

# Recognition & Awards

#### **Institutional Excellence & Impact**



Sauk continued to demonstrate excellence on state and national levels, garnering recognition for its programs and initiatives.

Winner of the 2014 Noel Levitz Retention Award for its First Year Experience (FYE) program, Sauk's FYE connects students to resources, tools, and the critical individuals on campus that provide valuable everyday support to set them up for success in their first year and beyond.

SVCC ranked third among community colleges in the State of Illinois by CNNMoney for student success

rates. This ranking was based on the percentage of students who graduated within three years or transferred to four-year colleges.


Sauk ranked fifth out of 39 community colleges in Illinois for performance-based funding.

Sauk earned the distinction of a Veteran-Friendly campus for the sixth year in a row. The Military Friendly Schools® list honors the top 20 percent of colleges, universities and trade schools in the country doing the most to embrace America's military service members, veterans, and spouses as students and ensure their success on campus. Sauk celebrated this

accomplishment with Congresswoman Cheri Bustos.

According to the 2014 SVCC Economic Impact Report, prepared by the Center for Governmental Studies at Northern Illinois University, a Sauk program graduate can expect a total lifetime earnings gain, over a 40-year career, of about \$600,000. ### Presidential Search

#### The Search for Sauk's New President

In 2014-15, another milestone for the College came to pass. After ten years of service to the College, Dr. George Mihel, Sauk's fifth president, announced he would retire in July of 2015.

In the wake of Dr. Mihel's announcement, Sauk's Board of Trustees formed a presidential search committee, created a special website and dedicated themselves to the mission of finding the exceptional man or woman who would lead the College into the next 50 years. The committee sought a candidate who embraces the community college mission, believes in the transformative power of education and exhibits a deep commitment to the Sauk Valley area.

In April, the Board announced the selection of Dr. David Hellmich as Sauk's sixth president. Dr. Hellmich will have many opportunities to build on the successes of the past fifty years and create more avenues of growth for SVCC and the Sauk Valley region. In his acceptance letter to the Board, Hellmich stated, "I am honored to have been selected as the next President of Sauk Valley Community College. The college has a proud 50-year history, and I look forward to working with the Board, students, faculty, staff and community members to ensure the college extends its tradition of serving the citizens of the Sauk Valley area for the next 50 years." Dr. Hellmich has been the Vice President of Academics at Bluegrass Community and Technical College in Lexington, Kentucky since 2006.

The Board looks forward to introducing Dr. Hellmich to SVCC students, staff and the Sauk community in the coming months. As the 50th anniversary continues, the Board is confident they have chosen the best candidate to lead Sauk Valley Community College into the next exciting phase of its development.

## Capital Improvements

#### Improving the Face of Sauk

The Skyhawk Gymnasium received a facelift this year, including the addition of a new sound system.

Sauk's Phi Theta Kappa organization worked with the Board of Trustees to create a scenic new gathering spot for students and visitors to the campus. The stone fire pit, located on the patio off the East Mall, overlooks the scenic Rock River and highlights not only the beauty of the Sauk campus, but the ongoing partnerships between our students, faculty and staff.

The Art Gallery celebrated its official opening as the premier location on campus for student art work, visiting artist showings, student and community performances and special events.

New, energy-efficient lighting was installed throughout the main areas of campus.

Newly branded tables were added to the cafeteria, highlighting the 50th anniversary and the brilliant red Sauk logo.

#### **Future Projects**

The coming year will see exciting improvements and additions to the Sauk campus. New sidewalks and entranceway landscaping will be created to improve the look and usability of exterior entrances.

The Jerry Weston Mathis Theatre will re-open in the fall with new lighting to enhance performances and special events.

Currently under construction is the new "One Stop" Student Success Center designed to provide an all-in-one area for students to seek services, from enrollment through graduation. Construction is due to be completed by September of 2015.



# Did You Know

- The College was founded in 1965 and is celebrating its 50th anniversary this year.
- The main building on campus was opened in 1970 and has more than 450,000 sq. ft. of space.
- SVCC serves nearly 150,000 people in six Illinois counties including Whiteside, Lee, Ogle, Bureau, Carroll and Henry.
- Sauk has been accredited by the Higher Learning Commission since 1972.

- For the 2015 50th anniversary commencement, 551 students received a total of 601 awards, including degrees and certificates. A record 159 graduates participated in the commencement ceremony.
- Sauk employees 46 full-time faculty and 114 adjunct faculty to maintain a 21-1 student to faculty ratio.
- Sauk is a member of the Arrowhead Athletic Conference and participates in five men's and women's sports.
- About 4,000 students enroll each year with 46% entering career-technical programs, 47% into transfer degrees and 7% for personal goals.

SVCC offers many types of programs to assist students in reaching their goals. This includes career and transfer programs, and individual class enrollment.

#### **Satisfy Class Placement Requirements**

Placement testing in English/language arts and mathematics is required of all students wishing to register for any English/language arts class, mathematics class, or any other college class requiring a specific ENG/ELA/MAT co-requisite or pre-requisite. College staff will recommend needed placement tests and assist with arranging a testing time.

#### **Placement Options:**

- ACT scores SVCC placement test results
- Review of credit earned at the College level

#### **Submit Other Academic Records**

Students should submit their official high school transcripts, GED scores, and college/university transcripts from institutions previously attended. Students submitting college transcripts should also file a *Transcript Evaluation Request Form* in Admissions & Records. Transcripts must be delivered in a sealed envelope.

### Learn About Tuition Costs & Payment Options

SVCC tuition is charged per credit hour based on residence. Fees are in addition to tuition for classes that have additional equipment or supply needs.

Students are encouraged to apply for financial assistance, scholarships, and/or veterans benefits as early as possible. Contact Financial Assistance at 815.835.6339 for more information.

#### Meet With an Academic Advisor

Students will need to meet with an academic advisor to discuss their career plans, placement test results, and course/program requirements. Call Academic Advising at 815.835.6354 for more information.
