## **Presentation:**

As bookends to the recently concluded and new fiscal years, I asked the members of the Cabinet to identify the ten most important "Accomplishments of FY 2020" and the ten most important "Accomplishments to Achieve in FY 2021." Their feedback follows in alpha order with items in each list **bolded** ( $\sqrt{}$ ) by me.

## FY 2020 SVCC Accomplishments

- Assisted seven new business expansions and helped in the creation of 18 new businesses through the SBDC
