The administration has been in the process of hiring a Student Support Services Project Director. The position was advertised on-line on Sauk Valley Community College's website, *Glassdoor.com, Indeed.com,* and in Sauk Valley Media (the *Dixon Telegraph* and the *Daily Gazette*). The College received four applicants; three candidates were invited to interview. A committee was composed of Myndi Fletcher, Taylor Baker, Devon Plachno, and Kevin Larsen. Joe Strabala-Bright, Dean of Student Services, served as Chair.

Academic Background: Stephanie Jacobs graduated from Southern Illinois University with a Master of Arts in Clinical Psychology and from Western Illinois University with a Bachelor of Science in Psychology.

Professional Background: Stephanie has been an Academic Advisor and Career Specialist at Sauk Valley Community College since March 2020 and served as an Adjunct Faculty member since August 2021.
