SVCC POLICIES

■ REGISTRATION & PAYMENT POLICY:

Registration is required to attend a class or trip. Payment is due at the time of registration. Payment can be made by mail, phone, fax, online, or in person.

■ FULL OR CANCELLED CLASS POLICY:

The Community Education Department reserves the right to limit enrollment or cancel a class or trip due to insufficient enrollment. For this reason, please register at least one week before the class or trip is scheduled to guarantee your class or trip is not cancelled. Every effort will be made to notify students that a class or trip has been filled or cancelled. Students will receive full refunds for full or cancelled classes and trips.

■ BAD WEATHER CANCELLATION POLICY:

If SVCC cancels classes due to bad weather, Community Education classes or trips will also be cancelled. Cancellations will be announced on area radio, TV stations and on our website, svcc.edu.

■ REFUND & WITHDRAWAL POLICY:

Withdrawal Policy: Withdrawals must be completed by phone, call 815.835.6258 or 815.835.6212, or in person at the Community Education Department Office, 1M04. Documentation is required for the student withdrawal to be processed. Please leave a message if no one is available to take your call.

Refund Policy: If a class or trip is cancelled due to low enrollment, students will receive a full refund. **No refunds will be given to students who do not withdraw during business hours at least three business days before the class or trip.** This excludes observed holidays.
