Presentation:

The administration has been in the process of hiring a Communication and Speech Faculty. The position was advertised online on Sauk Valley Community College's website, the *Chronicle of Higher Education*, and *HigherEdJobs.com*. The College received twenty-seven applicants. Three candidates were invited for an on-campus interview. A committee was composed of Dr. Paul Edleman, Dr. Patricia Fulfs, and Jim Grot. Dr. Patrice Hess, Dean of Transfer Programs and Academic Support Services, served as Chair.

Academic Background: Kieran Benson earned her Master's in Communication Studies at Northern Illinois University and a certification in Women and Gender Studies. She also earned her Bachelor's degree in Communication Studies at Luther College.

Professional Background: Kieran has worked as an adjunct instructor for Sauk Valley Community College since January of 2025. In 2021, she was a graduate teaching assistant for Northern Illinois University.

Recommendation:

The administration recommends the Board approve the appointment of Kieran Benson as an Assistant Professor I of Communication and Speech beginning August 8, 2025, at an annual base salary of \$49,838.01.
