three-part test furnishes three individual avenues for measuring compliance with the requirement to

provide individuals of each sex with nondiscriminatory opportunities to participate in intercollegiate athletics. If an institution has met any part of the three-prong test, OCR will determine that the institution is meeting this requirement. No one part of the test is the predominant or “true” measure of compliance. The three parts of the test are:

Part One: Substantial Proportionality. Whether intercollegiate level participation opportunities for male and female students are provided in numbers substantially proportionate to their respective enrollments; or

Part Two: History and Continuing Practice. Where the members of one sex have been and are underrepresented among intercollegiate athletes, whether the institution can show a history and continuing practice of the program expansion which is demonstrably responsive to the developing interests and abilities of that sex; or

Part Three: Effectively Accommodating Interests and Abilities. Where the members of one sex are underrepresented among intercollegiate athletes, and the institution cannot show a continuing practice of program expansion such as that cited above, whether it can be demonstrated that the interests and abilities of the members of that sex have been fully and effectively accommodated by the present program.

44 Fed. Reg. At 71418

Analysis of Part One: Substantial Proportionality

As the verbiage indicates, in order to meet this part of the test, schools would need to increase female athletic participation and/or reduce male participation until it is proportionate to the ratio of the total enrollment. For community colleges, this is by far the most difficult way to achieve compliance, given the fact that we have such a large number of returning adult women students, thus increasing our overall ratio of total female students.

In 1995, Sauk added the sports of softball and cross-country to our female program and even though this created an equal number of sports for males and females and increased our female athlete participation greatly, it was not enough to meet OCR’s requirements through test #1. This is illustrated in the following table.

Analysis of Part Two: History and Continuing Practice

Sauk Valley Community College demonstrates a history and a commitment to a continuing practice of overall program expansion for female athletes. This can be shown through program expansion, increased female recruiting efforts, budget percentages, and scholarship opportunities for female athletes.

Increased program opportunities:

In 1995, SVCC added two new women's sports: Softball and Cross Country. This was done to accommodate requests in these sports and to provide more equal opportunity for this underrepresented gender.

Note: The College was able to meet Title IX compliance partially due to the fact that during the fiscal years of 96 and 97, we had private donations for women's athletics that amounted to \$42,000—allowing us to add these two new female programs.

Increased recruiting dollars:

In an attempt to increase the number of female athletes, Sauk has a five-year history of disbursing a higher percentage of recruiting dollars to female sports than male sports.

Continued efforts in budget percentages:

Since Title IX does not mandate that budgets provided for male and female sports must be equal, the key to allocating financial resources under Title IX is the *overall impact* of expenditures. Sauk's goal for the past five years has been to have actual female expenditure percentages be substantially proportionate to the percentage of female athletes. Three out of five years this was an achievable goal as the following chart illustrates.

During the fiscal year of 2000, an unexpected occurrence took place that we had not accounted for in our efforts – one of the male teams was especially successful in carrying out fund-raising activities for their team. Since all athletic benefits and resources must be

accounted for, whatever their source, technically even money from team fund-raising activities needs to be considered. The following corrective measures have been implemented for FY 01 in an effort to put us back within reach of our substantially proportionate goals:

- 1) Increased opportunities for female fund-raising,
- 2) Placed a cap on male team fund-raising, and
- 3) The budget allocation percentage to athletic programs was increased by 1% for females and decreased by 1% for males.

Increased female scholarship opportunities:

In 1995 the College added ten female scholarship opportunities in an effort to demonstrate our commitment to female athletes. Recognizing that we were still not proportionate with our percentage of female students, this number was increased by four in 1997. This increase of female waivers still falls short in comparison to our overall enrollment percentage, but it does indicate an assurance on the part of the college to our female athletes to move in a positive upward direction.

Equivalence in other athletic benefits and opportunities:

Another area of that must be considered in Title IX is the relevant comparison between *overall* benefits. This means evaluation of program components such as:

- A. Equipment and Supplies
- B. Scheduling of Games
- C. Access to Tutoring
- D. Travel and Daily Allowance
- E. Locker rooms and Practice Facilities
- F. Publicity
- G. Support Services

A continual self-audit must be done in these areas in order to assure a commitment to provide equivalent standards of quality in equipment and overall athletic opportunity. Our coaches are annually asked for their teams' needs and these needs are realistically attempted to be met through various sources.

Analysis of Part Three: Effectively Accommodating Interests and Abilities

If a college is going to use this part of the test to meet compliance, it would need to show that it is fully and effectively accommodating the athletic interest and abilities of the women in its student body. In other words, the college would need to provide opportunities for female sports when there is sufficient interest and ability among that underrepresented sex to sustain a viable team.

