## Strategic Vision: Sauk Valley Community College will be a leader in student achievement while expanding access to higher education across the Sauk Valley region

## Presentation:

Summer headcount is down from the previous summer by $-8.8 \%$ while total credit hours are down by $-1.4 \%$. Paid enrollment has decreased by $-1.0 \%$ from the previous summer (Internal Sauk data from June 17, 2020). Items of interest for the summer term include the following:

- Non-traditional student (age 24+) enrollment is down -12.9\% in headcount and is down $16.7 \%$ in number of credit hours while traditional student (under age 24) enrollment is up $5.1 \%$ in headcount and $8.1 \%$ in number of credit hours.
- Former WACC student enrollment is up $91.7 \%$ in headcount and $66.1 \%$ in number of credit hours.
- Online enrollment is up 61.9\% in headcount and 74.8\% in number of credit hours.
- CTE Enrollment is down -28.5\% in headcount and -34.1\% in credit hours while transfer degree enrollment is up $6.4 \%$ in headcount and $6.8 \%$ in credit hours.
- Undeclared transfer degree enrollment is up 48.0\% in headcount and 56.7\% in number of credit hours while course enrollee enrollment is up $17.6 \%$ in headcount and $33.7 \%$ in number of credit hours.
- Recent high school graduate enrollment is up $34.0 \%$ in headcount and $40.9 \%$ in number of credit hours

These numbers reflect an increase in transfer and undeclared student enrollment and a sharp decline in CTE and nontraditional student enrollment. These numbers can be largely explained by the effects of COVID-19. As the state continues to open up, that will allow for more opportunities for CTE courses to resume as normally scheduled. Additionally, as childcare and schools begin to reopen, nontraditional students who may have children and families will be more likely to enroll in courses themselves.
