## Presentation:

The College is rapidly approaching the end of FY 2017, a year that found the College taking strides toward realizing its vision while being buffeted by unprecedented State uncertainties. As bookends to the ending and approaching fiscal years, I asked the members of the Cabinet to identify the "Ten Most Important Accomplishments in 2016-2017" and the "Ten Most Important Accomplishments to Achieve in 2017-2018." Their feedback follows in alpha order with items in each list highlighted ( $\sqrt{}$ ) by me.

- ✓ Continue to focus on improving remedial education
- Continue to focus on online programs, including quality online support
- Continue to reduce costs of supplies and contracts
- Continue to reduce energy consumption
- Create and launch Quality Initiative proposal
- Determine next phase of remodeling efforts
- ✓ Develop long-term strategic planning with the Foundation Board
- Devise strategy to raising levy in order to be free from State funding
- Establish one fundraiser
- Expand industry relationships
