Presentation:

The administration has been in the process of hiring a full-time CEO and Agriculture faculty member. This position is in partnership with the CEO program of WACC. The search committee was composed of Amber Schmidt, Grace Johnson, Josh Johnson, and Josh Knie. Sasha Logan, Dean of Business, Career, and Technical Education served as Chairperson.

Academic Background: Emily Brooks has received her Bachelor of Science in Agricultural and Consumer Economics with a minor in Leadership Studies. She is enrolled at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign to receive her Master of Science in Agricultural Leadership, Education & Communication with a focus on Educational Program Development. She is scheduled to earn her Master's degree in May 2026 and aspires to return to her roots in the Sauk Valley to apply her skills and experience in service to the community.

Professional Background: Emily has been employed by the University of Illinois in several progressive roles, including teaching assistant, department head student assistant, and new student registration intern. She has also served as a co-instructor and program coordinator for study abroad programs, overseeing both pre-departure coursework and in-country instruction.

Recommendation:

The administration recommends the Board approve the appointment of Emily Brooks as an Assistant Professor I of CEO and Agriculture beginning August 14, 2026 at an annual base salary of \$51,582.34.

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TEACHING STATEMENT

My experiences as a student throughout my learning journey have shaped my perspective on education: meaningful learning transcends grades and should cultivate intrinsic motivation for lifelong learning inside and outside of classrooms. In my early academic years, I often tied my sense of academic achievement to the test scores I received. Graduate study has allowed me to reclaim a more authentic curiosity for learning – one that values exploration, creativity, and reflection as much as measurable outcomes. This shift has influenced how I view education, as students thrive when given opportunities to move beyond external evaluation and when they are encouraged to see themselves as capable of growth. In my recent teaching roles, I have seen that when students feel both challenged and supported, they are more likely to approach learning with curiosity, resilience, and a growth mindset that prepares them for lifelong learning.

My philosophy is grounded in constructivist theory, which emphasizes that students actively build knowledge through experience and reflection rather than passively receiving information. I believe that learning is most meaningful when students are invited to test ideas, wrestle with questions, and see the value of learning in their own lives. I believe that knowledge develops in relationship to context, community, and personal perspective. Constructivist learning environments should therefore foster collaboration and dialogue, where students not only absorb content but also practice articulating and refining their own understandings. For me, the most durable and transformative learning is experiential – when students are encouraged to apply learned information in real-world contexts, reflect on what worked and what did not, and integrate those lessons into a stronger sense of self and purpose.

These beliefs have shaped the way I approach my teaching roles, where I aim to balance content delivery with opportunities for reflection and application. In *LEAD 260: Foundations of Leadership*, I begin each discussion section with a brief overview of lecture material from our online modules before guiding students to connect those theories to their own experiences. These activities encourage students to move beyond memorization toward embracing leadership as a skill they can practice and refine. Beyond the classroom, I accompanied students on a study abroad program to Ireland focused on agricultural communications. By encouraging daily reflection and linking observations to coursework, I helped students see the program as an opportunity to expand their perspectives and build confidence as future professionals. These experiences have reinforced my beliefs that teaching requires both mentorship and intentional program design. Whether in a classroom, advising setting, or program, I strive to create learning environments where students can take ownership, practice problem solving, and see the relevance of their work to their own lives and communities.
