The attached Memorandum of Understanding between the Sauk Valley Community College Adjunct Faculty Association, IEA-NEA and the Sauk Valley Community College District #506 Board of Trustees provides for a 3% salary increase for FY21.

Memorandum of Understanding between the Sauk Valley Community College Adjunct Faculty Association, IEA-NEA and the Sauk Valley Community College District #506 Board of Trustees

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into on August 31, 2020, between the Sauk Valley Community College Adjunct Faculty Association (the "Association") and the Sauk Valley Community College District #506 Board of Trustees (the "Board"), collectively referenced as the "Parties" herein.

The parties agree to extend the current collective bargaining agreement for a period of one additional year. All language provisions of the contract will remain unchanged until a successor agreement is negotiated and ratified by the parties. The parties also agree to a three percent (3%) increase in compensation for the 2020-2021 academic year, reflected in the provisions of Article 7.1.1 and 7.1.2 of the collective bargaining agreement as follows:

- 7.1.1 Faculty who teach only non-transferable or developmental courses will have an appropriate Associate's or Bachelor's degree in the field and/or a combination of relevant education, training or tested experience. Compensation is determined at \$803 per class load hour.
- 7.1.2 Faculty who teach for-credit general education or transfer courses will have a Master's degree or Doctorate in the teaching discipline or related fields or a Master's degree or Doctorate in an unrelated discipline plus 18 graduate credit hours in the teaching discipline. Compensation is determined at \$920 per class load hour.

Once ratified by the Association and the Board, these terms will be incorporated into the collective bargaining agreement as a memorandum of understanding which will expire on July 31, 2021.
