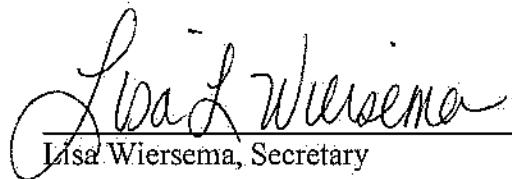

The Board has overall responsibility for governance of the College. In carrying out its responsibility, it has the following specific duties, as well as others:

- A. Establish, review, and modify Board Policy.
- B. To hire, evaluate and establish the salary and conditions of employment of the President of the College.
- C. *To annually set institutional strategic goals.*
- D. To determine goals for the College and College President annually.
- E. To approve the annual budget.
- F. To act upon the recommendations of the President on all matters pertaining to the welfare or operation of the College.
- G. To act upon the recommendation of the President for the appointment and subsequent employment status of all faculty and administrative personnel in accordance with established personnel policies.
- H. To approve rates of compensation for regular full-time and/or part-time employees and annually review all salary schedules.
- H. To act upon competitive bids for supplies and equipment in excess of \$10,000, and for construction/repairs in excess of \$15,000.
- I. To approve certificate and degree programs of the College upon the recommendation of the President.
- J. To approve the annual Administrative and Academic Calendar of the College.
- K. To consider communications and requests from responsible citizens and organizations within the district on matters of policy.
- L. To establish and/or approve citizens advisory committees as needed.
- M. To serve as a Board of final appeal with the College for students, faculty and staff of the College and citizens of the district who may have grievances in any matter concerning the College District.
- N. To appoint a treasurer and fix the salary of the treasurer for the District.
- O. To designate depositories for college funds.

- P. To conduct an annual Board self-evaluation.
- Q. To agree that correspondence to the Board from the President of the College marked "privileged" or "confidential" should not be read in open meeting nor made public without specific written permission of the President to all Board members or as authorized by a majority vote of the Board, and to agree that correspondence to the President from the Board or Board members marked "privileged" or "confidential" shall not be revealed without the permission of the sender.
- R. To employ legal counsel for the College.
- S. To employ a certified public accounting firm to audit the financial records and status in accordance with the Illinois Community College Act.
- T. To assume such other duties and responsibilities as provided for in the Illinois Community College Act, in other laws of the State of Illinois, in the rules and regulations of the Illinois Community College Board and the Board of Higher Education, in the rules and regulations of other relevant state regulatory agencies, and in relevant Federal regulations and laws.

Presentation:

The following four projects have been identified for funding through the Protection, Health and Safety Tax Levy.

1. **Safety Communications Improvements** - This project will improve the safety of the building occupants in an emergency event by providing a new radio system and radios for security staff and administrators; ADA compliant emergency call boxes and escort radios to be integrated with the new radio system; security cameras for parking lots along with monitoring software and equipment; and installation of the Starcom 21 radio system for communications with IEMA, State Police and Lee County Sheriff.
Projected budget: \$200,000.
2. **Emergency Notification Improvements** – This project provides for the replacement of the existing fire alarm panel with an ADA compliant system that provides synchronized emergency strobes and public address capabilities throughout the building.
Projected budget: \$212,000.
3. **2013 Window Improvements Project** – This project continues work on exterior windows of the College. This project will replace existing metal framing and un-insulated glazing with insulated glazing and metal panels as well as repair the deteriorating conditions at the base of the windows.
Projected budget: \$300,000.
4. **2013 Electrical Improvements** – This project provides for thermal imaging of existing electrical panels to identify and document circuit overloads and report the findings for repair and training of College maintenance staff.
Projected budget: \$39,000

The 2012 Protection, Health and Safety Fund levy, payable in 2013, should yield approximately \$800,000 at the maximum allowable tax rate. The College has levied at or near the maximum five cents for this fund for a number of years. The total cost to complete these projects is \$751,000.

In addition to these projects, the Buildings and Grounds staff and College engineers have identified the following project as qualifying for Protection, Health and Safety funds. This project is separate from the tax levy as sufficient Protection, Health and Safety funds are available to cover the cost for this project.

Roof Replacement Project – This project provides for the replacement of the roofing system, including the membrane, insulation, flashings and metal edging on the east end of the College building. The project will include the monitoring of asbestos materials that may come from the ceiling during the project. When complete, the new roof will have a 20-year manufacturer's warranty.

Proposed budget: \$672,000

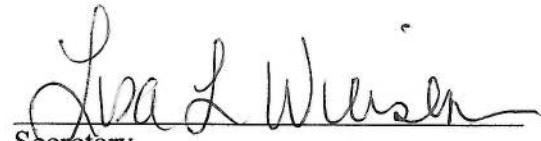

New ADA compliant emergency call boxes and escort radios. The new call boxes and radios will be integrated with the new radio system. Provides 12 emergency call boxes at various locations around the building grounds and 3 escort radios located at various locations inside the building. Currently only 8 call boxes exist of which only 5 are operational and none are ADA compliant.

Existing security cameras and monitoring system do not provide adequate coverage across the campus. Currently no security cameras exist in the parking lots.

