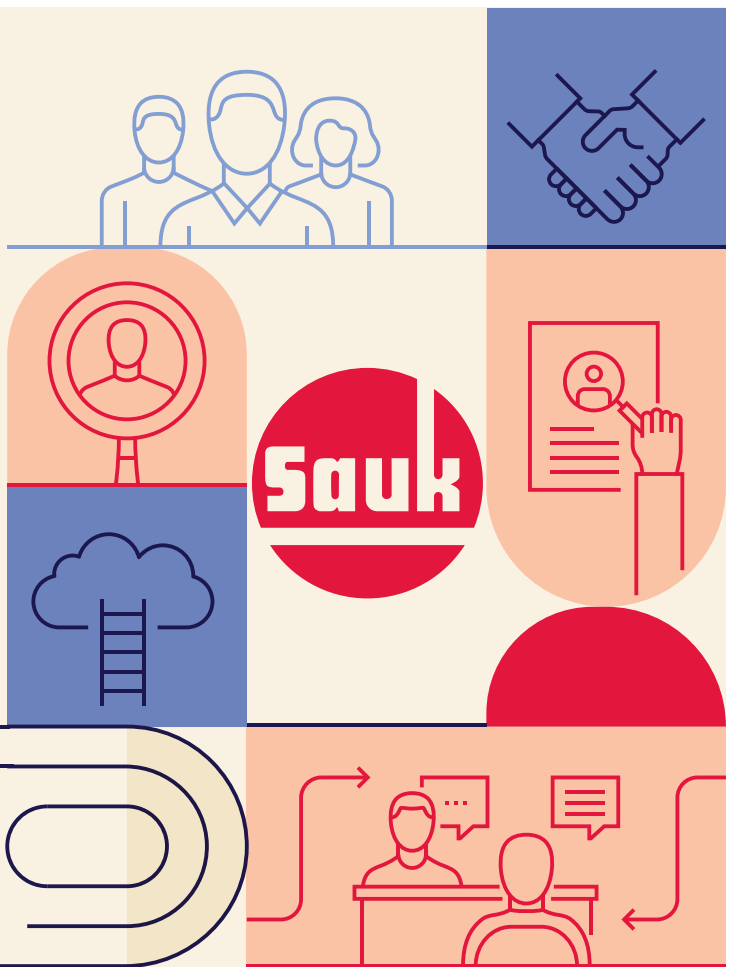

Entry-Level Automotive Technician Program

Sauk Valley Community College and Whiteside Area Career Center are partnering to offer a seven-week Automotive Basics Program. The program will be four weeks of instruction and hands-on learning, a two-week externship (minimum of 40 hours), and three days of review and ASE test preparation. Students will gain an entry level understanding in suspension and steering, brakes, exhaust systems, and routine maintenance

Class A CDL Training

Train to earn your Class “A” Commercial Driver’s License (CDL) and prepare for a career in the trucking industry, one of the fastest growing Industries in the country. With over 300,000 truck-driving jobs available in the United States, this course is designed for students with little or no commercial driving experience.

The Sauk Valley Community College Truck Driver Training course includes everything you need to earn a Class A CDL. After successful completion of the five-week 160 training hours, you will be scheduled to take the Secretary of State administered Class A test. After successful completion you will receive an Illinois Commercial Driver’s License from the Secretary of State, a certificate from Sauk Valley Community College and Midwest Safe Driver. *Commercial License Permit classroom hours run Monday – Friday; 8:00AM-4:30PM and Commercial License Operation class hours run Monday – Friday; 7:30AM – 4:00PM.*

Tuition for the Class A CDL program is **\$5,148** and includes the cost of a drug screen and DOT physical. Students will pay the cost of permit/license (\$50) and motor vehicle record (\$20) out of pocket. The Class A CDL program hours will run 8 weeks, Monday - Thursday; 5:00-9:30PM. Additionally, there will be two classes on Fridays. The Friday classes will be held during daytime hours so the student is able to meet the 160-hour training requirement and earn daytime driving experience. The Secretary of State driving exam will be scheduled once the student completes their 160 training hours.

Tuition for the Class A CDL program is **\$5,148** and includes the cost of a drug screen and DOT physical. Students will pay the cost of permit/license (\$50) and motor vehicle record (\$20) out of pocket. Class B CDL Training

Class B CDL training allows you to transport freight that weighs less than 10,000 pounds GVWR with a single axle trailer. Experience high-quality Class B CDL training at Sauk Valley Community College. Class B CDL training is widely seen as an amazing entry point and helps prospective drivers break into the trucking industry. Vehicles that can be driven with a Class B license include dump truck, garbage truck, and snow plow. After successful completion of 160 training hours (40 classroom hours and 120 behind the wheel hours), students will be scheduled to take the Secretary of State administered Class B test. Class B Commercial License Permit classroom hours run Monday - Friday; 8:00AM-4:30PM and Commercial License Operation hours run Monday - Friday; 7:30AM - 4:00PM. ***The Class B CDL program qualifies for the Non-credit Strategies at Work Grant from the Illinois SVCC Community College Board (ICCB). 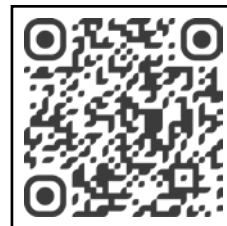

HEALTHCARE CAREER PROGRAMS

Phlebotomy Technician with Clinical Externship

This 150-hour Phlebotomy Technician Program prepares students to collect blood specimens for the purpose of laboratory analysis. Students will become familiar with all aspects related to blood collection and develop comprehensive skills to perform venipunctures completely and OSHA safety techniques. The 70 classroom hours and 100 externship hours include: terminology, anatomy and physiology, blood collection procedures, specimen hands-on practice, and training in skills and techniques to perform puncture methods. **The students will experience a clinical externship at a local healthcare facility and will have a minimum of 100 clinic working hours and administer a minimum of 100 sticks per ASCP & NAACLS guidelines. Students may need to adjust with their work schedules for the clinic externship.** Students are required to have scrubs, current physical, and immunizations records for the clinical and the cost of them are **NOT** included in the cost of the class. The required immunizations are TB, Varicella, MMR, and Tdap. The optional immunizations are COVID-19, Hepatitis B and Flu shot (seasonal). Clinical time will be scheduled around class time. All students must maintain a 75% or better to receive their completion certificate. **This program qualifies for funding by the Pipeline for the Advancement of the Healthcare Workforce (PATH) Grant from the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB).
