FY 24 Spring Enrollment Data

Spring data show headcount is up from the previous spring by 8.9% and total credit hours are up 2.8%. Paid credit hours have also seen a slight increase of 0.4% from the previous spring. Items of interest for the spring term include the following:

- Female students have seen a larger increase of 5.4% as compared to a decrease of 5.6% males since spring of 2023.
- Traditional students (age less than 24) enrollment is down 2.2% in headcount and 1.1% in number of credit hours while non-traditional student (24+) enrollment is up 3.5% in headcount and 7.2% in number of credit hours.
- First-generation student enrollment (students whose parents do not hold a degree) is seeing a major increase this spring with 11.5% in headcount and 17.3% in number of credit hours.
- CTE Enrollment is still experiencing a slight increase of 0.7% in headcount and 3.7% in credit hours while transfer degree enrollment is seeing a similar increase at 0.7% in credit hours.
- Undeclared transfer degree enrollment is seeing a big decrease of 7.3% in headcount and 7.2% in number of credit hours, and course-enrollee enrollment is up 12.2% in number of credit hours.
- Recent high school graduate enrollment is down 15% in headcount and 16.2% in number of credit hours.
- Dual-credit enrollment is up 24.9% in headcount and 18.2% in credit hours.

The highest increases in courses for the upcoming school year are in Early Childhood Education with an increase of 176.5%, Education with 61.6%, Alternate Energy with 33.3%, Sociology / Anthropology with 28.6%, and Humanities with 27%.
