TRUCK DRIVER TRAINING

Midwest Safe Driver at Sauk Valley Community College

Class A CDL Training

Train to earn your Class "A" Commercial Driver's License (CDL) and prepare for a career in the trucking industry, one of the fastest growing Industries in the country. With over 300,000 truck-driving jobs available in the United States, this course is designed for students with little or no commercial driving experience.

The Sauk Valley Community College Truck Driver Training course includes everything you need to earn a Class A CDL and find your first job as a truck driver. After successful completion of the five-week 160 training hours, you will be scheduled to take the Secretary of State administered Class A test. After successful completion you will receive an Illinois Commercial Driver's License from the Secretary of State, a certificate from Sauk Valley Community College and Midwest Safe Driver. Commercial License Permit classroom hours run Monday – Friday; 8:00AM-4:30PM and Commercial License Operation class hours run Monday – Friday; 7:30AM – 4:00PM. For more information, visit svcc.edu/cdl.

Tuition for the Class A program is \$5,148 and includes the cost of a drug screen and DOT physical. Students will pay the cost of permit/license (\$50) and motor vehicle record (\$20) out of pocket. Grant and scholarship options are available to eligible students to help cover tuition expenses. Class schedule may be adjusted due to weather or truck maintenance. Class B CDL Training

Class B CDL training allows you to transport freight that weighs less than 10,000 pounds GVWR with a single axle trailer. Experience high-quality Class B CDL training at Sauk Valley Community College. Class B CDL training is widely seen as an amazing entry point and helps prospective drivers break into the trucking industry. Vehicles that can be driven with a Class B license include dump truck, garbage truck, and snow plow. After successful completion of 160 training hours (40 classroom hours and 120 behind the wheel hours), students will be scheduled to take the Secretary of State administered Class B test. Class B Commercial License Permit classroom hours run Monday - Friday; 8:00AM-4:30PM and Commercial License Operation hours run Monday - Friday; 7:30AM - 4:00PM. There is \$2,000 in grant funding available to assist with tuition. Students will pay the cost of permit/license (\$50) and motor vehicle record (\$20) out of pocket. (Ages 18 & Up)

FOOD SERVICE SANITATION

Food Service Sanitation: 1-day class

This course prepares students to take the food sanitation manager's license ServSafe exam in one day. Students will participate in class and take the exam on the same day. This one-day course is fast-paced and recommended but not required for students seeking <u>renewal</u> of their ServSafe Manager Protection License. Emphasis will be on current food handling information including time/temperature requirements for cooking, cooling and refrigeration, hand contact with ready-to-eat foods, consumer advisories, cross-contamination, cleaning and sanitizing, HACCP, and problems associated with food borne outbreaks. The exam scan sheet is included in the cost of the class. (Ages 15 & Up)

HEALTHCARE CAREER PROGRAMS

Payment plans are available. Students are required to either be paid in full or have a payment plan set up with the SVCC Business Office at least one week before the course begins. Courses need a minimum of 4 students registered and paid in full or enrolled in the payment plan for the course to run.

Withdrawal Policy: Student withdrawals must be completed by phone, call 815.835.6212, or in person at the Business & Community Education Department Office, 1M04 at least three business days before the first day of class. Documentation is required for the student withdrawal to be processed. If an enrolled student does not show up to class or officially withdraw, they are still responsible to pay the full tuition amount since they reserved a seat in the course. Students who do not attend class are NOT automatically withdrawn/dropped from the course.

Refund Policy: If a course is cancelled due to low enrollment, enrolled students will receive a full refund. No refunds will be given to students who do not withdraw three business days before the first day of class. Business days are Monday through Thursday; 8:00AM–4:00PM and Fridays, 8:00AM–1:30PM and excludes observed Holidays.

Phlebotomy Technician with Clinical Externship

This 170-hour Phlebotomy Technician Program prepares students to collect blood specimens for the purpose of laboratory analysis. Students will become familiar with all aspects related to blood collection and develop comprehensive skills to perform venipunctures completely and OSHA safety techniques. The 70 classroom hours and 100 externship hours include: terminology, anatomy and physiology, blood collection procedures, specimen hands-on practice, and training in skills and techniques to perform puncture methods. The students will experience a clinical externship at a local healthcare facility and will have a minimum of 100 clinic working hours and administer a minimum of 100 sticks per ASCP & NAACLS guidelines. Students may need to adjust with their work schedules for the clinic externship. Students are required to have scrubs, current physical, and immunizations records for the clinical and the cost of them are NOT included in the cost of the class. The required immunizations are TB, Varicella, MMR, and Tdap. The optional immunizations are COVID-19, Hepatitis B and Flu shot (seasonal). Clinical time will be scheduled around class time. All students must maintain a 75% or better to receive their completion certificate. Students may be eligible for a \$250 grant to go towards tuition. (Ages 18 & Up)

EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN BASIC



EMT Basic

This This Emergency Medical Technician Basic course is designed to train fire & rescue personnel and persons interested in pursuing a career in prehospital emergency care. Students will gain the knowledge and skills to provide basic emergency medical assistance to people in need.

The curriculum, developed by the U.S. Department of Transportation, prepares students for the National certification examinations.

An EMT is trained to respond to emergency situations and provide efficient and immediate care to the ill and injured. They transport patients to an appropriate medical facility. The EMT possesses the basic knowledge and skills necessary to provide appropriate interventions at the scene and during transport. EMTs function as part of comprehensive EMS response, under medical oversight, and function with basic interventions and equipment.

This extensive course combines reading, lecture, computer-based and on-line learning, significant study time, and practical labs; a minimum 10-15 hour per week time-commitment is to be expected. Skills taught include all areas of patient assessment (medical, cardiac, pediatric, and trauma), airway management, splinting, and appropriate interventions. This demanding course requires significant reading, computer skills, and participatory effort by the EMT candidate. Course is 184-plus hours of classroom training, clinical experience, and field experience. After successful completion, the candidate qualifies to challenge the national exam and licensure in Illinois.

Qualifications: Aptitudes required for EMT work are good physical stamina, endurance, and body conditions to handle significant lifting, stooping and walking. Students must balance items and patients in excess of a minimum of 125 pounds. To be certified as an EMT, candidates must be at least 18 years old and possess a high school diploma or equivalent (GED), at the time of class completion.

Students will complete 25 hours of clinical practice with at least 10 reported patient contacts outside of the scheduled class time. Students may be eligible for a \$250 grant to go towards tuition. (Ages 18 & Up)