Even though Sauk is not utilizing this part of the test for compliance, as I indicated earlier, we are monitoring our incoming students with regard to their interest in additional

sports. If community interests in female sports are indicated in the future, it might be prudent of the College to consider a written survey, completed by the schools' female students, to determine any areas of unmet athletic interest. This would only be beneficial if the College is willing to commit more budget dollars to intercollegiate sports.

Part three of the Title IX test has not been a focus of the College given that we are focusing on part two of the test in order to meet compliance.

Summary of Title IX Compliance:

Title IX has asked that colleges make a true commitment to compliance in the interest of student athletes of both genders. As the above information illustrates, Sauk Valley Community College has made continual efforts in maintaining compliance with Title IX because we do have a true commitment to women's athletic opportunity.

In 1990, it was true that our men's athletic program received greater benefits than the women's; therefore, we had three choices in order to comply with the mandates of Title IX. We could:

- increase the benefits for the women;
- decrease the benefits for the men; or
- some of both.

In most cases, we have chosen to increase the benefits for the women and maintain the benefits for the men. Our compliance is monitored vigilantly and it is a delicate balance that we have maintained without slashing male programs. Having stated that, it should also be clear that it would be impossible at this point to add a male sport without adding a female counterpart, or we would be jeopardizing Title IX compliance.

The argument was posed to Sauk, as it has been to many colleges, that if we utilized cheerleading as a female-dominated sport, we could add a male dominated sport – therefore, without costing a great deal our Title IX figures could be justified. However, cheerleading is not an intercollegiate program even though it does often exemplify athleticism, and it is clear that OCR does not allow its expenses to be considered in figuring gender equity.

Analysis of a Community Sport Request –Wrestling

As stated in the beginning of this memo, Sauk has had a community request to add wrestling to our intercollegiate program. This request is understandable, as it is reflective of a sport that has high interest and support in high school athletics. According to the National Federation of State High School Associations, in 1999 more than 220,000 athletes competed on 8,500 wrestling teams. This is an increase of almost 2,000 school wrestling programs since the early 1970's.

Compare the above figures to the fact that in the early 1970's there were nearly 9,000 wrestlers on 400 college teams, according to an Associated Press article; but that sport declined steadily to 6,345 wrestlers on 257 teams last year, according to the NCAA.

This is reflected in our own region. Even though there are eleven high school programs there are no collegiate wrestling programs within our Arrowhead conference and only seven within our region. Waubonsee, Triton, and Harper Community Colleges have wrestling programs, but all are considerably larger colleges than Sauk. The athletic director at Waubonsee indicated that wrestling was a relatively inexpensive sport to initiate with new mats being the major expense at \$7,500 per mat. However, their overall budget for wrestling ran close to \$8,200 not including gas and van expenses. The biggest obstacle that the wrestling team faced was the fact that it was a "traveling sport." Since there are so few teams in the area with which to compete, the Waubonsee team is faced with traveling large distances (Michigan and St. Louis) to find competing teams.

Adding an intercollegiate wrestling program at Sauk will negate our Title IX compliance. An analysis was done assuming a 12 man team, and a \$7,900 operating budget. This does not include hosting meets on our campus or the estimated \$10,000 start-up cost (we still have some wrestling mats, but would need to purchase one more mat at a cost of \$7500).

Using 1999-2000 participation figures, if we had wrestling, the female athletic participation rate would drop from 52% to 47% compared to the college female enrollment of 59%. If the additional wrestling budget were to be added to our current FY01 operating figures, it would mean that the male athletic program would receive 55% (instead of 52%) of the budget allocations and the female budget percentages would drop from 48% to 45%. Sauk would have six male athletic programs and five female programs. The figures would definitely put us out of compliance with Part-Two of the OCR test – demonstrating a history and continuing practice of program expansion for female athletes.

Recommendation:

Based on our analysis of our current program, our review of Title IX compliance, and our study of the sport requested, it is our recommendation that no new sport be added to our current intercollegiate program at this time.

SUBJECT: Wrestling

A comprehensive community college would like to be able to meet all the needs of all its constituents, or in other words, "be everything to everybody." Sauk Valley Community College is no exception to that philosophy. The fact of the matter is that is an unrealistic goal and one that is not possible to achieve without jeopardizing existing programs.

In reviewing the recent well-articulated and passionate request for Sauk to include wrestling as an intercollegiate sport, it must be very clear from the beginning that the issue is not "whether or not wrestling is a worthy sport." We recognize that wrestling is a highly organized and competitive sport in our area high school districts. The issue instead is whether Sauk can include it in our intercollegiate program, given the constraints of the budget, Title IX, and our current athletic program.

