The City of Polo requests the support of the College to extend the Polo TIF District for an additional twelve (12) years beyond its current termination in tax year 2031 payable 2032, for a total of thirty-five (35) years, which will result in the final year of tax increment being received by the City through December 31, 2044. An additional component of the Polo TIF District extension will focus on the development of 20 buildable residential lots within the boundary of the revised district lines.

Recommendation:

Consistent with Board Policy 306.01, the administration recommends the Board approve the College's support to extend the Polo TIF District for an additional twelve (12) years beyond its current termination in tax year 2031 payable 2032, for a total of thirty-five (35) years, which will result in the final year of tax increment being received by the City through December 31, 2044.

On February 4, 2008, the City of Polo, Illinois, established its Tax Increment Financing (TIF) District pursuant to the Tax Increment Allocation Redevelopment Act (the "Act", 65 ILCS 5/11-74.4 et. seq.). Since its inception, tax increment financing within the Polo TIF District has facilitated the completion of various public and private redevelopment projects. However, many critwically important public and private redevelopment projects remain to be completed within this redevelopment area. The City would like to continue to use tax increment financing to encourage additional commercial and residential development within the TIF District. Therefore, the City now seeks to extend the life of the Polo TIF District for an additional twelve (12) years beyond its current termination in tax year 2031 payable 2032, for a total of thirty-five (35) years which will result in the final year of tax increment being received by the City through December 31, 2044.