Scope of Work

This project will improve the safety of occupants by providing communications systems that can be used in an emergency event. This project will provide the following:

3. New security cameras for parking lots and new monitoring software and equipment. Currently no security cameras exist in the parking lots and 4 existing security cameras are not ideally located. 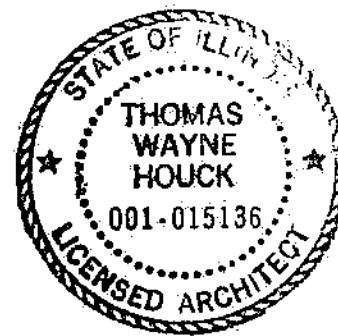

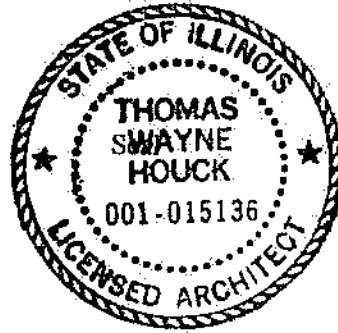

The present window system consists of metal framing and single pane un-insulated glazing. This window system constitutes the majority of the exterior wall system of the entire College. This proposed project will replace the existing metal framing and un-insulated glazing and with new metal framing and a combination of insulated glazing and insulated metal panels providing nearly three times greater resistance to heat flow through the glazing than the existing glazing and framing. In addition the existing condition at the window base is a cast in place concrete curb that is in various degrees of deterioration throughout the College and at some locations the deterioration is severe. Deterioration to the point of failure of this curb could possibly result in frame movement, cracks in glazing or loss of glazing. This proposed project will also repair the existing conditions at the base of the windows. This project will improve the overall quality of the interior environment and help to protect and preserve the condition of the existing interior building elements.

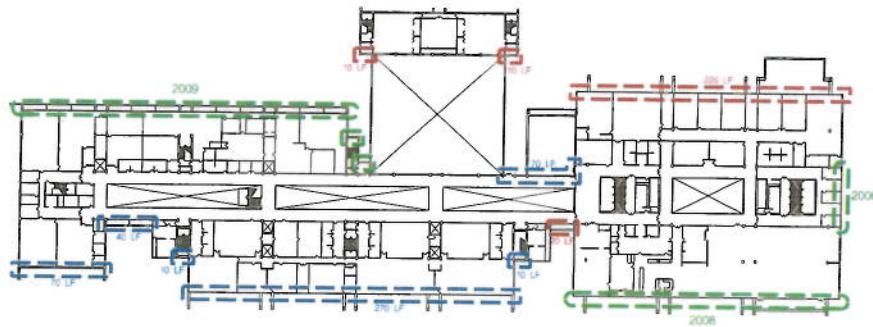

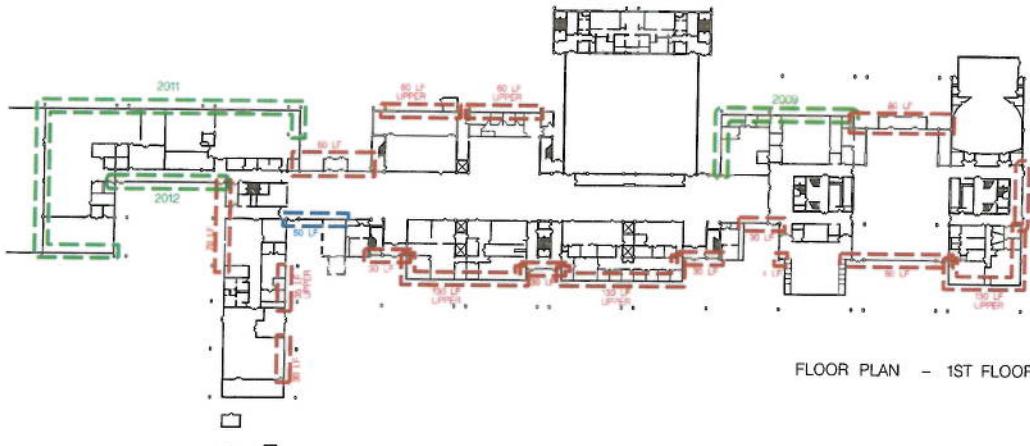
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FLOOR PLAN - 3RD FLOOR

Presentation:

The administration has been in the process of filling the position of Director of Business Services. The position was advertised on-line on Sauk Valley Community College's website and the *Higher Ed Jobs.com* website; *QC Times*, *Rockford Register Star* and in the Sauk Valley Newspapers (the *Dixon Telegraph* and the *Daily Gazette*). Thirty-three (33) applications were received. A committee was composed of Mr. Alan Pfeifer, Mr. Luis Moreno, Ms. Judy Austin, Interim CFO, Ms. Amy Viering, Ms. Paula Meyer, Ms. Kathryn Snow, and Dr. Dennis Day. Dr. Mihel, President served as Chairperson.

Three (3) candidates were interviewed by the committee, the Interim Dean of Business Services, and the Business Office.

Academic background: Ms. Dye received an Associate of Science from Sauk Valley Community College and a Bachelor's degree in Accounting from Ashford University.