Budget Issues

Our student activities are funded primarily through a three dollar (\$3.00) allocation of tuition revenue. This amount has remained steady at SVCC for six years. The administration has been reluctant to recommend an increased allocation to the student activities programs at a time when other tuition increases have been enacted to cover educational expenses that directly serve almost all of our students.—i.e., technology fee. Very few budget increases have been made in student activity programs overall in an effort to keep tuition from rising even more.

Should increased funding for student activities become available, there are several proposed programs or upgrades to existing ones that we feel should take priority over the launch of a new intercollegiate sport. Examples of these include theater projects, music programs, student government, clubs and student activities. If additional funds were generated specifically for athletics, our highest current priorities would be to hire a full-time athletic trainer to ensure the safety of our student athletes and to upgrade our part-time coaches salaries to make them more attractive and competitive with the salaries within our region. Adding a new athletic program with yearly budgetary demands between \$9,500 and \$10,000 would be our lowest priority and would be fiscally irresponsible at this time.

Title IX Compliance

Title IX compliance has been a major focus of this College for the past five years. There has been a true commitment to compliance. It has been the College's position that the integrity of Sauk clearly dictates that there is a need to be in compliance -- not simply to avoid a complaint or a lawsuit, but because that is the ethical thing to do. It appears that there is agreement by all interested persons that Sauk is currently in compliance with Title IX. As I stated in my first memo, part one of the U.S. Department of Education's Office of Civil Rights (OCR) three-part test is not the best means for SVCC to establish compliance.

Part One: Substantial Proportionality. Whether intercollegiate level participation opportunities for male and female students are provided in numbers substantially proportionate to their respective enrollments;

As indicated in my memo dated October 12, 2000, Sauk Valley Community College, to the best of our knowledge, is in compliance with Title IX through utilization of the second part of the OCR's test.

Part Two: History and Continuing Practice. Where the members of one sex have been and are underrepresented among intercollegiate athletes, whether the institution can show a history and continuing practice of the program expansion which is demonstrably responsive to the developing interests and abilities of that sex;

A lengthy explanation of Sauk's compliance, utilizing this part of the test, was provided in the October 13, 2000 memo (refer to page 2-5 for specific details). In short, our compliance is monitored carefully, as it is a delicate balance. Also, unmistakably clear is the fact that adding a male program would place the College in violation of Title IX.

It has been suggested that Sauk needn't have gone to all of the effort of complying with part two of the test because we are already in compliance through part three of the test.

Part Three: Effectively Accommodating Interests and Abilities. Where the members of one sex are underrepresented among intercollegiate athletes, and the institution cannot show a continuing practice of program expansion such as that cited above, whether it can be demonstrated that the interests and abilities of the members of that sex have been fully and effectively accommodated by the present program.

It is not a wise decision for a College to base Title IX compliance completely on the third portion of this test. First, OCR has made it clear through their wording of this portion of the test that it is to be used only **if and when** an institution cannot meet compliance through the other two parts. This was reiterated in the U.S. Court of Appeals case ruling of Brown University in which the university was found to be in violation of Title IX. Brown based disparity in their athletic opportunities on lack of interest on the part of their female students. The findings clearly indicated that an institution has a broader obligation than to base their compliance solely on interest.

"We conclude that, even if it can be empirically demonstrated that at a particular time, women have less interest in sports than do men, such evidence, standing alone, cannot justify providing fewer athletic opportunities for women than men." *Excerpt from the majority decision written by Judge Hugh H. Bownes.*

Although the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 (Title IX) has brought about many positive changes and has opened the door for female athletes, it is true that in many institutions it was done at the expense of existing male programs. As universities and colleges were faced with the dilemma of compliance and the reality of limited budgets, many male programs were eliminated. College wrestling programs were among the first. This led to animosity among student-athletes and to an outcry of unfairness by many in the wrestling community.

Bridget Niland, chair (1997) of the NCAA Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, urged schools to move away from an adversarial position that placed athletes, male and female, against each other (The NCAA News: News & Features, May 1997). In the same newsletter, Daniel A. DiBiansio, president of Wimington College (Ohio), agreed that dissension among student-athletes must be avoided –"We can't afford to pit student-athletes against each other."

We at Sauk have worked very hard to comply with Title IX, remain conscious of the budget and yet maintain our existing men's athletic programs. We were able to meet this goal partially by the generosity of a private donor who provided the funds for the start-up cost of two women's programs, helped fund the baseball program, and continues to assist with Title IX compliance by providing foundation dollars specifically for women's athletics.

