**Dual Credit.** In addition to the tuition and fee adjustments above, the Administration is recommending a \$50 fee per student and course to be charged to high schools participating in the College's dual-credit program where the courses are taught at the high school by a high school instructor. This fee would be charged in conjunction with a 100% tuition and fee waiver for students registering and completing the courses taught at the high school by a high school instructor. The current practice is to assess a 25%, 50%, or 75% tuition and fee waiver to the student based on the student's free/reduced lunch status.

There is no proposed change to the waivers applied dual-credit courses at Whiteside Area Career Center and those offered by the College or taught at the high schools by College instructors.
