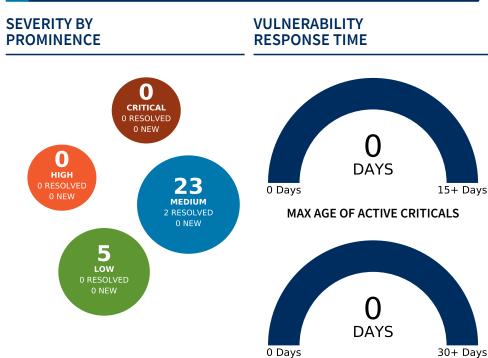

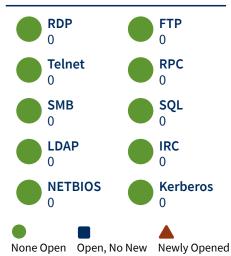

Analysis:

The largest enrollment declines are in non-traditional (age 25+) and career technical students. These are students who are more likely to be essential workers, currently out of work, or who may have children. COVID-19 has likely affected incomes of many potential students, current students, and families. Likewise, the lack of childcare would make enrolling in courses (online or on-campus) more difficult. Many CTE courses are also difficult or impossible to move online. For example, welding and nursing require in-person lab courses or other components that cannot be moved into an online format. For these reasons, sharp declines in non-traditional, CTE, and part-time enrollment are likely to occur during the upcoming summer and fall semesters.

While enrollment is down for both summer and fall, there is hope that this will rebound as stayat-home orders are eased. We have the potential to increase enrollment through our robust online offerings and by appealing to students who may not be able to return to their four-year campuses. Sauk continues to offer a high quality product for a price that is better than all fouryear options in the state, and most other two-year options in our immediate Northern Illinois region.