Out-of-District Students/Waivers

It was implied by the local wrestling community that SVCC could maintain Title IX compliance by eliminating a successful Arrowhead conference male sport (baseball) to make room for wrestling, a non-conference male sport. SVCC's baseball program has diligently worked to build a quality program that is nationally recognized and currently holds the title of Region 4 Champions with Coach Cox being named as the Coach of the Year. While many of our current baseball team members come from out-of-district, baseball, like wrestling, is a sport maintained by eleven of our district high schools. In addition, the popularity of and available competition in wrestling vs. baseball at the community college level is different from that in high school. There are 40 Illinois community colleges that have baseball programs compared to 8 that have wrestling. We do not believe that SVCC should maintain Title IX compliance by eliminating a successful male sport.

Sauk Valley Community College is one of the few community colleges which has a policy dictating the percentage of in-district vs out-of-district student athletes. In a recent survey of the community colleges only one out of the fifteen that responded had such a policy (Spoon River requires that 51% of their student athletes are in-district.) Nevertheless, the quality of some of our male athletic programs draws out-of-district students from across the nation to Sauk Valley Community College. However, there is not a single year in which the intercollegiate athletic program has been out of compliance with our internal guideline of 70% in-district student

athletes to 30% out-of-district. Last year, 80% of our student athletes were in-district, and 60 of the 75.5 waivers awarded went to in-district student athletes.

It is true that each year not all of the waivers are used since we have made a commitment to not give waivers to just anyone. These leftover waivers, however, do not get shared between male and female sports, because once again, it could jeopardize our Title IX compliance. For example, of the 8.5 waivers not granted last year, 5.5 of those were allocated for female athletes. They could not have been given to male athletes without a Title IX violation.

In 1987, the Board of Trustees was insightful in recognizing the advantages that a winning intercollegiate athletic program brings to Sauk. Both our in-district and out-of-district student athletes assist in achieving these benefits. The in-district students often help provide a very important draw for enrollment and support from the local community. The out-of-district students provide the College with a level of diversity and competition that would not be possible without their presence. This exposure to diversity in our ever-changing society is of vital importance so that our students can interact in an environment that closely relates to a realistic picture of our society as a whole.

Summary

Once again it must be emphasized that this question is not about the worthiness of wrestling-- rather it is a matter of being responsible first to the successful programs that currently are in existence at the College and of being conscious of our obligation and commitment to comply with Title IX. It would be most fortunate if the College were in a position to add wrestling to its intercollegiate athletic program. However, it is not feasible at this time.

Therefore, the administration cannot recommend to the Board of Trustees to include wrestling as an intercollegiate sport at SVCC for the following reasons:

- Title IX Compliance
- Other planned student activity programs would have a higher budget priority
- Cost –Both start-up and yearly operating
- Non-conference sport/Limited community college wrestling competition outside the conference

All students who signed the attached petition were contacted and invited to a meeting at 10:00 a.m. on this date in the Boardroom. This time did not conflict with the schedule of the students. Of the eighteen students contacted, five students attended the meeting with Dean White and me.

The students expressed their concern about the poor condition of the chairs in the OAS lab. They expressed that they felt that their concerns were being ignored and that other areas of the college were given priority.

We discussed some issues regarding the OAS program itself. The program has had no full time faculty member in charge since Dr. Bailey resigned at the end of Spring, 2000 semester. The current lab supervisor, with the assistance of Dean White, is currently operating the program in its original format. I have instructed Dean White to make no significant curricular changes in the program until the new faculty member has been hired. (The position was advertised once, but the quality of applicants was very poor, so no interviews were held. The position will be re-advertised in January, with an expected hire date of Fall, 2001.)

Nonetheless, Dean White has made some significant improvements in the program quality. New computer software was installed to allow students to complete all their relevant assignments in the lab. Based upon student request, keyboards were replaced. New textbooks have been ordered for some classes where the old books were out of print and did not present current information. We have upgraded the lab computers to enable the students to run current software and will have laptop computers available for student's home use. All software will be upgraded by the end of Spring, 2001 semester.

We had budgeted for upgrading chairs and tables for this year. However, because of the drop in enrollment across the college, prudent budget management dictated that equipment purchases were put on hold until Spring semester enrollment figures were determined.

Dean White and I explained to the students that the lab may be reconfigured, based upon the requests of the new instructor, who is yet to be hired. I did promise the students that chairs for the lab would be one of our top priorities as money became available for equipment purchases.

We concluded the meeting with some questions for Dean White about scheduling, textbook selection, and other programmatic issues. I suggested that the students report the substance of this meeting to their peers who were unable to attend. They agreed to do this. Both Dean White and I suggested to the students that if, at any time in the future, they had concerns, that we would be available to discuss their concerns with them.




