Outstanding Full-time Faculty - Jeffrey Johnson, Instruction II - Multicraft

Jeff Johnson has been employed as a production worker, facility maintenance group leader, operations supervisor, technical skills supervisor, and a multi-craft technician for Raynor Garage Doors for over 25 years and has taught electrical and industrial technology at SVCC on a full-time and adjunct basis.

Outstanding Full-time Staff – Arlind Bajrami, Enterprise Application Administrator

Shared Team Achievement Award – Learning Commons-Library

The nomination shared the following about the Learning Commons Library staff: "In the past months, library staff members have been adapting and creating library research guides aimed at helping patrons find and use library resources for course topics and for concepts related to library research. They have created or identified tutorials aimed at helping users understand how to use online library resources. Decisions about adding new library books and research databases take into account the learning styles, preferences, and capabilities of all patrons.

The library team understands that not only are we helping students to achieve successful outcomes in their courses of study, but also helping them learn how to be successful college students. The concept of library anxiety – being unsure of how to navigate library resources, in need of librarians' help, yet reluctant to approach them – has been studied for decades. Library staff understand this anxiety can be a deterrent to students and other users, and they take pains to meet requests for assistance with patience and good humor."
